REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S
LEVEE, AT ST. JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two cards, with their names thereon written, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them (not the Lord in Waiting), should be sent to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, before twelve o'clock, on the Monday previous to the Levee, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command,

that no presentation shall hereafter be made at the Levee, but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that Gentlemen, who are to be presented at the Levee, will have their names *distinctly* written upon the card to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, in order that there may be no mistake in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half past one o'clock.

Notice is hereby given, that all persons, having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levee, are to write on two cards, with their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come; one card to be delivered to the Page in the Ante-room, and the other to the Lord in Waiting, who will read its contents, at the time of presentation, to Her Majesty; and, on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.

And whereas also a treaty was, at the time of the passing of the said Act, and still is, subsisting between Her Majesty and the State of Venezuela, which was signed on the twenty-ninth day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, adopting and confirming certain articles and provisions therein mentioned or referred to, amongst which was an agreement, that no other or higher duties should be charged on the importation of any articles, the growth, produce, or manufacture of one country, into the territories or dominions of the other, than such as were or might be payable on the importation of the like articles, being the growth, produce, or manufacture of any other foreign country :

And whereas also a treaty was, at the time of the passing of the said Act, and still is, subsisting between Her Majesty and the United States of Mexico, which was signed on the twenty-sixth day of December one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, containing, among other things, an agreement, that no other or higher duties should be charged on the importation into the dominions of His Britannic Majesty of any article of the growth, produce, or manufacture of Mexico, than were or might be payable on the like articles, being the growth, produce, or manufacture of any other foreign country :

And whereas application has been made on the part of the Government of the said United States of America, the State of Venezuela, and the United States of Mexico, respectively, claiming, under the said treaties, the admission of sugars, the growth of the United States of America, the State of Venezuela, and the United States of Mexico, respectively, at the said respective duties of one pound eight shillings and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that, from and after the twenty-eighth day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, brown, Muscovado, or clayed sugars (not being refined), the growth of the United States of America, or of the State of Venezuela, or of the United States of Mexico, shall, if imported from the country of their growth or from any British possession abroad,

having been imported into such British possession from the country of their growth, be admitted to entry for consumption into the United Kingdom, at the aforesaid respective rates of duty of one pound eight shillings and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight, respectively; subject, nevertheless, to the production of the like certificates, and the making of the like declaration, as are in the said Act required with respect to sugars, the growth of China, Java, or Manilla:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions accordingly.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend " and render more effectual an Act, passed in the " last session of Parliament, for building, and " promoting the building, of additional churches " in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifth day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say :

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An " Act for building, and promoting the building, of " additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled " An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional " churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to prolong, " for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for " building new churches;" beg leave humbly to

represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Saint Michael, in the city and diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient, that particular districts should be assigned to the consecrated churches or chapels of Saint John at Wall, and Christ Church at Burntwood, in the said parish, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such districts should be named, respectively, "The Chapelry District of Burntwood," and "The Chapelry District of Wall," with boundaries as follows:

"The boundary of the chapelry district of Burntwood commences at the bottom of a lane adjoining Wall Chapelry District (leading from Pipe-marsh, in a north easterly direction, by a house called Pipe-grange), to a gate leading to the inclosed lands on the Pipe-hall Farm; and from thence turning off, in an easterly and south easterly direction, to the centre of a small plantation adjoining a sheet of water in Maple-hayes-lawn, down which plantation it extends to nearly the bottom, and then turns off in an easterly direction, crossing two meadows, till it reaches the water by Leamonsley-mill, through which it passes, and then, in a northern direction, passing through the water again, and taking in Leamonsley-mill, it keeps the boundary fence between Burntwood township and Saint Chad's parish, Lichfield, till it reaches the intakes adjoining the London and Liverpool turnpike road, which it leaves out, and comes into the turnpike road (opposite a certain lane called Featherbed-lane, leading to Uttoxeter) along which turnpike road it proceeds, in a north westerly direction, till it joins the boundary of Longdon parish, which it keeps for the length of one field, and then proceeds in a southerly direction along the boundary lines of the parishes of Farewell and Chorley, until it enters the township of Elmhurst, in the said parish of Saint Chad, along which boundary it proceeds, in a southerly, westerly, and north westerly direction, till it again enters the said parish of Chorley, the boundary of which it keeps till it joins the said

parish of Longdon, along the boundary of which it extends by Longdon-common to Coney-mill, and then includes a certain tract of common land adjoining Cannock-chase (called Burntwood-common), marked by metes and stones (which includes a piece of inclosed land near the Norton Reservoir, and another piece, with a house called Coney-lodge), and there, taking the boundary of the common, joins the boundary of the township of Hammerwick, and extends along the boundary of such township, in a south easterly direction, to the boundary of Wall Chapel District, where it crosses fields to the gate at Broad-lane, and along Broad-lane, crossing the Ediall-road, along Pipe-marsh to the Pipe-grange-lane, from where the boundary commenced, as is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured blue:

