> The Address of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the antient and loyal borough of New Windsor, in the county of Berks, in Council assembled.

May it please your Royal Highness,

WE, Her Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of New Windsor, entreat your Royal Highness to accept our sincere and heartfelt congratulations on the safe delivery of the Queen, and the auspicious birth of a second Prince.

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

Whitehall, August 23, 1844.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto John Falcon, heretofore of Workington, and now of Whitehaven, in the county of Cumberland, Gent. Her royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may, in compliance with an injunction

contained in the last will and testament of his grandfather, Thomas Harrison, of Whitehaven aforesaid, Esq. deceased, henceforth take and use the surname of Harrison only, instead of that of Falcon; and that he and they may also bear the arms of Harrison quarterly with those of Falcon; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Olice, otherwise Her Maiesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be recorded in the College of Arms.

Railway Department, Board of Trade, Whitehall, August 20, 1844.

WHEREAS by a minute of the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade, relative to the constitution and mode of proceedings of the Railway Department, dated the 6th August 1844, and presented to Parliament by Her Majesty's command, my Lords direct, that whenever the Department has formed an intention of examining into any railway scheme or schemes, with a view to making a minute or report thereon for presentation to Parliament, notice shall be given of that intention in the Gazette, for the information of those whom it may concern; in which notice shall be stated, as nearly as may be, the points into which enquiry is to be made in connection with the proposed line of railway; in conformity with the said direction, the Board, constituted by that minute for the transaction of railway business, hereby give notice, that it is their intention to examine into the following schemes, with a view to the presentation to Parliament of minutes or reports thereon, in the event of their becoming the subjects of application to Parliament:

- The schemes proposed for connecting London and York by a new line or lines of railway communication to the eastward of the lines at present existing.
- II. The schemes proposed for establishing east and west lines of railway communication between Lincolnshire and the west riding of Yorkshire.
- III. The schemes proposed for completing the railway communication between Scotland and England.
- IV. The schemes proposed for extending railway communications to Newbury, and to the districts of Wiltshire, Somersetshire, and Dorsetshire, which lie intermediate between the London and South Western Railway, and the Great Western and Bristol and Exeter Railways.
- V. The schemes proposed for completing the line of southern coast communication between Chichester and Portsmouth.

- VI. The schemes proposed for extending railway communications from London to Gravesend, Chatham, and North Kent.
- VII. The schemes proposed for extending railway communications from Oxford to Rugby, and to Evesham, Worcester, and other districts intermediate between the Great Western and London and Birmingham Railways.
- VIII. The schemes proposed for establishing new and more direct railway communication between Manchester and Leeds, Huddersfield, Halifax, Bradford, and other places in the districts adjoining to the Manchester and Leeds Railway, and intermediate between that line and the Manchester and Sheffield, and Leeds and Bradford Railways.

The principal points into which enquiry will be made, in connection with the above schemes, are as follows:

- 1st. The ability and bona fide intention of the promoters to prosecute their application to Parliament next session for Bills to authorize the several undertakings.
- 2d. The advantages to be obtained, in a national point of view, in completing or extending important lines of railway communication.
- 3d. The amount of local advantage afforded to the towns and districts more immediately affected.
- 4th. The engineering circumstances of the line, so far as may be necessary to form a general judgment of the character of the undertaking.
- 5th. The estimates of cost of construction, and of traffic and working expences, so far as may be necessary to judge of the probability of the line being completed and efficiently worked in the event of its being sanctioned by Parliament, and with a view to drawing a comparison between the merits of competing lines of railway.

The enquiry, in conformity with the recommendation of the fifth report of the Select Committee on Railways, will not embrace questions of private property or interest, which will be reserved altogether for the consideration of the Legislature.

Church Commissioners' Office, August 17, 1844.

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a consolidated district, under the 6th section of the 59th George 3, cap. 134, to the chapel at Rhyd-y-Croesau, in the parish of Llansilin, in the county of Denbigh, formed from contiguous parts of the said parish of Llansilin, and of the parishes of Oswestry, Llanyblodwel, and Selattyn, in the county of Salop:

At the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 23d of May 1844, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diccese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fiftyninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes, reciting that a considerable population is frequently collected together at the extremities of, and locally situate in, parishes or extra parochial places contiguous to each other, at a distance from the respective churches or chapels of such respective parishes or extra parochial places, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with such consent as is required by the said recited Act in the case of district parishes, to unite and consolidate any such contiguous parts of such parishes and extra parochial places into a separate and distinct district for all ecclesiastical purposes, and to cause such district to be named, ascertained, and marked out by described bounds, and such name, and the description of such bounds, when approved by His Majesty in Council, to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese to which such district shall belong, under the provisions of this Act; and to make grants or loans for or towards the building of, or to build, any chapel or chapels, with or without cemeteries, in and for the use of the inhabitants of any such district, in such manner, and under such regulations as may, in the judgment of the Commissioners, appear from the circumstances to be most expedient, and to constitute any such district a consolidated chapelry; and every such chapelry shall be under the superintendance of such spiritual person as shall be appointed under the provisions of this Act to serve any such chapel, and such spiritual person shall have cure of souls in such district; and the right of presentation and appointment of such spiritual person shall thenceforth belong to such person or persons, and be exercised in such manner as may be agreed by the several patrons of the churches or chapels of such parishes and extra parochial places respectively, with the approbation of the Commissioners; and banns of marriage may be published, and marriages, christenings, churchings, and burials may be solemnized and performed in any such chapel, immediately and at all times after the consecration thereof, and the pew rents in such chapel shall be fixed, and salaries to the minister and clerk assigned therefrom, in such manner as isdirected in the said recited Act, or in this Act, concerning pew rents and salaries in separate or distinct parishes; and all fees and offerings which may arise and accrue within such chapelry, according to such table of fees as the Commissioners shall make, with the approbation of the bishop, may

