

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session for leave to bring in a Bill to alter, amend, and enlarge some of the powers and provisions contained in the several Acts hereinafter mentioned, viz. an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for paving the streets and lanes within the town and borough of Southwark, and certain parts adjacent, in the county of Surrey, and for cleansing, lighting, and watching the same; and also the courts, yards, alleys, and passages adjoining thereto, and for preventing annoyances therein;" an Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of His said Majesty, intituled "An Act to explain and amend so much of the said Act of the sixth year of His present Majesty for paving the town and borough of Southwark, in the county of Surrey, as relates to the Commissioners of Sewers; and for regulating the manner of taxing churches and other public buildings within the limits of the said Act;" an Act passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of His said Majesty, intituled "An Act for enabling the commissioners for putting in execution an Act made in the sixth year of the reign of His present Majesty, for paving the streets and lanes within the town and borough of Southwark, and certain parts adjacent, in the county of Surrey, and for cleansing, lighting, and watching the same; and also the courts, yards, alleys, and passages adjoining thereto, and for preventing annoyances therein, to open, widen, and better regulate the several streets, lanes, and passages within the east division in the said Act described;" an Act passed in the fifty-second year of the reign of his said Majesty, intituled "An Act for paving the footpath and for lighting and watching that part of the Kent-street road which leads from Kent-street end unto the bridge next immediately below the Greenman-turnpike, situated within the parish of Saint George the Martyr, Southwark, in the county of Surrey, and certain public streets, squares, lanes, passages, and places communicating therewith, respectively situated within the said parish, or within the parishes of St. Mary Magdalen, Bermondsey, and Saint Mary, Newington, adjoining thereto; and for removing and preventing encroachments and annoyances therein;" an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His said Majesty, intituled "An Act for lighting, watching, and cleansing Long-lane, in the parish of Saint Mary Magdalen, Bermondsey, in the county of Surrey, and the streets, lanes, passages, and places contiguous or adjoining thereto, within the same parish;" an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for lighting, watching, and cleansing the Grange-road, and other parts of the parish of Saint Mary Magdalen, Bermondsey, in the county of Surrey;" another Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His said Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for repairing, maintaining, and improving the highways and other public places, in the parish of Saint Mary Magdalen, Bermondsey, in the county of Surrey;" and

an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for better paving, cleansing, lighting, and improving the water-side division of the parish of Saint Mary Magdalen, Bermondsey, in the county of Surrey;" or to repeal the said Acts, or so much and such parts of the said Acts as relate to the said parish of Saint Mary Magdalen, Bermondsey; and to grant further, better, and more effectual powers instead thereof for paving, lighting, cleansing, regulating, repairing, and improving the streets, highways, lanes, and other public ways, passages, and places within the said parish of Saint Mary Magdalen, Bermondsey; and for removing and preventing nuisances, obstructions, encroachments, and annoyances within such parish.

And it is further intended by such Bill to alter the existing rates or assessments authorized to be made and collected by the said recited Acts, some or one of them, or to make, levy, and collect new and other rates and assessments instead thereof; also to vary or extinguish the existing exemptions from the payment of rates or assessments, or other rights and privileges; and to confer other exemptions from the payment of rates or assessments, and other rights and privileges; and it is intended also to apply for power to widen and improve the existing streets, highways, lanes, and other public ways, passages, and places within the said parish; and to open other streets, highways, lanes, and other public ways, passages, and places within such parish; and also for the powers usually conferred for the compulsory purchase of lands, houses, and other property that may be required for effecting the aforesaid purposes.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for an Act or Acts to alter, amend, and enlarge, and, so far as may be necessary for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, to extend to the borough of Manchester, the powers and provisions of several Acts of Parliament relating to or affecting the township of Manchester, passed respectively in the thirty-second year of the reign of His late Majesty George the Third; also in the fifth, the ninth, and the eleventh years of the reign of His late Majesty George the Fourth, and the first year of the reign of His late Majesty William the Fourth; and also in the second and third, the sixth and seventh, and the seventh years of the reign of His said late Majesty William the Fourth, and first year of the reign of Her present Majesty; and also in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty; and also of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for the improvement of the town of Manchester;" and also to alter, amend, and enlarge the powers and provisions of another Act, passed in the same session, intituled "An Act for the good government and police regulation of
