HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend "and render more effectual an Act, passed in the "last session of Parliament, for building, and "promoting the building, of additional churches "in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the second day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An "Act for building, and promoting the building, of "additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building. " and promoting the building, of additional churches "in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty/s reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, "Her Majesty's Commission for building new "churches," beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Burslem, in the county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient, that particular districts should be assigned to the consecrated churches or chapels of Saint Paul and Christ Church, severally situate in the said parish of Burslem, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render more " effectual an Act, passed in the last session of " Parliament, for building, and promoting the " building, of additional churches in populous " parishes;" and that such districts should be respectively named, "The Chapelry District of Saint Paul, Burslem," and "The Chapelry District of Christ Church, Cobridge," and that the boundaries thereof should be as follow:

" The chapelry district of Saint Paul, Burslem, is bounded on the east and south by proceeding, in a south easterly direction, along the middle of Williamson's-road, from the point where it enters the parish of Wolstanton, and terminates at the north eastern corner of Market-square; it then proceeds along the north western side of that square, in a south westerly direction, and enters Saint John's-square, down the middle of which square it turns, southerly, and then proceeds along the middle of Beeches-lane and Middleport, in a south westerly direction, and in a straight line from the end of Middleport to the parish of Wolstanton; and on the west and north by the said parish of Wolstanton, as shewn on the map, and thereon coloured yellow:

"The chapelry district of Christ Church, Cobridge, is to consist of the lordship of Abbey Hulton and the ville of Rushton Grange, and is bounded on the north by the parish of Norton in the Moors, the hamlet of Sneyd, and the township of Burslem and the parish of Wolstanton; on the south by the parish of Stoke-upon-Trent; and on the east by the township of Bagnall, in the parochial chapelry of Bucknall cum Bagnall, as shewn on the map, and thereon coloured pink:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said two chapels; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the respective Ministers thereof:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Lichfield has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the maps thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to should be assigned to the consecrated church or

order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignments be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

chapel, called Saint Luke's Church, at Pontnewynydd, in the said parish, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend "and render more effectual an Act, passed in the "last session of Parliament, for building, and pro-"moting the building, of additional churches in "populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Pontnewynydd," with boundaries as follow:

"The district is bounded on the north by Sychan-brook and Burgwm-brook; on the north west by the parish of Llanhilleth; on the south west, south, and south east, by the Frwd-brook; and on the east by the river Avon, or Afon Llwyd, as is more particularly delineated on the plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured red:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister thereof:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Llandaff has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and scaled this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision "for the spiritual care of populous parishes,' duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual "care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Saint Paul, Bristol, and Horfield, in the county of Gloucester, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next, after such copy shall have been so delivered or

transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or) and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

" And whereas the said parishes of Saint Paul and Horfield are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such parishes hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of such parts at present containing within their limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Henry Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Saint Paul, and also all that part of the said parish of Horfield, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, -all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,-shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, The District of Saint Andrew, Montpelier."

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

" And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of . such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion, and in such manner, as shall be approved by the like authority:

" And whereas a church or chapel has been provided, and offered for approval by us, and for consecration as the church or chapel of the said District of Saint Andrew, Montpelier, herein recommended to be constituted, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and we have satisfied ourselves that the said church or chapel is fit to be so approved and consecrated:

" And whereas certain of the principal contributors to the said church or chapel have, by an instrument in writing under their hands, nominated to us the Bishop of Głoucester and Bristol, for the time being, as the patron in perpetuity of the said district:

"We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of the said district of Saint Andrew, Montpelier, and, so soon as the same shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, the right of patronage thereof, and the numination of the minister or perpetual curate of such district or new parish, as the case may be, shall be wholly assigned to, and absolutely vested in, the said James Henry Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, and his successors Bishops of Gloucester and Bristol for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that .

recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliam nt.

" SCHEDULE.

"The District of SAINT ANDREW, MONTPELIER, being

" All that part of the parish of Saint Paul, Bristol, in the county of Gloucester, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, situate on the north of the parish of Saint James, Bristol, and the district of Saint Barnabas, in the said parish of Saint Paul; and such part of the parish of Horfield as is situate on the southern side of an imaginary line, extending towards the north east from the boundary of the parish of Westbury, in the said county and diocese, along the north western boundary of a certain field forming part of the Horfield Court Estate (marked α in the map or plan herewith), and adjoining another field, called "The Shoulder of Mutton Field," belonging to the Reverend Henry Richards (marked b as aforesaid), and continuing in the same direction along the north western and northern boundaries of such last-mentioned field, as far as the middle of the turnpike road from Bristol to Gloucester (marked c as aforesaid); and thence towards the north east along the middle of such road, as far as a certain stream or brook which forms part of the boundary between the said parishes of Saint Paul and Horfield (marked d as aforesaid); and thence towards the south east, along the middle of such stream, as far as the boundary of the said parish of Horfield."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such patrons and the incumbent of the parish of Horfield have consented to the said scheme; and one calendar month has expired since the draft thereof was so transmitted to the incumbent of the parish of Saint Paul, Bristol:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the two several registries of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, at Bristol and Gloucester.
