ORDERS for the Court's going into Mourning on Sunday next the 9th instant, for Her late Imperial Highness the Duchess of Nassau, Niece of His Majesty the Emperor of Russia, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk, fringed or plain linen, white gloves, necklaces and ear-rings, black or white shoes, fans and tippets.

The Gentlemen to wear black, full trimmed, fringed or plain linen, black swords and buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning on Thursday, the 13th instant, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords and buckles.

And on Monday the 17th instant, the Court to go out of Mourning.

Buckingham-Palace, February 4, 1845.

THIS day Her Majesty, accompanied by His Royal Highness Prince Albert, proceeded in state from Buckingham-Palace to the House of Peers, where she arrived soon after two o'clock; and was received, on alighting from her state coach, by the Lord Chancellor, the Lord President of the Council, the Lord Privy Seal, Sir Augustus Clifford, Bart. C. B. Deputy Great Chamberlain (in the absence of the Lord Willoughby d'Eresby), the Earl Marshal, the Lord Steward of the Household, the Duke of Wellington, Garter King of Arms, and the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod and proceeded to the robing-room in the customary manner.

Her Majesty was there robed, and the procession moved into the House in the usual order;—the sword of state was borne by the Duke of Wellington, and the cap of maintenance by the Marquess of Winchester.

Her Majesty being seated on the Throne, and His Royal Highness Prince Albert on a Chair on the left side of the Cloth of Estate, the Great

Officers of State and others standing on the right and left, James Pulman, Esq. Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a message from Her Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, Her Majesty was pleased to deliver the following most gracious Speech to both Houses of Parliament:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I REJOICE that I am enabled, on again meeting you in Parliament, to congratulate you on the improved condition of the country.

Increased activity pervades almost every branch of manufacture; trade and commerce have been extended at home and abroad; and among al¹ classes of my people there is generally prevalent a spirit of loyalty and cheerful obedience to the law.

I continue to receive from all Foreign Powers and States assurances of their friendly disposition.

I have had much satisfaction in receiving at my Court the Sovereigns who in the course of the last year visited this country.

The journey of the Emperor of Russia, undertaken at a great sacrifice of private convenience, was a proof of the friendship of His Imperial Majesty most acceptable to my feelings.

The opportunity of personal intercourse thus afforded to me may, I hope, be the means of still further improving those amicable relations which have long existed between Great Britain and Russia.

The visit of the King of the French was rendered especially welcome to me, inasmuch as it had been preceded by discussions which might have impaired the good understanding happily established between the two countries.

I regard the maintenance of this good understanding as essential to the best interests of both; and I rejoiced to witness that the sentiments so cordially expressed by all classes of my subjects on the occasion of His Majesty's visit were entirely in unison with my own.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

The estimates for the ensuing year have been prepared, and will forthwith be laid before you. The progress of steam navigation, and the demands for protection to the extended commerce of the country, will occasion an increase in the estimates connected with the Naval Service.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I have observed, with sincere satisfaction, that the improvement which is manifest in other parts of the country has extended to Ireland.

The political agitation and excitement which I have had heretofore occasion to lament appear to have gradually abated, and, as a natural result, private capital has been more freely applied to useful public enterprizes, undertaken through the friendly co-operation of individuals interested in the welfare of Ireland.

I have carried into effect, in the spirit in which it was conceived, the Act for the more effectual application of charitable donations and bequests.

I recommend to your favourable consideration the policy of improving and extending the opportunities for academical education in Ireland.

The report of the Commission appointed to inquire into the law and practice in respect to the occupation of land is nearly prepared, and shall be communicated to you immediately after its presentation.

The state of the law in regard to the privileges of the Bank of Ireland, and to other banking establishments in that country, and in Scotland, will no doubt occupy your attention.

The health of the inhabitants of large towns and populous districts in this part of the United Kingdom has been the subject of recent inquiry before a Commission, the report of which shall be immediately laid before you.