"The boundary of the chapelry district of Wall commences at Muckley-corner Public-house, proceeds in a south westerly direction along the boundary of the extra parochial place of Ogle Hay, crosses the Wyrley and Essington Canal, keeping the boundary of Ogle Hay, down a certain road called Red Gap-road; and from thence, in a north easterly direction, along the boundary fence between Wall township and Shenstone parish (including a piece of waste land called Wall-butts) till it reaches the Watling-street-road, along which it proceeds by Wall, crossing the Birmingham and Lichfield turnpike road till it reaches the Hill-hall Farm-gate on the boundary of Swinfen township, when it proceeds along a fence, in a north westerly direction, for the length of one field, when it leaves the Swinfen boundary and takes the boundary of Saint Michael's parish, Lichfield, in the same direction, till it gets to a certain old road called the Icknield-street-road, along which it proceeds till it reaches the Birmingham and Lichfield turnpike road, and from thence (still keeping the boundary of Saint Michael's parish), along a fence till it reaches an old lane, now disused, formerly part of the Icknield-street-road, where it keeps along the Saint Michael's boundary, in a north westerly direction, for some distance, and then turns short off, in a circuitous direction, along one fence, and through three fields, till it reaches a road leading from Wall to Lichfield, which it crosses, in a north westerly direction, passing through the ground near Aldershaw-house till it reaches a certain field

called the Conduit-meadow, where it takes the fence at the bottom, in the same direction, to the corner of the field, and then turns off in a northern direction till it reaches a certain road called Fosseyway, along which it extends in a north westerly direction till it reaches a certain piece of waste land called Pipe-marsh, opposite Fosseyway-house, where it proceeds in a northern direction, keeping the outside or eastern boundary of the marsh, which it includes, crossing the Lichfield and Walsall boundary turnpike road, till it reaches the bottom of a lane leading to a house called Pipe-grange, when, instead of proceeding up the lane, it keeps the outside boundary of the marsh, in a south easterly direction, till it reaches a lane leading to Ediall and Burntwood, up which it proceeds, in a north westerly direction, as far as a certain lane called Broad-lane, along which it extends till it reaches a gate leading to the inclosed lands, and then turns off, in a south easterly direction, for the length of two fields, when it extends in a southerly direction till it reaches the brook on the Hammerwick Broadway, along which it continues, in an easterly direction, crossing the Wyrley and Essington Canal, till it reaches the Lichfield and Walsall turnpike road, down which it extends till it reaches Muckley-corner, which is the point where the boundary commenced, as is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured red :

“ That banns of marriage should be published, and also that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said two chapels; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the respective Ministers of the said chapels :

“ That the consent of the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Lichfield has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said John Lord Bishop of Lichfield has signed and sealed this present instrument :

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

WHEREAS Her Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the fourth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty’s reign, intituled “ An Act concerning banns and marriages in “ certain district churches or chapels,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the nineteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say :

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend “ and render more effectual an Act, passed in the “ last session of Parliament, for building, and “ promoting the building, of additional churches “ in populous parishes,” a district was, by virtue of, and in conformity to, an Order of your Majesty in Council, dated the second day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, duly assigned to the church of Saint Paul, in Wilton-place, in the parish of Saint George, Hanoversquare, in the county of Middlesex and diocese of London :

“ That, since the date of the Order in Council, in consequence of the death of the Rector of the

said parish of Saint George, Hanover-square, the district which (before the said Order in Council) had been assigned to the church of Saint Peter, Pimlico, in the said parish of Saint George, Hanover-square, under the provisions of the twenty-first section of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," has become a district parish, and the said church of Saint Paul, in Wilton-place, is now a chapel of ease, with a district chapelry belonging thereto, to the said district parish church of Saint Peter, Pimlico :

"That the said Order in Council did not direct that marriages should be performed in the said church of Saint Paul :

"And your Majesty's Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the said district parish of Saint Peter, Pimlico, and the said church or chapel of Saint Paul, it appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be hereafter published, and that marriages should be hereafter performed in the said church of Saint Paul; and that a supplemental Order for that purpose should be made, pursuant to the provisions of the fourth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act concerning banns and marriages in certain district churches or chapels;" and that, until the next avoidance of the said district parish church of Saint Peter, Pimlico, the fees and emoluments to be received and taken for and in respect of the publication of banns of marriage, and the performance of marriages, in the said church of Saint Paul, should respectively belong to, and be divided in equal moieties between, the incumbent of the said district parish church of Saint Peter, Pimlico, and the Minister of the said church of Saint Paul; and that, from and after the next avoidance of the said district parish church of Saint Peter, Pimlico, the whole of the said fees and emoluments should be received by the Minister for the time being of the said church of Saint Paul, for his own use :

"That the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Lord Bishop of London has been obtained (as required by

the last-mentioned Act), that such banns of matrimony should be published, and that such marriages should be solemnized, and the fees so apportioned and assigned as aforesaid; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Therefore, your Majesty's said Commissioners humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the performance of marriages, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
