WHEREAS Nathaniel Richard Clarke, Esq. and Richard Wilaman, Esq, the Barristers appointed by virtue of the Statute of the fifth and sixth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act to provide for the regulation " of municipal corporations in England and " Wales," to re-divide and set forth the municipal wards of the city of Lincolu, did, by their report,
bearing date the thirty-first day of August last, determine and set forth afresh the extent, limits, and boundary lines of the wards into which it was expedient that the said city should be re-divided; and did also by their said report re-assign Councillors to each of the said wards respectively :

And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the third day of September last, the proposed alterations and re-division of the said wards, and of the number of Councillors assigned to each respectively, as set forth and recommended in the report of the. Eaid Barristers, were approved, and it was also ordered that the same should be published in the London Gazette accordingly:

And whereas the said Order in Council was subsequently duly published in the London Gazette :

And whereas the re-division of the said wards and re-assignment of Councillors thereto have not yet been carried into effect:
