REGISTRATION OF JOINT STOCK COMPANIES, under 7th and 8th Victoria, c. 110.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Act for the Registration, &c. of Joint Stock Companies will come into operation on the 1st of November next.

The Registry Office will be opened on that day, at ten o'clock A. M.

Companies existing on the 1st of November, must register their names, purposes, and places of business, within three months of that day, under a penalty, not exceeding £50.

IN pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the Registration, Incorporation, and Regulation of Joint Stock Companies," the Lords of the Committee of Her Majesty's Privy Council for the consideration of all matters of Trade and Plantations have prescribed the regulations hereunder written, respecting the form of such returns as are by the said Act directed to be made, and respecting the manner of making them.