It will be highly gratifying to me if the information and suggestions contained in that report shall enable you to devise the means of promoting the health and comfort of the poorer classes of my subjects.

I congratulate you on the success of the measures which three years since were adopted by Parliament for the purpose of supplying the deficiency in the public revenue, and arresting the accumulation of debt in the time of peace.

The Act which was passed at that time for imposing a tax upon income will shortly expire. It will be for you, in your wisdom, to determine whether it may not be expedient to continue its operation for a further period, and thus to obtain the means of adequately providing for the public service, and at the same time of making a reduction in other taxation.

Whatever may be the result of your deliberations in this respect, I feel assured that it will be your determination to maintain an amount of revenue amply sufficient to meet the necessary expenditure of the country, and firmly to uphold that public credit which is indispensible to the national welfare.

The prospect of continued peace, and the general state of domestic prosperity and tranquillity, afford a favourable opportunity for the consideration of the important matters to which I have directed your attention; and I commit them to your deliberation, with the earnest prayer that you may be enabled, under the superintending care and protection of Divine Providence, to strengthen the feelings of mutual confidence and good will between different classes of my subjects, and to improve the condition of my people.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, bearing date the third day of September last past, reciting, that, by an Order in Council, dated the

fourth day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, reciting therein, among other things, an Act, passed in the sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to " provide for the regulation of municipal cor-" porations in England and Wales;" and further reciting, that Nathaniel Richard Clarke, Esq. and Richard Wildman, Esq. the barristers appointed pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, to revise the burgess' and councillors' list of the city of Lincoln, in the then present year (the said city of Lincoln being one of the boroughs included in schedule A), did, within sixty days after the passing of the said Act, in due manner, determine and set out the extent, limits, and boundary lines of the wards of the said borough, according to the provisions of the said Act, and what portion of the said borough should be included therein respectively; and the said barristers, after the division of such borough into such number of wards as is directed by the said Act, and within the said period of sixty days, did, in due manner, apportion among the several wards of such borough the number of councillors mentioned in conjunction with the name of such borough in the said schedule, and the said barristers had duly transmitted a copy of the particulars of the number of councillors so assigned to the several wards of the said borough to one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in the words following, that was to say :

" City of Lincoln.

"We, Nathaniel Richard Clarke and Richard Wildman, being the barristers appointed by virtue of the Statute of the fifth and sixth of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to provide for the "regulation of municipal corporations in England and Wales," to revise the lists of the citizens of the city of Lincoln, do, by virtue of such appointment, hereby divide the said city into two wards, to be called the Minster Ward and Bridge Ward, respectively, and do hereby determine and set out the extent, limit, and boundary lines of the said wards, and the portions of the said city to be included therein, respectively, as follows, that is to say:

" The Minster Ward shall comprise and consist of the parishes and places under mentioned, that is to say, Saint John, Newport; Saint Nicholas; Saint Paul; Saint Mary Magdalene; Saint Margaret, with the Palace-precinct; Saint Peter, in Eastgate; Saint Michael; and Saint Martin :

" And the said ward, to be called the Bridge Ward, shall consist of the parishes and places under mentioned, that is to say, Saint Peter, at Arches; Saint Swithin; the Liberty of the Monks; Saint Benedict; Saint Mary le Wigford; Saint Mark; Saint Peter, at Gowts; and Saint Botolph; and we do hereby apportion nine councillors to each of the said wards; and further reciting, that the division and assignment so made by the said barristers appeared to be, in certain particulars, liable to objection; therefore His Majesty, by advice of His Privy Council, did thereby disapprove of such determination of the said barristers, and of the number of councillors so assigned to each ward of the said city; but, nevertheless, His Majesty, by the advice aforesaid, did order that the particulars of the divison and assignment so made by the said barristers should be published in the London Gazette, in order that such force and validity might be given thereto as is authorised and directed by the said Act. And such first-mentioned Orler further recited, that it was deemed expedient to remove the objection which existed to the said division and assignment so made by the said barristers, who were thereupon directed to determine and set out afresh the extent, limits, and boundary lines of the said wards into which it is provided by the said Act that certain boroughs should be divided, and especially as to the said city of Lincoln; and further reciting, that the said Nathaniel Richard Clarke and Richard Wildman, the said barristers appointed in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, had determined and set out afresh the extent, limits, and boundary lines of the several wards into which it was expedient that the said city of Lincoln should be divided, and the town councillors thereof; and the said barristers had duly transmitted a report of the particulars of the number of councillors so reassigned to the several wards, in the words following:

