Edinburgh, June 6.

His day we have an account, That upon Tuefday last a party from the Marquis of Atbol came to Glendarowall, where Charles Campbellay with 120 Foot and 12 Horfe, and that (narrowly elcaping) he fled with his Men and Horfe to his Boats, leaving two Prifoners, and one killed in his flight. We have also an account, That on Wednesday last the late Earl of Argile sent Sir John Cochran and Polwars with 100 Men and two Ships to Greenock, where their land-ing was endeavoured to have been oppoled by a Militia Troop of Horle under the Command of the Lord Cochran, from whom the young Laird of Houfloun, Corsburne and another Gentleman Rode down to the Boats and fired their Pistols at them Landing; but the Cannon playing from the Ships, as well as the fmall Shot from the Boats, the Gentlemen and Troop were obliged to retire. This Party of the Rebels after Landing in the Town took what Meal and Victuals they could find, and returned to Boor, where all the Rebels now are; and His Majelties Ships the Falcon and Mairmail with a Yacht are lying at Anchor near that Ille; and just now we have an account of Captain Hamiltons arrival in another of the Kings Ships, who with the other Captains are preparing a Fire-Ship, which in few days will be ready, and foon after we hope to have a good account of the Rebels.

Warfaw, May 18. The Dyct fill continues, not having yet determined the matter of the Recruits, nor fetled the Contributions for the Expences of the Campagne. In the mean time we have advice that th: Turks and Tartars have made an incurfion into the Ukraine, and have plundered and burnt feveral Villages: And that there is a fecret Negotjation On foot between the Turks and Mofcovites; To ankover the intentions of the latter, the King is fending an Envoy to Mofcow, who has orders to halten his journey thith r. The Ambaffador which the Elector of Brandenburgh has fent hither to take ca.e of his Interefis during the Dyet, has had two Audiences of the King The Hofpodar Duca, Prince of Moldavia, who was taken Prifoner the laft Summer by Coffacks, and offered 100 thoufand Crowns for his Ranfom is lately dead at Leopol.

Ranfom is lately dead at Leopol. Cadiz, May 18. The New-Spain Fleet which ought to have arrived here in March laft, cannot, according to the advice we have received by a final Veffel from the Indies, be now expected till the latter end of August or the beginning of September; The fifth inftant happened here a very violent Storm in which two small Veffels and a Dutch Ship, were caft away, but the Men of the laft were all faved.

Genoua, Fune 5. We have no News of the French Fleet fince they failed from *Thoulon*, but every body believes that they are gone for *Tripoli*. The three Gallies that are to fetch the Doge and Senators from *Marfeilles* are now Carcening, and will depart in two or three days. This week arrived here the Coronation Captain Fairwether, from the Coaft of Spain. Venice, May 26. Three days ago Sailed from

Venice, May 26. Three days ago Sailed from hence two men of War, a Galcalle and two Galiots: and the Great Duke of *Tufcany* has fent his Galleys and 2 men of War with 600 Soldiers more than laft year, to joyn the Fleet of this State which we hear is Sailed from Corfu; and it's faid that Signior Molino

is gone with 21 men of War, 4 Galleys, and two Galeafles towards *Rhodi* to intercept a great Convoy which was preparing at *Alexandria* to be test to Con*flantinople*. We have advice that a party of Morlacks have been lately defeated by the Furks near *Caftel Novo*, above roo of them being killed upon the place, with one of their chief Commanders, whofe lois is very much lamented. The two Princes of *Neuburg* are come hither from *Forènce* in their return for *Germany*.

Venice, May 26. We have an account that General Deghenfeldt is arrived at Corfu with the Troops he carried from hence; And that Captain General Morofini hath taken the Cimeriotes under the protection of the Republick and hath put Garifons into fome of their chiefelt places. This week arrived at the Lido feveral new railed Companies of Italian Foot, and fome others are expected which will be fent to Dalmatia. The Senate have upon the requeft of Signior Sandi, refolted to receive him into the number of the Nobility, he paying a roo thou[and Ducats.

Vienna, May 28., The Cities of Esperies and Galchaw have sent Deputies to Newstadt, where the Imperial Court, now is, as we are told, to beg the Emperors Pardon, and to declare their willingness to receive an Imperial Garison, and to renew their Oath of Fdelity to his Imperial Majefty: And Count Teckeley has defired leave to fend Deputies hither to Treat of his Reconciliation, but at the same time some Letters of his have been intercepted, wherein he encourages his adherents to continue in their Rebellion, and gives them assurletters from Hungary confirm the account we have of the extremity the Garison in Newbuffel is reduced too; And of the Imperial Treops bring on their March from their feveral quarters formally to attack that place.

