Bye-Laws, pursuant to the Act 6th and 7th Victoria, cap. 101, for the Registration and Regulation of Coal Whippers, in the Port of London.

1. AN Office shall be opened, situate at King James's-stairs, Wapping-wall, from nine o'clock in the morning until nine in the evening, from Wednesday the 3d January 1844, to Saturday the 13th, both days inclusive (Sunday excepted), and after that day from twelve at noon until two o'clock in the afternoon (Sundays excepted), for the purpose of registering, under the provisions of the Act, all such able-bodied male persons as shall be desirous of following, or continuing to follow, the employment of a coal whipper, and shall make application to be so registered, when every such applicant shall be required to state his name, place of abode, age, present or late occupation, single or married, if able to read and write, if a basket-man, and how long he has been so, all which shall be entered in the register against the number in the order of application; which being done, and upon the payment of four pence (4d.), the registrar shall then deliver to the applicant a certificate according to the terms of the Coal Whippers' Act.

2. At the expiration of the period first before-mentioned, a selection shall be made of one ninth from the whole of the men registered as coal whippers, who shall appear to the Commissioners the most eligible and best conducted, who shall be appointed foremen, and, for the purposes of the Act, shall be and be called "basket-men."

3. Each basket-man shall give security to the Commissioners for the amount of ten pounds (£10), by approved sureties, for his faithfully accounting and duly paying over to the registrar all moneys which he shall receive as the person authorized to collect the same, on account of the Commissioners, under the provisions of the Act.

4. The basket-man, when not employed, shall attend at the Office with his gang, at such hours as shall be directed by the registrar for giving out orders. The basket-man shall sign a contract upon accepting an offer, on the part of himself and men appointed under him, for the due performance of the engagement then entered into. And in case any one or more of the said gang shall neglect or refuse, after being required to do so, to perform the same, unless he or they shall have objected before the contract was signed as aforesaid, or shall prevent the performance thereof by disorderly conduct or insubordination, every man so offending shall, for every such neglect, refusal, or insubordination, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding five pounds (£5). The basket-man shall be required to report any act of drunkenness on the part of the men during the hours of labour to the registrar, who shall have the power of suspension until the next meeting of the Commissioners, when he shall lay the same before them for their further orders.

5. The basket-man shall use his best endeavours to expedite business, and, on the completion of the contract, shall receive from the master, or other person in charge of the ship, all moneys due for labour performed, baulk-days, and for hire of

tackle, and shall give a receipt for the same on account of the Commissioners, and shall forthwith pay the amount over to the registrar (to be disposed of according to the provisions of the Act), together with a certificate, which he shall require the master, or other person in charge of the ship, to sign, detailing the name of the ship, the name of the master, the quantity of coals which have been worked by himself and gang in the contract just completed, the amount of money received by him, specifying, under different heads, the proportions for labour, baulk-days, and for hire of tackle, for which he shall be entitled to receive, and the registrar is hereby directed to pay him, out of the funds of the office, a commission after the rate of one penny in the pound, for his own use, over and above any share that he may be otherwise entitled to.

6. On the completion of each contract, the basket-man shall enter his name, on behalf of himself and gang, in a rotation book, which shall entitle them to the offer of another contract in due course of rotation, upon the terms and according to the provisions of the Act.

7. The Commissioners, as they shall deem it expedient, shall, from time to time, appoint out of the registered men such other men of good character as they may consider most eligible to fill the office of basket-man.

8. A numerical and alphabetical list shall be made of practised coal whippers registered. One class under the age of thirty years, another between the ages of thirty and forty, and another of forty and upwards; and similar lists of other registered men, not being practised coal whippers. And, with the view to equalize the labour, and to appoint the most efficient men for expediting the work, to be performed under the provisions of the Act, and to complete the gang under each basket-man, there shall be added, by lot, eight other men, consisting of a due proportion from each of the above classes of coal whippers.

9. In case there shall be any practised coal whippers registered, who remain unappointed to gangs as above mentioned, they shall be called "Supernumeraries," and shall, in the numerical order in which they are registered, be appointed to fill up vacancies as they occur in the regular gangs, by death or otherwise. And when hereafter it shall happen that any gang shall be deficient four men or more, then the remainder, including the basket-man, shall become supernumeraries, and shall be appointed to fill up vacancies which may have occurred in other gangs; and other supernumeraries, as may not be so required, shall supply casual vacancies until there shall be sufficient to form a new gang. The basket-men, whose gangs have been broken up, shall, in the order in which they were deprived of their gangs, be reappointed when required, either to such newly-formed gangs, or to fill up vacancies caused by the death or other permanent removal of other basket-men.