"We, Nathaniel Richard Clarke and Richard Wildman, being the barristers appointed by virtue of the Statute of the fifth and sixth of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled 'An 'Act to provide for the regulation of the municipal corporations in England and Wales,' to revise the list of eitizens of the city of Lincoln, having, by virtue of such appointment, divided the said city into two wards, and such division not having been approved of by His said late Majesty, and we having been duly required further to consider and inquire into the circumstances, do, upon such further inquiry and consideration, humbly report to Her Majesty the Queen, that it will be expedient to divide, and we do, therefore, hereby divide, the said city into three wards, to be called the Upper Ward, the Middle Ward, and the Lower Ward, respectively, and do hereby determine and set out the extent, limits, and boundary lines of the said wards, and the portion of the said city to be included therein respectively, as follows, that is to say:

"The Upper Ward to consist of the parishes of Saint Paul; Saint Mary Magdalene; and Saint Margaret, with the Palace-precinct, in the Bail and Close; and Saint John, in Newport; Saint Nicholas, in Newport; Saint Peter, in Eastgate; and Saint Michael:

"And the Middle Ward to consist of the parishes of Saint Martin, Saint Swithin, and the liberty of the Monks :

"And the Lower Ward to consist of the parishes of Saint Peter, at Arches; Saint Benedict; Saint Mary le Wigford; Saint Mark; Saint Peter, at Gowts; and Saint Botolph :

" And we do hereby apportion six councillors to each of the said wards :

"And we recommend the under-mentioned councillors to be assigned to the under-mentioned wards, respectively, that is to say, John East, Joseph George Doughty, Thomas Newton, Charles Ward, Henry Williams, and Robert Swan, to the Upper Ward; John Sharpe, William Parry, Robert Dawber, Michael Penistan, William Marshall, Edward William Rudgard Rudgard, to the Middle Ward; and Thomas Michael Keyworth, Richard Sutton Harvey, Richard Whitton, John Key, George Calder, and Anselm Odling, to the Lower Ward :

"As witness our hands this thirty-first day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-four,

And Her Majesty, by the advice of Her Privy Council, did thereby approve of the proposed alteration and re-division of the said wards, and of the number of councillors re-assigned to each, respectively, as set forth and recommended in the last above-mentioned report of the said barristers, and did order the same to be published in the London Gazette accordingly.

And whereas by a further Order in Council, bearing date the seventh day of October last, whereby it was ordered, that the last hereinbeforerecited Order, of the third day of September last, should be revoked and annulled, and which Order of revocation was published in the London Gazette; and whereas it hath been deemed expedient, that the said report of the said barristers should be, and the same hath been, duly referred again to them for reconsideration, and the said barristers have transmitted a report in the words and figures following :

