The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend an Act for the regulation of municipal corporations in England and Wales," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that if the inhabitant householders of any town or borough in England or Wales shall petition His Majesty to grant to them a charter of incorporation, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any such charter, if he shall think fit, by the advice of His Privy Council, to grant the same, to extend to the inhabitants of any such town or borough, within the district to be set forth in such charter, all the powers and provisions of the Act of the fifth and sixth of William the Fourth, cap. seventy-six, for regulating corporations, whether such town or borough be or be not a corporate town or borough, or be or be not named in either of the schedules to the said Act; provided, nevertheless, that notice of every such petition, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order that the same be taken in consideration by His Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, one month at least before such petition shall be so considered:

And whereas the inhabitant householders of the borough of Bradford, in the county of York, have presented a petition to Her Majesty, praying a charter of incorporation for the said borough; Her Majesty is this day pleased to order, and it is

hereby ordered, that the same be taken into consideration, by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on Monday the tenth day of March next.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for dividing and re-arranging the rural deaneries within the archdeaconry of Saint Asaph.

"Whereas, by the first recited Act, it is enacted, that in any case in which it shall appear

upon the representation of the bishop of the diocese to be proper to divide any archdeaconry or rural deanry on account of the magnitude thereof, or of any other peculiar circumstances connected therewith, such archdeaconry or rural deanry may, by the authority therein provided, be divided into two or more portions, and each of such portions may be constituted a separate archdeaconry or rural deanry, as the case may be, and a district assigned thereto; provided always, that no such division shall be made without the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal:

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend William Bishop of Saint Asaph, that the rural deaneries of Marchia, Rhos, Tegengle, and Bromfield, comprising the whole of the said archdeaconry of Saint Asaph, are now inconveniently large, and it appears to the said bishop and to us to be expedient and proper that such deaneries should be divided as hereinafter mentioned:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said William Bishop of Saint Asaph, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that each of the said rural deaneries of Marchia, Rhos, Tegengle, and Bromfield (upon the next avoidance thereof respectively, or at any previous time, upon the consent in writing of the rural deans thereof respectively, such consent to be published in the London Gazette, and to take effect on the fourteenth day next after such publication, unless such avoidance as aforesaid shall sooner happen) shall be divided into the several portions mentioned and set forth and set under the names of such deaneries respectively in the schedule hereunto annexed, and that each of such portions shall be constituted a new rural deanry, and that such new rural deaneries shall be named as the same are respectively named in the said schedule, and that each of such newly constituted deaneries shall respectively consist of and contain the several parishes, districts, and churches mentioned and set forth and set against and under the name of each of such newly constituted deaneries as the same are respectively set forth in the said schedule.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure,

relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the said recited Acts, or either of them.

sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to make better provision for " the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to explain and amend " an Act for making better provision for the " spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the tenth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred forty-four, in the words following, that is to say :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to make better provision for the spiritual care " of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to explain and amend an Act for " making better provision for the spiritual care " of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the district of Sneyd, in the county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield.

" Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licenced to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said first-recited Act; and that any portion of any such separate district which, by any such alteration as aforesaid, shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district, as shall be determined by the like authority :

" And whereas the said district of Sneyd was duly constituted, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-third day of May last, and since duly gazetted :

" And whereas it has since been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such district should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned :

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the bounds of the said district shall be altered as follows; that is to say, that, instead of the imagi-

nary line described in the schedule to the scheme hereinbefore mentioned, and forming the western boundary thereof, such district shall be bounded, on the western side thereof, by an imaginary line extending southward, from the north western corner of the hamlet of Sneyd (marked *a* in the map or plan hereunto annexed), along the western boundary of such hamlet as far as the watercourse referred to in the said schedule to the said scheme (marked *b* as aforesaid); and thence in the same direction along the middle of Mr. Williamson's colliery road, also referred to in the said schedule, as far as Greenhead (marked *c* as aforesaid); and thence through Wedgewood-place, leaving the shambles on the west, along the middle of the turnpike road from Burslem to Cobridge, to a point opposite to the middle of Nile-street (marked *d* as aforesaid); and thence towards the south east along the middle of such street, and the road through Holehouse and Flash, being the old turnpike road from Burslem to Cobridge, as far as the brook course, forming the boundary between the township of Burslem and the ville of Rushton Grange (marked *e* as aforesaid); and thence eastward along the northern bank of such brook, as far as the boundary of the said hamlet of Sneyd.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the portion of the said district which, by reason of the alteration hereinbefore recommended and proposed, shall become and be detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to and form part of the said parish of Burslem.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish out of which the district, the bounds of which are therein recommended to be altered, has been taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts; and such patron has consented to the said scheme; and one calendar month has expired since the draft thereof was so transmitted to the said incumbent:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield.

