The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council:

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend" and render more effectual an Act, passed in the "last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An "Act for building, and promoting the building, of "additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parlia. ment holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth: intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building; "and promoting the building, of additional churches "in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, " Her Majesty's Commission for building new "churches," beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Tottenham, in the county of Middlesex and diocese of London, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church or chapel of the Holy Trinity, in the said parish, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the. fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act. "to amend and render more effectual an Act, " passed in the last session of Parliament, for " building, and promoting the building, of ad-"ditional churches in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, Tottenham," that the same should be bounded as follows (that is to say):

"The district of the Holy Trinity, Tottenham, | is to consist of the southernmost part of the parish of Tottenham, and is bounded on the east by the river Lea; on the south by the parishes of Hackney and Stoke Newington; on the west by the parish of Hornsey; and on the north by the remaining part of the parish of Tottenham, from which it is divided, by proceeding in an easterly direction from the road to Hornsey, and crossing the South-gate-road along the southern line of enclosures, marked on the tithe commutation map, Nos. 1848, 1833, 1659, 1657, 1655, 1654, 1652, 1641, 1640, 1669, 1671, as far as the wall at the end of the gardens in Bruce-grove, along which wall it proceeds easterly and along the backs of the houses called Alfred-buildings; northerly and then easterly along the wall on the north side of the passage leading to the said buildings, and enters the road to Ware, up the middle of which road it proceeds northerly as far as the wall on the north side of Pembroke villa, along which wall it then passes easterly as far as the watercourse, up which it turns northerly as far as the southern inclosure of No. 311; it then turns easterly, following the southern inclosures of Nos. 311 and 534; then up the eastern inclosure of No. 534 till it reaches the southern inclosure of No. 532, along which it proceeds easterly, and then takes a southern direction along the eastern inclosure of No. 544, as far as Down-lane; and along the middle of that lane easterly, as far as the railway which it crosses, as also the canal, in a straight line to the river. Lea, where a bound stone is placed, as shewn on the map, and thereon coloured blue:

"That marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and (so soon as a burial ground shall have been obtained) burials also should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Vicar of the said parish of Tottenham, until the next avoidance of the living, from and after which they should be received by and belong to the Minister of the said chapel:

". That the consent of the Lord Bishop of London has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the

said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning a district, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3, cap. 134, to the church of the Holy Trinity, in the parish of Stowupland, in the county of Suffolk:

> At the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 23d of May 1841, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the twenty-first section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and scal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches or parochial chapels already built,

or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:" . in 1000

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the beforementioned circumstances, and humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

In the Matter of the Letters Patent for England and Scotland, granted to Angier March Perkins, of Harper-street, in the county of Middlesex, Civil Engineer, for certain Improvements in the Apparatus or Method of heating the Air in Buildings, heating and evaporating Fluids, and heating Metals; the English patent dated 30th July 1831, and the Scotch patent dated 2d November 1832.