be demanded, received, sued for, prosecuted, and | recovered by the spiritual person having cure of souls therein, and by the clerk and sexton of such chapelries, in like manner as if every such chapelry was a distinct parish; and it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, and they are hereby required in every such case, to ascertain and make compensation, in manner directed in like cases under the said recited Act, for any loss which may be sustained by the incumbent of any contiguous parish or extra parochial place, which shall form part of any such district, by reason of any fees, oblations, and offerings being transferred to the spiritual person serving any such chapel; and all such chapelries shall be deemed to be benefices, and be subject to the jurisdiction of the bishop and archdeacon within whose diocese and archdeaconry the altar of such chapel shall be locally situate, and to all the laws in force concerning presentation and appointment to benefices and churches, and lapse, and all other laws relating to the holding of benefices and churches:" and whereas it, is thereby further enacted, "that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said hereinbefore recited Act, or the said Act now in recital, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which might thereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said former Act, or the said Act now in recital; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether and what part or portion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding:

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled 'An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-third day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Llansilin, in the county of Denbigh and diocese of St. Asaph, contained a population of two thousand and eightythree persons; the parish of Oswestry, in the county of Salop and diocese of St. Asaph, contained a population of eight thousand eight hundred and forty-three persons; the parish of Llanyblodwel, in the same county and diocese, contained a population of nine hundred and sixty-one persons; and the parish of Selattyn, in the same county and diocese, contained a population of one thousand one hundred and twenty-eight persons.

"That the parish church of Llansilin affords accommodation to seven hundred persons, and there is a consecrated chapel in the said parish at Rhyd-y-Croesau, which affords accommodation to two hundred and ninety-two persons; that the parish church of Oswestry affords accommodation to nine hundred and fifty-six persons; and there are two other consecrated churches or chapels in

the said parish (that is to say), Trinity Church and Trefonen Church, which together afford accommodation to one thousand and eighty persons; that the parish church of Llanyblodwel affords accommodation to two hundred and ninety-six persons; and there is a consecrated chapel at Morton, in the said parish, which affords accommodation to two hundred and fifty-seven persons; that the parish church of Selattyn affords accommodation to five hundred and sixty-four persons; and there is a consecrated chapel in the said parish at Hengoed, which affords accommodation to two hundred persons:

- "That the said chapel at Rhyd-y-Croesau is distant two miles and a half from the parish church of Llansilin, three miles and a half from the parish church at Oswestry, seven miles from the parish church of Llanyblodwel, and three miles from the parish church of Selattyn:
- "That the extremities of the said parishes of Llansilin, Oswestry, Llanyblodwel, and Selattyn, which lie contiguous to each other, and are delineated on the accompanying plan, contain an estimated population of five hundred and four persons:
- "Your Majesty's Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances above-mentioned, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate the said contiguous parts of the said parishes of Llansilin, Oswestry, Llanyblodwel, and Selattyn, into a separate and distinct district, to be assigned to the said chapel at Rhyd-y-Croesau, for all ecclesiastical purposes, and to constitute such district a consolidated chapelry, under the sixth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," for the purpose of affording accommodation for attending divine service to the persons residing in the said district, and for enabling the spiritual person serving such chapel to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the said district attached to such chapel, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the moral habits of the persons residing therein; and that such district should be called, "The Consolidated District of Rhyd-y-Croesau," and that the boundaries thereof should be as follow:

the Oswestry Race Course, where a parish road leads to a farm house called Carreg-y-Big; and proceeding along the middle of that road, in a north westerly direction, to that house at the point D, where it crosses the road leading from the Llawnt, in the parish of Oswestry, to Selattyn; and proceeds along the middle of the road, in a westerly direction, to the Morda Brook at the point E, where such road crosses that brook; it then proceeds in a north westerly direction along the course of the Morda Brook to the point F, where it meets the road leading from a farm house, Llechrydau (in the parish of Llangollen), to Llansilin, and at which point the parishes of Llangollen, Llansilin, and Selattyn meet together from the point F; the boundary turns south along the middle of the aforesaid road, and proceeds to the point G, where it crosses the road leading from Oswestry to Llanarmon, and then onwards till it meets the road from Oswestry to Llanyadwaladr. at a place called Carreg-y-Big, in the township of Lledrode, in the parish of Llansilin, at the point H; from thence it turns south east along the middle of that road to the point K, where it branches off in a south easterly direction along the road leading to Bryn coch ucha, at the point marked L, and onwards along the said road to the point M, where it crosses the road leading from Llansilin to Oswestry; and then proceeds along a footpath to the point N, where it meets the Cynllaith Brook, which separates the parish of Oswestry from the parish of Llansilin; it then proceeds in a south westerly, easterly, and north easterly direction along the boundary of the said parishes to the point A, on the Morda Brook, where the boundary commenced, as shewn on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured blue, green, yellow, and red:

- "That the consent of the Lord Bishop of St. Asaph has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:
- "Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the beforementioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed consolidation and assignment be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