Vienna, May 31. The Imperial Court returned hither the 29th. inftant from New ladt. The Elector of Bavaria is expected here the next week ; And in the mean time great Preparations are making for the Celebration of bis, Marriage. The Duke of Lorrain is come back from Infpruck ; and will in three or four days be going for Hungary. The Troois March from all parts to the General Rendezvous; And we are told that General Caprara will on the 5th. or 6th of the next Month formally attack Newheufel with an Army of 25000 men. A great many Boats pais down the River, laden with Provisions and Ammunition for the Troops in Hungary. The news of General Schultz having taken the Gaille of Ungwar is not confirmed; but on the contrary the freihest Letters from Upper Hungdry say, that the besieg-ed make a very stout defence. The Emperor has named the Count de Lobcowits to go in quality of his Envoy Extraordinary to the Molt Chriftian King. We have advice from the Turkish Tetritories, that General Rendezvous of the Turkilli Army is appointed instead of Belgrade to be near Buda. They write from Hungary that 50 Janifaries of Newbenfel having deferted and got out of the Towns had declared to the Imperialist they were in 55 great necessity in the Town that the whole Garilon would detert if they thought they should not be ill treated by the Chriftians.

Lats'oine, June 4. The Billaop of Paffam, the Empriors Principal Commissioner at the Dyet, made his publick Entry into this City on the 29th. of the last mouth, and has fince been Complimented by the Liveral Colleges of the Dyet, and has received the Vifits of all the Perions of Quality that are here. The first instant passed through this City a Regiment of Herle of the Circle of Suabia, in their March to Hungary, confilling in 1000 Mcn well Armed and Mounted ; And its faid they will in a few days be fol-lowed by acco Foot of the fame Circle. The College of Electors and that of the Princes have Named the Deputies that are to affilt on their pare at the Conferences to be held for the Regulating the limits between the Empire and the Crown of France.

Neydelbergb, June 4. Prince Anthony of Neubergb, Great Malter of the Teutonick Order, arrived here the 30th. pall, with full power from his Father the Dake of Neubergb. at prefent Elector Pulatin, to receive in his Name an Oath of Fidelity from the Magilirates, Officers, and Inhabitants of this place, which was accordingly p rformed the next day; and fome of his Electoral Highnes's Council were fent by the Prince to all the Baliwicks of the Palatinate to receive in like manner an Oath of Fidelity from them. The Governor of Philipshourg has by the Emperors order put new Garilons into this place, Masheim and Frankendal for his Electoral Highnes; and the Troops that were there before are removed to Philipsbourg.

Cologne, June 9. The Troops of Liege, who are ging for Hungary, have already patien by Cob*lentz*, and were to reli two days at a place, about two Miles beyond that City, called *Braulback*. The Troops of Munster and Hildesbeim came the 6th. instant to Bergelladt near Arensperg, likewite in their March towards Hungary; The Landgrave of Heffe Caffel and and the States of Franconia having at last granted them patlage through their Terricories. The Magistrates of this City fent the last week an Officer with a party of Soldiers to Godorf a Village near Bonn, to feize Colonel Kyrbering, who formerly Commanded the Troops of this City, and retired from hince upon his being accuf.d of feveral Mildemeanors; They found him there, but fuffered him to elcaps, upon which the Magiltrates have imprifoned the Officer that Commanded the Party, and have ordered Process to be made against him. On the other hand the Elector of Cologne is highly offended at this attempt made in a place within his Jurifdiction, and has fent an Express to Vienna to give the Empefor a laccount of it.

Gaunt, June 16. We have this Evening received the News of the Death of the Marquis de Grana. It's faid that the Marquis del Pico de Velifco Governor of the Caffle of Antwerp, is appointed by the Dormant Commission, lying in the faid Castle, to be Governor General of these Countries Pro Interim.

Hague, Fune 11. The Stater of Holland and Weltfrizeland adjourned the 9th. instant till the 15th. of the next Month, without taking any refolution concerning the State of the War; The City of Amilerdim fi 1 perfuting in their opinion about reducing the Forcer.

Paris. June 15. The Marquis de Feuquieres, Ambalador from this Crown at Midrid has, we are told, prefented a Memorial to the King of Spain demanding latisfaction upon the complaints made by the French Marchans in that Kingdom, of which we are not yet well informed of the particulars. There has happened a fresh dispute between the Inhabitants of Fonterabia and those of Andaye about their Filhing, upon which some small Frigats are gone thither. It is faid for certain that the Queen of Spain, and the Datchefs of Sauoy are both with Child.

Plimouib, fune 5. This Morning arrived in the Sounds the Lord Lanfdown His Majeffies Envoy Extraordinary to the King of Spain, in the Dartmouth Frigat, and is now under fail egain to purfue his Voyage.

Whitebal, Fune 5. This day a very Loyal Address from the Nobility, Gentry and Grand Jury of the County of Meath in Ireland, was prefented to His Majefty by Edward Tyrril Efq; High-Sherift of the faid County, which his Majefty received very Gracioully.

The Count de Martinitz Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, to Condole the death of the late King of Ever Bielfed Memory, and to Congratulate His Maj-flies Succeflion to the Crown, had this Evening Audience of His Majefty, being Conducted by Sir Charles Conterel Maller of the Ceremonies.
