The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the tenth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate

district for spiritual purposes out of the chapelry of Attercliffe cum Darnall, in the parish of Sheffield, and in the county and diocese of York.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pasteral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Mujesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapelin use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it. is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any

scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said chapelry of Attercliffe cum Darnall is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such chapelry hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward Archbishop of York, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said chapelry of Attercliffe cum Darnall, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—

shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, " "The District of Darnall."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act. the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal halfyearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November. the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters afcresaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of DARNALL, being

" All that part of the chapelry of Attercliffe cum Darnall, in the parish of Sheffield, in the county and diocese of York, situate on the south east of an imaginary line extending first towards the north east, from the south western boundary of the said chapelry, along the middle of Acreshill-dyke (marked a on the map or plan herewith), and the Back-lane leading towards Attercliffe, across the Sheffield-canal, down the Crofts, and along the southern side of certain premises belonging to F- Huntsman and J- Milner, Esquires, as far as Acres-hill-brook (marked b as aforesaid); and thence southward, along the middle of such brook, as far as the Sheffield-canal aforesaid (marked c as aforesaid); and thence towards the north east, along the middle of such canal, as far as the Bradley-nook-lane (marked d as aforesaid); and thence towards the north west, along the middle of such lane, as far as the middle of the road leading from Sheffield to Rotherham (marked e as aforesaid); and thence towards the north east, along the middle of such road, as far as the eastern boundary of the said chapelry."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the church of the parish and the church or chapel of the chapelry out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and the patrons of the said chapelry have consented to the said scheme; and whereas one calendar month has expired since the draft thereof was so transmitted to the patrons of the said parish church:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct, that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the

London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act for "making better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the district of Sneyd, in the county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licenced to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required with a view to the constituting of another separate

district; provided always, that the scheme for course, forming the boundary between the townmaking any such alteration shall be subject to all the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said first-recited Act; and that any portion of any such separate district which, by any such alteration as aforesaid, shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district, as shall be determined by the like authority:

" And whereas the said district of Sneyd was duly constituted, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-third day of May last, and since duly gazetted:

" And whereas it has since been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such district should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the bounds of the said district shall be altered as follows; that is to say, that, instead of the imaginary line described in the schedule to the scheme hereinbefore mentioned, and forming the western boundary thereof, such district shall be bounded, on the western side thereof, by an imaginary line extending southward, from the north western corner of the hamlet of Sneyd (marked a in the map or plan hereunto annexed), along the western boundary of such hamlet as far as the watercourse referred to in the said schedule to the said scheme (marked b as aforesaid); and thence in the same direction along the middle of Mr. Williamson's collicry road, also referred to in the said schedule, as far as Greenhead (marked c as aforesaid); and thence through Wedgewood-place, leaving the shambles on the west, along the middle of the turnpike road from Burslem to Cobridge, to a point opposite to the middle of Nile-street (marked d as aforesaid); and thence towards the south east along the middle of such street, and the road through Holehouse and Flash, being the old turnpike road from Burslem to Cobridge, as far as the brook passed in the session of Parliament held in the third

ship of Burslem and the ville of Rushton Grange (marked e as aforesaid); and thence eastward along the northern bank of such brook, as far as the boundary of the said hamlet of Sneyd.

" And we further recommend and propose, that the portion of the said district which, by reason of the alteration hereinbefore recommended and proposed, shall become and be detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the said parish of Burslem.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of may other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the chusch of the parish out of which the district, the bounds of which are therein recommended to be altered, has been taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts; and such patrom has consented to the said scheme; and one calendar month has expired since the draft thereof was so transmitted to the said incumbent:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same. and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An "Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for dividing and re-arranging the rural deanries within the archdeaconry of Saint Asaph.

"Whereas, by the first recited Act, it is enacted, that in any case in which it shall appear upon the representation of the bishop of the diocese to be proper to divide any archdeaconry or rural deanry on account of the magnitude thereof, or of any other peculiar circumstances connected therewith, such archdeaconry or rural deanry may, by the authority therein provided, be divided into two or more portions, and each of such portions may be constituted a separate archdeaconry or rural deanry, as the case may be, and a district assigned thereto; provided always, that no such division shall be made without the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal:

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend William Bishop of Saint Asaph, that the rural deanries of Marchia, Rhos, Tegengle, and Bromfield, comprising the whole of the said archdeaconry of Saint Asaph, are now inconveniently large, and it appears to the said bishop and to us to be expedient and proper that such deanries should be divided as hereinafter mentioned:

therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said William Bishop of Saint Asaph, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that each of the said rural deanries of Marchia, Rhos, Tegengle, and Bromfield (upon the next avoidance thereof respectively, or at any previous time, upon the consent in writing of the rural deans thereof respectively, such consent to be published in the London Gazette, and to take effect on the fourteenth day next after such publication, unless such avoidance as aforesaid shall sooner happen) shall be divided into the several portions mentioned and set forth and set under the names of such deanries respectively in the schedule hereunto annexed, and that each of such portions shall be constituted a new rural deanry, and that such new rural deanries shall be named as the same are respectively named in the said schedule, and that each of such newly constituted deanries shall respectively consist of and contain the several parishes mentioned and set forth and set against and under the name of each of such newly constituted deanries as the same are respectively set forth in the said schedule.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the said recited Acts, or either of them.
