The Speech of the Lords Commissioners to both Houses of Parliament, on Thursday, September 5, 1844.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

WE are commanded by Her Majesty, in relieving you from further attendance in Parliament, to express to you the warm acknowledgments of Her Majesty, for the zeal and assiduity with which you have applied yourselves to the discharge of your public duties during a laborious and protracted session.

The result has been the completion of many legislative measures, calculated to improve the administration of the law, and to promote the public welfare.

Her Majesty has given Her cordial assent to the bill which you presented to Her Majesty, for regulating the issue of bank notes, and for conferring certain privileges upon the Bank of England for a limited period.

Her Majesty trusts that these measures will tend to place the pecuniary transactions of the country upon a sounder basis, without imposing any inconvenient restrictions on commercial credit or enterprise.

We are directed to inform you, that Her Majesty continues to receive from her Allies, and from all Foreign Powers, assurances of their friendly disposition.

Her Majesty has recently been engaged in discussions with the Government of the King of the French, on events calculated to interrupt the good understanding and friendly relations between this country and France; you will rejoice to learn that, by the spirit of justice and moderation which has animated the two Governments, this danger has been happily averted.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

We are commanded by Her Majesty to thank you for the readiness with which you voted the supplies for the service of the year.

Her Majesty has observed with the utmost satisfaction that by the course to which you have steadily adhered in maintaining inviolate the public faith, and inspiring a just confidence in the stability of the national resources, you have been enabled to make a considerable reduction in the annual charge on account of the interest of the public debt.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

Her Majesty desires us to congratulate you on the improvement which has taken place in the condition of our manufactures and commerce, and on the prospect that, through the bounty of Divine Providence, we shall enjoy the blessing of an abundant harvest.

Her Majesty rejoices in the belief, that on your return to your several districts you will find generally prevailing throughout the country a spirit of loyalty and cheerful obedience to the law.

Her Majesty is confident that these dispositions, so important to the peaceful development of our resources, and to our national strength, will be confirmed and encouraged by your presence and example.

We are commanded by Her Majesty to assure you, that, when you shall be called upon to resume the discharge of your Parliamentary functions, you may place entire reliance on the cordial co-operation of Her Majesty in your endeavours to improve the social condition, and to promote the happiness and contentment of Her people.

Then a Commission for proroguing Parliament was read, after which the Lord Chancellor said :

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

By virtue of Her Majesty's Commission under the Great Seal, to us and other Lords directed, and now read, we do, in Her Majesty's name, and in obedience to her commands, prorogue this Parliament to Thursday the tenth day of October next, to be then here holden ; and this Parliament is accordingly prorogued to Thursday the tenth day of October next.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament, made and passed in the session of Parliament holden in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to enable Her Majesty to provide for the

" government of Her settlements on the coast of Africa, and in the Falkland Islands," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by any Order or Orders to be by Her made, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to establish all such laws, institutions, and ordinances, and to constitute such courts and officers, and to make such provisions and regulations for the proceedings in such courts, and for the administration of justice, as may be necessary for the peace, order, and good government of Her Majesty's subjects, and others, within the said present or future settlements, respectively, or any of them; any law, statute, or usage to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding :

And whereas by another Act of Parliament, made and passed in the same session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to remove doubts as to the exercise of power and jurisdiction by Her Majesty within divers countries and places out of Her Majesty's dominions, and to render the same more effectual," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it is and shall be lawful for Her Majesty to hold, exercise, and enjoy any power or jurisdiction which Her Majesty now hath, or may at any time hereafter have, within any country or place out of Her Majesty's dominions, in the same and as ample a manner as if Her Majesty had acquired such power or jurisdiction by the cession or conquest of territory :

And whereas Her Majesty hath power and jurisdiction within divers countries and places adjacent to Her Majesty's forts and settlements on the gold coast, in Africa, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all judges, magistrates, assessors, and other officers duly appointed to exercise the said power and jurisdiction in the name and on the behalf of Her Majesty, within the countries and places aforesaid, shall, in the exercise thereof, observe, until further order, such of the local customs of the said countries and places as may be compatible with the principles of the law of England, and, in default of such customs, shall proceed in all things, as nearly as may be, according to the said law of England; and, in further pursuance of the powers by the said Acts of Parliament vested in Her Majesty, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with

the advice of Her Privy Council, to appoint the settlement of Cape Coast Castle and the colony of Sierra Leone as British colonies, to which it shall be lawful for any person having authority derived from Her Majesty in that behalf, by warrant under his hand and seal, to cause any person charged with the commission of any crime or offence, the cognizance whereof may at any time appertain to any judge, magistrate, or other officer of Her Majesty within the countries and places aforesaid, to be sent for trial, or in order that sentences, passed within such countries and places as aforesaid, may be carried into effect within such colonies:

And the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

IN compliance with the fifth and sixth of Victoria, cap. cx, I insert the following notice from Mr. George John Chamberlain, relative to enclosing a part of Tranmere-pool, in the river Mersey, and I have to inform all whom it may concern, that my Lords Commissioners for the Conservancy of the river Mersey do not sanction the proposal contained therein.

To the Lords Conservators of the river Mersey,
and Acting Conservator thereof.

You will please to take notice, that George John Chamberlain, of the city of Chester, and county of the same city, Gentleman, purposes to enclose that portion of the shore lying contiguous to property belonging to him, situate in the township of Tranmere, on the margin of Tranmere-pool, bounded on the north by the low water gut in the said pool, on the east by the shore of the river Mersey, on the south by the graving dock, and on the west by the property aforesaid, for the purpose of increasing the landing accommodation, and obtaining sufficient depth of water at the wharfrage during ordinary spring tides for small coasting vessels, by constructing a river wall of 202 yards or thereabouts in length; the general design and intention of which will be understood by reference to the accompanying plan and section.

The river wall will be erected at a right angle with the graving dock (parallel in some degree with the river front of the present yards, &c.), and carried in a direction N.N.W. for 130 yards or thereabouts, then in a westerly direction for 72 yards or thereabouts to the north east extremity of the yards above mentioned.

It is proposed to excavate the mud or silt from the face of the intended wall to the low water gut of Tranmere-pool, so as to obtain the requisite depth of water, by which it may be seen (by reference to the accompanying section) that there would be an increased capacity for the tidal waters, notwithstanding the proposed abstraction of a portion of the strand.

The wall will be erected of good sand-stone rubble, founded on a good stiff clay, and completed in a substantial manner.

It is proposed to commence the works immediately on the expiration of the term required by the Act after this notice shall have been given.