10. In order to keep up a succession of efficient coal whippers, all casual absence, by illness or otherwise, of the men from their gangs, when required to labour (which cannot be supplied from

the supernumerary list), shall be provided for in the following manner, viz. for every absent coal whipper, two registered men, not being practised coal whippers, shall be appointed to act in lieu of such absent coal whipper, and they shall divide the earnings that would have been receivable by the absent coal whipper, between them, in equal shares; the said two men shall be the two first men who shall answer to their names, on being called according to their numerical order of entry on the registration. But in all cases where there shall not be two such men in attendance, when called, then the temporary or casual vacancy shall be filled up by an unemployed practised coal whipper. And when each of such men, not being practised coal whippers, shall have been appointed in manner before mentioned, to labour twenty days in the whole, he shall be deemed qualified as a coal whipper, and be added to the list of supernumeraries in regular order, as though he had been registered as a practised coal whipper, and was unappointed to a gang, as before mentioned, and shall take his turn for regular appointment accordingly.

11. Any person registered under the Act, who, when required to attend, shall fail to answer when called for five successive occasions, shall cease to be entitled to the privilege of registration, and his name, at the expiration of fourteen days afterwards, shall be removed from the register, and he shall not again be permitted to register till after the expiration of three months; but in every case, where it shall be satisfactorily shewn to the registrar that a man's absence was caused by illness, he shall not be deprived of his privilege.

12. Whereas the practice of the coal market, between buyer and seller, has long been to calculate the time for discharging ships according to the following scale, viz. not exceeding forty-nine tons, within one day; exceeding forty-nine and not exceeding ninety-eight tons, within two days; exceeding ninety-eight and not exceeding one hundred and forty-seven tons, within three days, and so on. And any days required over and above the time for delivery so calculated, are considered and called baulk-days; it is hereby ordered, unless any special written application and agreement shall be made to the contrary, that cargoes, or such parts of cargoes, as may be required to be delivered, shall be worked according to such existing practice. And in case one or more baulk-days shall occur from any cause other than the default of the coal whippers, the master, or other person in charge of the ship during his absence, shall pay, in addition to the charge for labour performed for each baulk-day, a sum equal to the amount which the coal whippers would have earned by the delivery of forty-nine tons: provided always, that when the Commissioners are satisfied that the regular discharge of colliers has been prevented by the accumulation of ice, or other extraordinary cause, and shall signify the same by notice, publicly exhibited at their Office, and in the coal market, the charge for baulk-days arising therefrom shall be suspended from the date specified in

such notice, and the date from which the charge for baulk-days shall again be reckoned, shall be clared by a like public notice.

13. In order to prevent the detention of vessels, when the discharge of their cargo is completed, and to provide against delay in the payment of wages and settlement of demands, the Commissioners direct, that in all cases where the master, or other person in charge of the ship, shall dispute the claim made upon him for baulk-days, on the ground that one or more of the baulk-days occurred through the default of the coal whippers, he shall forthwith deposit, or cause to be deposited, with the registrar at the office, the amount in dispute, with a notice in writing, stating his objection; and the amount so deposited shall not be paid to the coal whippers until after the expiration of thirty days; and if within that time the objection shall be established to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, the amount shall be repaid to the master or other person by whom the same was deposited, or to his agent. And in case any master or other person in charge of the ship shall, on being required to do so, neglect or refuse, immediately after the discharge of the cargo, or part of the cargo, by the coal whippers sent from the Coal Whippers' Office, shall be finished, to pay the full amount due for wages and hire of tackle, if any, or to pay or deposit with the registrar the amount claimed for baulk-days; the registrar is hereby directed to take the necessary legal proceedings for enforcing the same without delay.

14. The deduction to be made out of the wages, for the purposes of the Act, shall be at the rate of one farthing in every shilling.

15. When tackle shall be required from the Coal Whippers' Office, for the delivery of coals, the master, or other person in charge of the ship, shall pay, on the discharge of the cargo, or of such part thereof as shall be delivered by the tackle so required for the use or hire thereof, the sum of seven shillings and six pence, upon every vessel of two hundred and fifty tons burthen or upwards, and five shillings upon every vessel of less burthen than two hundred and fifty tons.

16. For the purposes of the Coal Whippers' Act, the port of London shall be considered to extend from the ferry, known as Regent's-ferry, in Woolwich-reach, to London-bridge, and to include all rivers, docks, and canals communicating therewith, which are comprised within the said port of London.