Taff-Vale Railway.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is
intended to be made to Parliament in the
ensuing session, for an Act to alter, amend, extend,
repeal, or enlarge certain of the powers and provi-
sions of the following Acts of Parliament, relating
to the Taff-vale Railway, or some of them, that is
to say; an Act, passed in the sixth year of the
reign of His late Majesty King William the
Fourth, intituled "An Act for making a railway
from Merthyr Tydfil to Cardiff, to be called 'The
Taff-vale Railway, with branches,'" another Act,
passed in the first year of the reign of Her present
Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to
enable the Taff-vale Railway Company to alter
the line of the said railway, and the Act relating
thereto, and to make additional branches;" another
Act, passed in the third and fourth years of the
same reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts
relating to the Taff-vale Railway;" and an Act,
passed in the seventh and eighth years of the same
reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts
relating to the Taff-vale Railway, to authorize the
alteration of certain works thereby authorized, and
the formation of additional works, and to enlarge
the powers of the company."

And it is further intended, by the said proposed
Act, to enable the said Taff-vale Railway Com-
pany to make and maintain a branch railway, di-
verging from and out of the main line of such
railway, with all proper works and conveniences
connected therewith, commencing at or near a
certain bridge belonging to the Taff-vale Railway,
and passing over the turnpike road between Car-
diff and Newport, within the parish of Saint John
the Baptist, Cardiff, in the county of Glamorgan,
and terminating at or near the Bute Docks, in the
parish of Saint Mary, Cardiff, in the said county of
Glamorgan.

And it is further intended, by the said Act,
to take powers for the compulsory purchase of
lands, houses, and property, and to enable the said
company to levy tolls, rates, and duties in respect
of the use of the said intended branch railway, and
the conveniences connected therewith; and also in
respect of any works which they may be authorized
to make by consent of land owners, or otherwise,
under the powers of the said recited Acts, or either
of them, or of the said intended Act; and to confer,
vary, and extinguish all rights and privileges
which would impede or interfere with the objects
aforesaid; and to confer other rights and privi-
leges.

And it is further intended, by the said Act, to
enable the said company to purchase or lease by
agreement with the Most Noble the Marquis of
Bute, the ship canal, dock, basins, and other works
connected therewith, belonging to the said Mar-
quis, at the port of Cardiff, commonly called or
known as the Bute Ship Canal, or any part or
parts thereof, or to confirm and carry out such
agreement as may be, or may have been, entered
into between the said company and the said Mar-
quis in relation to the said docks and other works;
and to levy and raise rates, tolls, and duties, in
respect of the use thereof; and, for the purposes
aforesaid, to amend, alter, or repeal, so far as may be
necessary, the powers and provisions of the follow-
ing Acts of Parliament relating the said Bute Ship
Canal, that is to say; an Act, passed in the first
year of the reign of His late Majesty King
William the Fourth; and another Act, passed in
the fourth year of the reign of His said Majesty;
and to reduce, alter, and vary the rates and tolls
authorized to be taken by the said last-recited
Acts, or either of them.

And, by the said intended Act, it is further
proposed to take power to abandon part of
the undertaking of the said Taff-vale Railway
as authorized to be made by the said recited
Acts, or one of them, within the parishes
of Radir, Whitechurch, Llandaff, Leckwith,
Llandough, and Penarth, in the county of Gla-
morgan, and to resell all such lands as may
have been purchased by the said company for the
purposes of those parts of the said undertaking
which may be so abandoned.
