WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend "and render more effectual an Act, passed in the "last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches

"in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid "before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act for building, and promoting the building, " of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for " building, and promoting the building, of additional "churches in populous parishes;" and further contined by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to "prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission "for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Great Milton, in the county and diocese of Oxford, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church or chapel called Saint James's Chapel, at Little Milton, in the said parish, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render "more effectual an Act passed in the last session "of Parliament, for building, and promoting the "building, of additional churches in populous "parishes;" and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Little Milton," and should consist of the townships of Little Milton and Ascot, and be bounded as follows, that is to say:

"On the north-west by the parish of Cuddesden; on the west by the parishes of Chippenhurst and Stadhampton; on the south by the parish of Newington; on the east by the parishes of Chalgrove and Great Haseley; and on the north east by the township of Great Milton, as shewn on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured brown:

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister thereof:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Oxford has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendation of the said Commissioners, in respect to the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churches, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend "and render more effectual an Act, passed in the "last session of Parliament, for building, and "promoting the building, of additional churches in "populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, or representation in writing, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act for building, and promoting the building, "of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled " An Act to amend the Acts " for building, and promoting the building, of "additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Com-" mission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Tonbridge, in the county of Kent and diocese of Rochester, and the parish of Leigh, in the same county and diocese, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate the contiguous parts of the said parishes of Tonbridge and Leigh into a separate and

distinct district, to be assigned to the consecrated church or chapel of Saint John, at Hildenborough, in the said parish of Tonbridge, for all ecclesiastical purposes, and to constitute such district a consolidated chapelry, under the provisions of the sixth section of an Act, passed in the fiftyninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend " and render more effectual an Act, passed in the "last session of Parliament, for building, and pro-"moting the building, of additional churches in " populous parishes," for the purpose of affording accommodation for attending divine service to the persons residing in the district, and for enabling the spiritual person serving such chapel to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the said district attached to such chapel, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the moral babits of the persons residing therein; and that such district should be named, "The Consolidated Chapelry District of Hildenborough;" and be bounded as follows, that is to say:

"The boundary to commence at the north east corner of a field belonging to Horatio Joseph Montefiore, Esq. known as Barn-field, adjoining the farm-house of Tinley-lodge, and marked A on the annexed map; from thence it proceeds, westward, along the boundary line which divides the parishes of Shipborne and Tonbridge to a point marked B on the said map, at which the said parishes join the parish of Leigh; it then proceeds northward along the boundary line which divides the said parishes of Leigh and Shipbourne to the point marked C on the map, where it meets the boundary of the parish of Seal; thence in a south westwardly direction along the boundary line of the said parishes of Leigh and Seal to the point marked D on the said map, where Tonbridge parish again unites with the aforesaid parishes; then takes a northerly direction along the boundary line which divides the parishes of Tonbridge and Seal, to a point marked E on the said map, where the said parishes meet the parish of Sevenoaks; from thence south west along the boundary line that divides the parishes of Tonbridge and Sevenoaks to a point marked F on the said map, where the said parishes meet the parish of Leigh; it then proceeds in a southerly and easterly direction along the boundary line that divides the said

parishes of Tonbridge and Leigh, to the south east corner of a field belonging to Mortimer Ricardo, Esquire, in the occupation of William Hilder, known by the name of Lodge-field, adjoining the farm house of Little Hawdon, and marked G on the said map; then along the east side of the said field to a road leading to the London and Tonbridge turnpike road, following the eastern side of the said road to the south-east corner of a field belonging to Farmer Bailey, Esquire, in the occupation of John Stone, called Oast-house-field; thence proceeding along the east side of the said field at the back of Selby's farm house to the north-east corner of a field also belonging to Mr. Bailey, in the same occupation, known as Stackplot; then turning along the north side of the said field to the road just before-mentioned, and following the eastern side of the said road to its junction with the London and Hastings turnpike road at the point marked H on the said map; thence: turning south-east along the said turnpike-road to some costages belonging to Mortimer Ricardo, Esquire, which are included in the district, and situated at the point marked I on the said map; where, leaving the turnpike read, it proceeds along the east side of a field belonging to John Auldjo, Esquire, in the occupation of Thomas Parfect-Charlton, known by the name of Lower Barnfield; then up the north side of the same field. including a cottage and barn in the district to the north-west corner of the field; thence northerly along the east side of the two fields belonging to the said John Auldjo, in the same occupation, known as Six Acres and Stephen's-field, to a stream. at the point marked K on the said map; then east, for a short distance, along the stream, turning again in a northerly direction along the east sideof some fields, called Pear-tree-field, Eight-acres, Thirteen-acres, Haugh-field, and Long Nineacres, all belonging to Thomas Poynder, Esquire, to a point marked L on the map; thence southeast along a fence dividing the property of the said Thomas Poynder, Esquire, from an estate belonging to Mrs. Evelyn, to a point marked M on the said map; from thence along the east side of some fields belonging to Mrs. Evelyn, known as Trench-lane-field, Poor-field, and Cottage-field, and along the east side of Stacy's-wood, also belonging to Mrs. Evelyn, to the south-east cornerof a field belonging to Horatio Joseph Montefiore,

Esquire, known by the name of Banky Five-acres, proceeding northward along the east side of the said field, and also along the east side of Sevenacres and Kiln-field, belonging to the said Horatio Joseph Montefiore, and including Tinley-lodge, Farm-house, and buildings, to the north-east corner of Barn-field, belonging to the said Horatio Joseph Montefiore, at the point marked A in the said map where the boundary commenced, as is more particularly described on the said map, and thereon coloured yellow and green:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Rochester has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof the said Lord Bishop has signed and scaled this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal conconsideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed consolidation and assignment be accordingly made and carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with "certain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirtieth day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of "Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making provision for the spiritual duties of the chapelry districts of Saint John at Seaham-harbour, and Saint Luke at Ferryhill, in the county and diocese of Durham.