Porthdynllaen, Carnarvon, and Bangor Railway.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for an Act or Acts to authorize the construction of a railway, with all proper works and conveniences connected therewith, commencing at or near the north point of the harbour of Porthdynllaen, in the parish of Edern, in the county of Carnarvon; passing thence from, in,

through, or into the several parishes, townships, and extra-parochial and other places of Porthdynllaen, Edern, Nevin, Pistill, Llanaelhaiarn, Llynnog, Llanllyfni, Llandwrog, Llanwnda, Llanfaglan, Carnarvon, Llanbeblig, Llanrug, Llanfair, and Bangor, in the said county of Carnarvon, or some of them, terminating at or near the south west entrance of the city and town of Bangor, in the said parish of Bangor, or in or at such other place, in the said parish of Bangor, as will connect the said intended railway with the intended Chester and Holyhead Railway.

And, by the said intended Act or Acts, it is further proposed, to enable the company thereby to be incorporated, and the Chester and Holyhead Railway, and Porthdynllaen Harbour Companies, or either of them, to enter into and carry into effect such mutual arrangements as to the said companies, or any two of them, may deem expedient for the purchase, sale, lease, or transfer of all or any of the works, powers, and privileges vested in or belonging to the said last-named companies, or either of them; and also to enable the said company thereby to be incorporated to sell, lease, and transfer to the said last-named companies, or either of them, the said intended railway and works, and all or any of the powers to be conferred by said intended Act or Acts; and to enable the said companies, or any two of them, to obtain powers to incorporate themselves into one company, and to raise the necessary funds for the several purposes aforesaid.

And it is also intended to apply for powers, in the said intended Act, to make and maintain a branch railway, two miles and a half in length, or thereabouts, with all proper works connected therewith, from and out of the said intended main railway, commencing at or near a certain place called Pengelli, in the said parish of Llanfair, and passing thence through the parish of Llanddeiniolen, in the said county of Carnarvon, to connect the railway leading from the Di orwic Slate Quarries, at or near to a certain place called Glascoed, in the parish of Llanddeiniolen, in the said county; and also to continue and extend the said last-mentioned branch railway in or about two miles and a half further from Glascoed aforesaid, thence through the said parishes of Llanddeiniolen and Bangor, in the said county of Carnarvon, and terminating at or near a place called Ralltucha, in the said parish of Bangor, to connect the proposed railway from the Penrhyn Slate Quarries, or from or to such other place or places in said parishes, that the proprietors of said last-mentioned quarries may approve of; and also to make and maintain a branch railway, three miles in length, or thereabouts, with all proper works connected therewith, from and out of said intended main railway, commencing at or near a certain place called Bryncian, in the said parish of Clynnog, and passing thence through the parish of Llanllyfni, in the said county of Carnarvon, to connect the railway leading from the Nantlle, Dorothea, Penybryn, and Cloddfa'r Lon Slate Quarries, and Drwsycoed Copper Mines, at or near a certain place called Penygroes, in the said parish of Llanllyfni.

And it is intended to apply for powers, in the said Act or Acts, to deviate in the construction of the said railway or railways, and branch railway or railways, and other works, from the lines or situations thereof, as laid down on the plans to be deposited as hereafter mentioned, such extent as will be shewn or defined on such plans; and to alter any and divert such highways, roads, railways, passages, rivers, brooks, streams, and watercourses within the parishes and places hereinbefore mentioned, as it may be necessary to divert for the purpose of constructing the said railway or railways, and branch railway or railways, and the works connected therewith respectively.

And it is further intended to take power, by the said Act or Acts, to incorporate a company for the purpose of making the said intended railway or railways, and branch railway or railways, and the works connected therewith, respectively, with powers to purchase land, by compulsion or agreement; for the purposes thereof, and with powers to levy and take rates, tolls, and sums of money upon and in respect thereof.

And it is further intended to take powers, in the said Act or Acts, to incorporate the company to be thereby authorized to be formed with the Porthdynllaen Harbour Company, formed under and by virtue of an Act, passed in the forty-sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty George the Third, intituled "An Act for erecting a pier and other works for the improvement of the harbour of Porthdynllaen, in Carnarvon-bay, in the county of Carnarvon;" and also to alter and amend the said last-mentioned Act in any way that may be deemed necessary and expedient for the purposes of the said intended railway, and the works connected therewith.

And notice is hereby further given, that duplicate plans and sections, describing the lines and levels of the before-mentioned railway or railways, and branch railway or railways, and works, and the lands or hereditaments required to be taken for the purposes thereof, together with books of reference, containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees, and occupiers of such lands and hereditaments, respectively, will be deposited, for public inspection, on or before the thirtieth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, with the Clerk of the Peace for the said county of Carnarvon, at his office in Carnarvon; and a copy of so much of the said plans, sections, and books of reference, as relate to each of the several parishes through which the said railway or railways, and branch railway or railways would pass, will be deposited, on or before the thirty-first day of December next, with the parish clerks of those parishes respectively.
