IT is this day ordered by their Lordships, that every Minister and Preacher, as well of the Established Church in that part of Great Britain called Scotland as those of the Episcopal Communion, protected and allowed by an Act, passed in the tenth year of Her Majesty Queen Anne, chapter 7, intituled "An Act to prevent the dis-" turbing those of the Episcopal Communion in " that part of Great Britain called Scotland, in " the exercise of their religious worship, and in " the use of the Liturgy of the Church of Eng-" land; and for repealing the Act, passed in " the Parliament of Scotland, intituled 'An Act " 'against irregular Baptisms and Marriages,' 3 do, at some time during the exercise of Divine Service in their respective churches, congregations, or assemblies, put up their Prayers and Thanksgiving to Almighty God for Her Majesty's safe delivery of a Prince.

#### PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled An Act to make better provision for the spi-"ritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to " make better provision for the spiritual care of "populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting two separate districts for spiritual purposes in the borough of Kingston-upon-Hull, in the east riding of the county and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district, not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such dis-

trict we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licenced according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a

new parish as thereinafter provided:

" And whereas the parish of Sculcoates, within the said borough of Kingston-upon-Hull, and the parish of Sutton, partly within the same borough, are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of the said parish of Sculcoates hereinafter described, and the particular part of the said parish of Sutton, and of a certain extra-parochial place called Garrison Side, situate within the same borough, hereinafter also described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted separate districts in manner hereinafter set forth:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward Archbishop of York, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Sculcoates described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and therein numbered 1; and also all that part of the said parish of Sutton, and of the said extra-parochial place called Garrison Side, in the same schedule also described and numbered 2, all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, respectively, are delineated and set forth in the maps or plans hereunto also annexed, and respectively numbered in like manner, shall be constituted separate districts for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be respectively named as follows, that is to say, the district, numbered 1 in the said schedule, shall be named, "The District of Saint Paul, Sculcoates; and the district, numbered 2 therein, shall be named, "The District of Saint Mark, Hull."

" And we further recommend and propose, that, in order that the ministers of the districts so recommended to be constituted may be permanently endowed, according to the provisions of the said Act, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of each of such districts, when duly licenced according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within either of such districts, being duly licenced by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to the minister for the time being of such district, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of

one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within either of such districts shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sums of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November, as the case may be, next after the day of the day of the license of guely minister. the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid; and that in case a yacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of either of such districts or new parishes shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said parishes, or to the said districts or new parishes, or either of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any

other Act of Parliament.

# "SCHEDULE.

" No. 1.—The District of SAINT PAUL, SCULCOATES, being

" All that part of the parish of Sculcoates, in the borough of Kingston-upon-Hull, in the east riding of the county and in the diocese of York, bounded on the east, by the river Hull, and on the north, west, and south, by an imaginary line extending westward from the river Hull along the middle of Skidby Drain, and a proposed road leading into Beverley-road (as shown on the map hereunto annexed), and thence southward, along the middle of such last-mer, tioned road, to a point opposite to the middle of the street called Springrow, near the south-east end thereof, and thence eastward, along the middle a certain footpath opposite thereto, and Cottingham Drain, to a point opposite to the middle of a certain lane leading to Halfpenny Hatch, and thence southward, along the middle of such lane, to a point opposite to the middle of Scott-street, and thence eastward, along the middle of such street, as far as the middle of Mulgrave-street, and thence southward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, to a point opposite to the middle of Aldbro'street, and thence eastward, along the middle of

such last-mentioned street, as far as the middle of Katherine-street, and thence southward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, as far as the middle of Machell-street, and thence eastward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, and in a straight direction, as far as the said river Hull.

" No. 2.—The District of SAINT MARK, HULL, being

"All that part of the parish of Sutton, situate within the said borough of Kingston-upon-Hull, and all that part of the extra-parochial place called Garrison Side, within the said borough, situate on the northern side of an imaginary line extending along the middle of Thornton-street."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the districts therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patrons have consented to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to provide for paying off such of the Three Pounds Ten Shillings-per Centum Annuities and Government Debentures which are to be paid off under two Acts passed in the present session of Parliament.

An Act to suspend, until the thirty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, the operation of the new arrangement of dioceses, so far as it affects the existing ecclesiastical jurisdictions, and for obtaining returns from, and the inspection of, the registries of such jurisdictions.

An Act for facilitating arrangements between debtors and creditors.

An Act to defray, until the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, the charge of the pay, clothing, and contingent and other expences of the disembodied militia in Great Britain and Ireland; to grant allowances, in certain cases, to subaltern officers, adjutants, paymasters, quartermasters, surgeons, assistant-surgeons, surgeons' mates, and serjeant-majors of the militia; and to authorize the employment of the non-commissioned officers.

An Act to amend the laws relating to aliens.

An Act to amend so much of an Act, of the fifth and sixth years of His late Majesty, as relates to the salary of the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, and to make other provisions in respect of the said office.

An Act for amending an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for the better administration of justice in His Majesty's Privy Council, and to extend its jurisdiction and powers."

An Act to explain and amend the Act for the government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land.

An Act to provide for the care and preservation of Trafalgar-square, in the city of Westminster.

An Act to annex detached parts of counties to the counties in which they are situated.

An Act to appoint additional Commissioners for executing the Acts for granting a land tax and other rates and taxes.

An Act to amend the law as to burning farm buildings.

An Act to transfer the collection of the duty on licences to let horses for hire, in Ireland, from the Commissioners of Stamps to the Commissioners of Excise.

An Act to enable the Council of His Royal Highness Albert Edward Prince of Wales to self and exchange lands and enfranchise copyholds, parcels of the possessions of the duchy of Cornwall, to purchase other lands; and for other purposes.

An Act for the better administration of criminal justice in Middlesex.

An Act to clear up doubts as to the regulation and audit of the accounts of the Customs in New South Wales.

An Act to reduce, under certain circumstances, the duties payable upon books and engravings.

An Act to simplify the transfer of property.

An Act to continue, for one year, an Act, of the second and third years of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to extend and render more effectual, for five years, an Act, passed in the fourth year of His late Majesty George the Fourth, to amend an Act, passed in the fiftieth year of His Majesty George the Third, for preventing the administering and taking unlawful oaths in Ireland."

An Act to continue, until the first day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, an Act, of the second and third years of His late Majesty, for restraining, for five years, in certain cases, party processions in Ireland.

An Act for making and maintaining a railway from the city of Dublin to the town of Cashel, with a branch to the town of Carlow.

An Act to alter, amend, enlarge, and in part repeal the Acts relating to the Wishaw and Coltness Railway.

An Act for making a railway from the river Dee, in the county of the city of Chester, to Wrexham, in the county of Denbigh, to be called the North Wales Mineral Railway.

An Act to continue and extend the powers of the London and Croydon Railway Company.

An Act for widening, repairing, and maintaining the bridge of Ayr, commonly called the New Bridge, leading across the river Ayr, at the royal burgh or town of Ayr, in the county of Ayr, and for other purposes in relation thereto.

An Act for paving, lighting, cleansing, watering; regulating, and otherwise improving the town and borough of Swansea, in the county of Glamorgan; and for removing and preventing nuisances and annovances therein.

An Act for making new docks, and other works connected therewith, in addition to the present docks at Kingston-upon-Hull; and for amending the Acts relating to such last-mentioned docks.

An Act for better lighting, paving, cleansing, watching, regulating, and improving the town of Rochdale and the environs thereof; in the county palatine of Lancaster.

An Act for better paving, lighting, cleansing, and otherwise improving part of the parish of Newchurch, in the isle of Wight, called Ventner, and for establishing a market therein.
