PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, that is, to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your

Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for removing doubts as to the spiritual jurisdiction in and over the town of Bury Saint Edmunds, and certain parishes and places locally situate within the archdeaconry of Sudbury, in the diocese of Ely.

"Whereas under the authority of the said Act we prepared and laid before His said late Majesty in Council, a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, in which we recommended and proposed, that the archdeaconry of Sudbury, and all parishes and places, churches and chapels, within the limits thereof, with certain exceptions therein mentioned, should be under and subject to the jurisdiction, authority, and control of the Right Reverend Joseph Bishop of Ely, and of his successors, Bishops of Ely, for ever; and the said scheme was ratified by an Order of His said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the nineteenth day of the same month of April, which Order was duly registered and gazetted:

"And whereas it has been represented to us that, previously to the passing of the said Order of His said late Majesty in Council, the said town of Bury Saint Edmunds, although locally situate within the limits of the said archdeaconry of Sudbury, did not form part of such archdeaconry, and that the archdeacon of the said archdeaconry of Sudbury has not at any time heretofore exercised jurisdiction therein, and doubts have
