AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 3d day of *February* 1845,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, relating to the endowment of the archdeaconry of Carmarthen, in the diocese of Saint David's.

"Whereas it was by the first-recited Act enacted, that any archdeaconry might, subject to the consent of the bishop, be endowed, amongst other modes, out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, but not so as to raise the average

annual income thereof to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds; provided that no archdeacon should be entitled to hold any endowment, or augmentation or other emolument, as such archdeacon, under the provisions of the same Act, unless resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry should be situate, or as to any archdeacon then existing within the diocese in which his archdeaconry was situate before the passing of the said Act but subject to the same provisions as to licences for non-residence which are enacted with respect to incumbents of benefices by the Act relating to pluralities and residence in the same Act mentioned; and it was by the said recited Act further enacted, that, upon any endowment of an archdeaconry being made, under the provisions thereof, all lands, tithes, and other hereditaments (except any right of patronage) belonging to such archdeaconry at the time of such endowment, might, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, and of any archdeacon in possession at the time of the passing of the same Act, and by the authority therein provided, be vested in us for the purposes of the said Act:

"And whereas the chief present endowment of the said archdeaconry of Carmarthen consists of certain lands, tithes, and hereditaments, in Wales, now demised upon a lease or leases for lives, with small reserved rents, the said land, tithes, and hereditaments, forming the corps of the prebend or canonry of Llanrian, in the said cathedral church of Saint David's:

"And whereas the Venerable Richard Venables

was, at the time of the passing of the said recited Act, and now is, Archdeacon of the said archdeaconry of Carmarthen :

" We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Connop Bishop of Saint David's, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that, until arrangements for annexing a canonry residentiary in the said cathedral church of Saint David's to the said archdeaconry of Carmarthen shall have been recommended and proposed, and ratified by your Majesty in Council, under the provisions of the said recited Act, and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for regulating the cathedral churches " of Wales," the said archdeaconry of Carmarthen shall be endowed by augmentation out of the common fund in the said first-recited Act mentioned, in the manner hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, there shall be paid by us, to the said Richard Venables, Archdeacon of Carmarthen, and his successors in the said archdeaconry, so long as he or they shall respectively hold the said archdeaconry, and shall duly reside as aforesaid, the annual sum of one hundred and eighty pounds, on the first day of January in every year; and every such whole yearly payment shall be made only on production to us of a certificate, under the hand of the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese, that such Archdeacon has duly resided during the preceding year, and a proportionate part of the first such yearly payment, calculated from the day of the date of this scheme, shall be made on the first day of January next ensuing; and whenever a vacancy in the said archdeaconry shall happen on any other day than the first day of January, the then next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between and to the Archdeacon making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the Archdeacon succeeding to such archdeaconry.

" And we further recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Richard Venables, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all lands, tithes, and hereditaments, at any time heretofore annexed to, and now forming part of, the endowment of the said archdeaconry of Carmarthen shall forthwith be disannexed therefrom, and shall be absolutely transferred to and vested in us for the purposes of the said Act.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been

duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Saint David's.

St. James's-Palace, March 12, 1845.

A CHAPTER of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle having been summoned for this day, the following Knights Brethren, in their mantles and collars, assembled in the Entrée-room, viz. the Earl of Aberdeen, the Earl of Rosebery, and the Earl of Mansfield, attended by the under-named Officers of the Order, in their mantles, and wearing their chains and badges, viz. Albert-William Woods, Esq. (Lancaster Herald), Deputy to Sir John-Stewart Richardson, Bart. Secretary of the Order, and Frederic Peel Round, Esq. Gentleman Usher of the Green Rod.

At three o'clock the Knights Brethren were called over by the Deputy Secretary, when (Her Majesty and His Royal Highness the Prince Albert being in the Throne-room) they proceeded into the presence of the Sovereign, attended by the Officers of the Order.

The Sovereign, being seated in the chair of state, and the Prince Albert at the table, on the right hand of the Queen, Her Majesty was pleased to command the other Knights Brethren to take their seats at the table, according to their seniority in the Order, the Officers of the Order standing in their places, at the bottom of the table.

The Sovereign was then pleased to signify Her royal pleasure touching the election of a Knight into the Order, whereupon the Knights Brethren proceeded to the election; and the suffrages having been collected by the Deputy Secretary (commencing with the Junior Knight) were by him, kneeling, presented to the Sovereign, who was pleased to declare that the Most Noble James Duke of Montrose had been duly elected a Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle.

Then, by command of the Sovereign, the Duke of Montrose was received at the door of the Chapter-room by the two Junior Knights present, and conducted by the Deputy Secretary, bearing, on a crimson velvet cushion, the ensigns of the Order, and by the Usher of the Green Rod.

The sword of state being thereupon delivered to the Sovereign by His Royal Highness the Prince Albert, the Senior Knight, the Duke of Montrose, kneeling near the Sovereign, was knighted therewith; after which his Grace had the honour to kiss Her Majesty's hand; the Duke of Montrose, rising, the oath was administered to his Grace by the Deputy Secretary.

The Duke then, again kneeling, and the Deputy Secretary, on his knee, presenting to Her Majesty the ribband and jewel of the Order, the Queen was graciously pleased to place the same over the Duke's left shoulder.

His Grace, having again kissed the Sovereign's hand, received the congratulations of the Knights Brethren; withdrew.

The Chapter being ended, the Knights Brethren were, by command of the Sovereign, again called over by the Deputy Secretary, and, with the Officers of the Order, retired from the presence of the Sovereign, with the usual reverences.
