And it is also intended to vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges connected with the houses, lands, and other property proposed to be taken for the purposes of such railway, pier or jetty, and works and conveniences, and to confer other rights and privileges.

And it is also intended to apply for power to deviate in the construction of the said railway, pier or jetty, and works, to an extent to be defined upon the plan hereinafter referred to.

And also it is intended to apply for power to stop up, alter, vary, and divert the lines, levels, and inclinations of highways, roads, streets, paths, passages, rivers, canals, brooks, streams, waters and watercourses, mill and other ponds, where requisite for the construction of the said railway, pier or jetty, and works.

And notice is hereby further given, that on or before the thirtieth day of November in this present year, a plan and section describing the line and levels of the said intended railway, pier or jetty, and works, and the lands and property proposed to be taken for the purposes thereof; and a duplicate of such plan and section, together with a book of reference containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees, and occupiers of such land respectively, and a duplicate thereof, will be deposited with the Clerk of the Peace of the county of Essex, at his office at Chelmsford, in the said county; and also with the Town Clerk of the said borough of Harwich, at his office in Harwich aforesaid: and also that on or before the thirty-first day of December in this present year, a copy of so much of the said plan, section, and book of reference as relates to each parish in or through which such intended railway, pier or jetty, and works is or are proposed to be made, will be deposited for public inspection with the parish clerk of each such parish at his place of abode.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill to repeal, alter, amend, and enlarge some of the powers and provisions of four several Acts, one passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for making and establishing public quays or wharfs at Kingston-upon-Hull, for the better securing His Majesty's revenues of customs, and for the benefit of commerce in the port of King-

ston-upon-Hull; for making a basin or dock, with reservoirs, sluices, roads, and other works, for the accommodation of vessels using the said port, and for appropriating certain lands belonging to His Majesty, and for applying certain sums of money out of His Majesty's Customs at the said port for those purposes, and for establishing other necessary regulations within the town and port of Kingston-upon-Hull;" another, passed in the forty-second year of the reign of His said Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for amending an Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled 'An Act for making and establishing public quays or wharfs at Kingston-upon-Hull, for the better securing His Majesty's revenues of customs, and for the benefit of commerce in the port of Kingston-upon-Hull; for making a basin or dock, with reservoirs, sluices, roads, and other works, for the accommodation of vessels using the said port, and for appropriating certain lands belonging to His Majesty, and for applying certain sums of money out of His Majesty's Customs at the said port for those purposes, and for establishing other necessary regulations within the town and port of Kingston-upon-Hull,' and also for making additional basins or docks at Kingston-upon-Hull, with an entrance into the same from the river Humber, and for granting certain lands belonging to His Majesty in aid of the said works;" another, passed in the forty-fifth year of the reign of His said Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for raising a further sum of money for carrying into execution an Act passed in the forty-second year of the reign of His present Majesty, for making additional basins or docks at Kingston-upon-Hull;" and another, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for making new docks, and other works connected therewith, in addition to the present docks at Kingston-upon-Hull, and for amending the Acts relating to such last mentioned docks;" or to repeal the said Acts, and to grant further and other powers instead thereof. And in which Bill provision is particularly intended to be made (amongst other things) to repeal or alter so much of the provision contained in the said first-mentioned Act as restricts the erection of buildings upon certain grounds thereby granted within forty feet of the scite of the old wall therein mentioned.

And notice is hereby also given, that it is intended by the said Bill to authorise the Dock Company at Kingston-upon-Hull to enlarge a certain dock, and the works connected therewith, authorized to be made by the said last recited Act, called the Branch Dock, therein described, the ground on which the said enlargement of the said dock and works connected therewith will be situate being in the lordship of Myton, in the parish of the Holy Trinity, in the borough and county of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull; and in the said Bill power will be applied for to deviate from the line or lines laid down on the plans hereinafter mentioned, to the extent thereon defined.