"Whereas, under the provisions of the said recited Act, we are empowered, out of the lands, tithes, and hereditaments thereby vested and to be vested in us, or by an actual conveyance thereof, if it shall be deemed more expedient, to make additional provision for the cure of souls in parishes in which such assistance is most required; provided always, that in making any such additional provision out of any tithes or any lands or other hereditaments allotted or assigned in lieu of tithes, so vested or to be vested in us, or out of the rents and profits thereof, due consideration shall be had to the wants and circumstances of the places in which such tithes arise or have arisen:

" And whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-third day of August one thousand eight hundred and fortythree, a district was duly assigned to the church or chapel of Saint John at Seaham-harbour, in the parish of Dalton-le-Dale, in the said county and diocese of Durham, and the same now forms a separate chapelry district, called and known by the name of Seaham-harbour; and by another Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the fifteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, a district, comprehending the townships of Ferryhill and Chilton, in the parish of Merrington, was duly assigned to the church or chapel of Saint Luke at Ferryhill, and the same now forms a separate chapelry district, called and known by the name of Ferryhill; but the respective ministers of the said churches or chapelries are not perpetual curates or corporations sole:

" And whereas, under the said recited Act, and for the purposes thereof, the rent charge now payable in lieu of the tithes of corn and grain formerly growing, renewing, or arising out of or from all the titheable lands and places within the township of Murton, in the said parish of Dalton-le-Dale, subject to the deductions to be legally made thereout, and also subject to the perpetual annual rent or sum of six pounds thirteen shillings and eleven pence now issuing and payable thereout in respect of the said tithes or rent charge to the said Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Durham, and also the rent charge now payable in lieu of all the tithes or tenths of corn and grain growing, renewing, or arising out of or from all the titheable lands and places within the said township of Ferryhill, in the said parish of Merrington, but subject to the deductions to be legally made thereout, and also subject to the perpetual annua

rent or sum of six pounds thirteen shillings and I may have accrued to us from the dates of the four pence now issuing and payable thereout to the said Dean and Chapter of Durham, have become

and now are vested in or payable to us:

" And whereas, after due consideration of the wants and circumstances of the two several parishes of Dalton-le-Dale and Merrington aforesaid, we have deemed it expedient to make provision for the cure of souls therein, by such grant or transfer of the said several and respective rent charges as

is hereinafter proposed:

"And whereas it is in contemplation by the said Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Durham aforesaid, by a proper legal instrument to be duly executed, with our consent as required by the hereinbefore-mentioned Act, to surrender to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne the perpetual annual rents hereinbefore mentioned, to be payable to them out of or in respect of such several tithes, to be applied by the said Governors, under the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament enabling them in that behalf, for the benefit of the ministers for the time being of the said chapelry districts of Seaham-harbour and Ferryhill respectively, in order that the said churches or chapels may thereby become perpetual curacies, and the ministers thereof perpetual curates and as such bodies corporate, and capable of holding to themselves and their successors the several rent

charges aforesaid:
"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that so soon as by the means aforesaid, or by any other legal means, the said churches or chapelries of Seaham-harbour and Ferryhill shall have respectively become perpetual curacies, and the incumbents thereof for the time being shall have become perpetual curates, the said tithe rent charge, so as aforesaid described to be vested in or payable to us out of the titheable lands of the said township of Murton, shall, subject to such deductions as aforesaid, without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than this scheme and any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, become and be absolutely transferred to and vested in the perpetual curate of Seaham-harbour, and his successors for ever, and that the said rent charge, so as aforesaid described to be vested in or payable to us out of the tithes or tenths of the titheable lands of the said township of Ferryhill, shall, subject to the like deductions, become and be in like manner absolutely transferred to and vested in the perpetual curate of Saint Luke at Ferryhill, and his successors for ever.

"And whereas the provision hereby recom-mended to be made for the said churches or chape!ries was propsed by the said Dean and Chapter, and agreed to by us, in contemplation of and previously to the date of the assignment

of the respective districts aforesaid:

"We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, to the ministers for the time being of the said churches or chapelries respectively, on the first day of November next, a sum of money equal in amount to such portions of the said rent charges respectively, after deducting all outgoings in respect thereof, as

respective Orders aforesaid to the said first day of November, and thereafter on each and every first day of May and first day of November, until the said tithe rent charges shall have respectively become so vested as aforesaid, and also, on the day of such vesting, a sum of money equal in amount to such portions of the said rent charges respectively, after like deductions, as may have accrued between the said respective days of payment; and that if any vacancy in either of the said churches or chapelries shall happen, before such vesting of the said tithe rent charges respectively, on any other day than the first day of November or first day of May, or the day of such vesting, the then next payment shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the minister succeeding to the church or chapelry so becoming vacant.

"And we further recommend and propose, that

nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters herein contained, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of

the said recited Act."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given to the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Durham, and no objection has been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same shall take effect immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the last recited Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Durham.

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a chapelry district, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3,

cap. 134, to the chapel of St. John the Evangelist, at Farsley, in the parish of Calverley, in the county of York:

> At the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 19th of June 1844, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fiftyeighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within | Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An

the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Com-missioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His .. Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fiftyninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or b.ptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding:"

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late

Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled " An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled 'An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the thirteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the

present instrument:
