THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a district, under the 16th section of the 59th George 3, cap. 134, to the chapel at Aberdovey, in the parish of Towyn, in the county of Merioneth :

At the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 10th of July 1844, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal ; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, mo-

duses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions ; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division ; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided ;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation

and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is amongst other things enacted, "that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding."

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and by another Act, made and passed

in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled 'An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;'" and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;'" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Towyn, in the county of Merioneth and diocese of Bangor, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the chapel at Aberdovey, in the said parish, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Aberdovey," with boundaries as follow:

"The district is to consist of the townships of Cefarhosissa, Cefarhosucha, Treganol, and Cynfalfaur; and is bounded on the south by the river Dovey; on the west by Cardigan-bay; on the north and north west by the township of Danddy-ffryn, Dissyrnant, Treffion, and Llan-erchgaediog; and on the east by the parish of Pennal, as more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured red:

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in

the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister of the said chapel:

“ That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Bangor has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising thereof, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

Barnsley and Grange Moor Turnpike Road.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament during the next session, for leave to bring in a Bill, and to obtain an Act to continue the term, and to alter, amend, and enlarge the powers and provisions contained in an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act for more effectually improving the roads from Barnsley-common to Grange-moor and White-cross; and for making a diversion of the said roads, from or near to Redbrook, in the township of the Barugh to Barnsley, all in the west riding of the county of York;” and also to obtain powers to enable the trustees of the said turnpike road to alter, widen, improve, add to, or divert certain parts of the said turnpike road, and the diversion authorized to be made by the same Act, which said turnpike road and the diversion of road lie in or pass through the several townships, hamlets, or places of Barnesley, Bargh otherwise Barugh, Darton, Kexbrough, Woolley, Bretton West, Midgley, Flockton, and Whitley upper otherwise Denby, and the several parishes of Silkstone, Darton, Roystone, Sandall, Thornhill, and Kirkheaton, all in the west riding of the county of York.—Barnsley, sixth November 1844.

Tranmere Docks.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for leave to bring in a Bill or Bills, and to obtain an Act or Acts, to enable certain parties, therein to be named, or certain Trustees or Commissioners to be thereby appointed, or a company to be thereby incorporated, to make, build, and construct one or more wet dock or wet docks, and one or more graving dock or graving docks, with all necessary and proper basins, canals, piers, wharfs, shipping and landing-places, bridges, sluices, and works, convenient and adjoining thereto, or connected therewith, in or near a certain place called Tranmere Pool, in the county of Chester; and to form a sea wall adjoining the river Mersey, between the piers of certain ferries called Tranmere and Birkenhead Ferries, which said docks, basins, and other works, will be situated within or adjoining to the parishes, townships, and extra-parochial places of Tranmere, Birkenhead, Babbington otherwise Babbington, and Bidston, all in the said county of Chester; and to construct a cut, drain, or culvert, with proper sluices, and other works in connection therewith, for the purpose of carrying off the drainage waters, which now usually flow through the said pool from the lands to the west and north-west of the same, and within the said last-mentioned parishes, townships, or extra-parochial places, or some of them.

And notice is hereby also given, that it is intended to obtain powers, by the said Act or Acts, for the compulsory purchase of lands, houses, tenements, and hereditaments, and to vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges connected with such lands, or with the lands immediately abutting on the said pool, dock or docks, or with the waters of the said pool, or which would in any manner interfere with or impede the carrying the said Act or Acts into execution; and it is also intended to apply for power for the parties to be named in, or trustees or commissioners to be appointed, or the company to be incorporated by the said intended Act or Acts, to levy tolls, rates, and duties, for and in respect of the use of the said docks, basins, and other works and conveniences.

Central Kentish Railway.

And it is proposed by the said intended Act or Acts to take powers for altering, diverting, or stopping up, whether temporarily or permanently, within the parishes, townships and places aforesaid, all roads, streams, canals, rivers, or highways, which it may be necessary to stop up, alter, or divert, for the construction and maintenance of the said intended railway; and also to incorporate a company for carrying into effect the purposes aforesaid, with powers for the compulsory purchase of lands and houses, and for the levying tolls, rates, and duties in respect of the use of the said intended railway, and with powers also to sell or lease such railway to any other railway company or companies whose railway may be in connexion with the said intended undertaking, or to amalgamate and become incorporated with such company, or otherwise to purchase or rent, and to use and work the railway and works, belonging to any such company, and to enable any such company to sell or lease the same.

And it is further proposed by such intended Act or Acts to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would in any manner impede or interfere with the objects aforesaid, and to confer other rights and privileges.

And notice is hereby also given, that it is proposed by the said intended Act or Acts to take power to deviate in the construction of the proposed railway and works (save as hereinafter mentioned), to an extent not exceeding ten yards on either side of the line or lines laid down on the plans, to be deposited as hereinafter mentioned, where the said line or lines is, or are intended to pass, through land covered with houses, and (save also as hereinafter mentioned,) in all other parts of the line or lines to an extent on either side thereof, not exceeding one hundred yards, save and except where the property situate within the said distances of ten yards and one hundred yards respectively, or either of them, shall not be numbered on the said plans, and save and except where it shall be denoted on the said plans, that the power of deviation is not intended to be applied for.