" We, Nathaniel Richard Clarke and Richard Wildman, being the barristers appointed by virtue of the Statute of the fifth and sixth of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled " An Act to provide for the regulation of " municipal corporations in England and Wales," to revise the lists of citizens of the city of Lincoln having, by virtue of such appointment, divided the said city into two wards, and such division not having been approved of by His said late Majesty, and we having been duly required further to consider and enquire into the circumstances, do, upon such further enquiry and consideration, humbly report to Her Majesty the Queen, that it will be expedient to divide, and we do, therefore, hereby divide, the said city into three wards, to be called the Upper Ward, the Middle Ward, and the Lower Ward, respectively, and do hereby determine and set out the extent, limits, and boundary lines of the said wards, and the portions of the said city to be included therein respectively as follows, that is to say, the Upper Ward to consist of the parishes of Saint Paul; Saint Mary Magdalen; and Saint Margaret, with the Palace-precinct, in the Bail and Close; and Saint John, in Newport; Saint Nicholas, in Newport; Saint Peter, in Eastgate; and Saint Michael; and the Middle Ward to consist of the parishes of Saint Martin, Saint Swithin, and the liberty of the Monks; and the Lower Ward to consist of the parishes of Saint Peter, at Arches; Saint Benedict; Saint Mary le Wigford; Saint Mark; Saint Peter, at Gowts; and Saint Botolph;

and we do hereby apportion six councillors to each of the said wards; and we recommend that, on the twenty-eighth day of February next, the undermentioned councillors be assigned to the undermentioned wards, respectively, that is to say, Charles Ward, Robert Dawber, Henry Williams; Robert Swan, Richard Carline, and Thomas Michael Keyworth, to the Upper Ward; Michael Penistan, Thomas Newton, Edward William Rudgard Rudgard, William Marshall, John Shaw, and William Cook Norton, to the Middle Ward; and Richard Whitton, William Andrew, Anselm Odling, George Calder, Richard Sutton Harvey; and John Richard Battle, to the Lower Ward.

"We approve and adopt this report as now amended.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building | new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act; passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An " Act for building, and promoting the building, of " additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, " and promoting the building, of additional churches "in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, " Her Majesty's Commission for building new " churches," beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Hope, in the county of Flint and diocese of Saint Asaph, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church or chapel of Saint Michael, at Llannfynydd, in the said parish, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and " render more effectual an Act, passed in the " last session of Parliament, for building, and " promoting the building, of additional churches " in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, " The Chapelry District of Llannfynydd," and should consist of the townships of Uwch-y-mynydd uchaf and Uwch-y-mynydd isaf, and part of the township of Cymmau, with boundaries as follow :

"The district is bounded on the north by the parishes of Mold and Tryddyn; on the west by the parish of Llandegla; on the south by the parish of Wrexham, and the remaining part of the township of Cymmau, from which it is separated by a line commencing at the point where the parish of Wrexham and the township of Cymmau meet; and proceeding from thence along the middle of Fordd-las-road, in an easterly direction, as far as Strytgarregog-road, up the middle of which road it proceeds northerly as far the boundary of the said township of Cymmau; it then turns easterly along the boundary of that township as far as the township of Rhanberfedd, which township forms the eastern boundary of the

district, as more particularly shewn on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow : "That banns of marriage should be published, and marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister thereof:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Saint Asaph has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

"The chapelry district of Hale is bounded on the north by the parishes of Crondall and Aldershot; on the east by the parish of Seal; on the west and south by an imaginary line, commencing from the intersection of the Odiham-road with the boundary of the said parish of Crondall, and extending along the high road to Farnham as far as Lawday-house, then diverging southerly from the road, so as to include the said house; thence proceeding easterly, and reaching the said road and again following its course as far as Hoghatch and the Folly-house, again diverging from the road so as to include that house; then passing

along the north and east side of Farnham-park, and having passed to the south, reaching down into the Guildford-road, about sixty yards westward of its point of junction with the Farnborough-road; then taking the direction of the Guildford-road, and passing southward by the first lane down to the river Wey, and along the river to the waste stream and into the Moor-park-road; then up Little's-road, into the Guildford-road, the course of which it follows till it reaches Godalmingbars, passing down which it terminates at the said parish of Seal, as the same is more particularly shewn in the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Richard Lord Bishop of Winchester has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, churchings, baptisms, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
