PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law respecting the "office of county coroner," it is enacted, that, when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the justices of any county that such county should be divided into two or more districts, for the purposes of that Act, or that any alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under that Act, it should be lawful for the said justices, in genera!

or quarter sessions assembled, to resolve that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying, that such division or alteration be made, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof should be given to the coroner or coroners of such county as thereinafter provided; and it is thereby further enacted, that the clerk of the peace should give notice of any such resolution to every coroner for such county, and of the time when the petition would be taken by the said justices into consideration, and the justices should confer with every such coroner who should attend the meeting of the justices for that purpose, touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employment, and such other circumstances as should appear to the justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of that Act; and such petition, with a description of the several proposed districts, and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the petition is founded, should be certified to Her Majesty, under the hands and seals of two or more of the justices present when such petition should be agreed to, and the clerk of the peace for such county should forthwith give

or send a true copy of such petition, certified under his hand, to every coroner for such county; cand it is further enacted, that it should be lawful "for Her Majesty, if she should think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition, and also any petition which might be presented to Her by any coroner of the same county; concerning such proposed division or alteration, or whenever it should seem fit to Her Majesty, to direct the issue of a writ de coronatore eligendo, for the purpose of authorising the election of an additional coroner above the number of those who had been thereto. fore customarily elected in such county, to order that such county should be divided into such and so many districts, for the purposes of that Act, as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and to determine at what place within each district; the court for the election of coroner for such district should be holden, as thereinafter provided; and every such Order should be published in the London Gazette:

And whereas the justices of the peace for the county of Stafford, assembled in general quarter sessions, did resolve, that an humble petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying for such division or alteration as thereinafter mentioned, and did adjourn the further consideration thereof, and the said justices had subsequently received the assent of the five coroners for the said county of Stafford, who had been duly served with the said petition; and whereas the said justices have presented their said petition to Her Majesty, representing,

"That there are five coroners now acting in and for the county of Stafford, elected and chosen as coroners of the said county, under the authority of an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to "regulate the election of coronors for counties," exclusive of three coroners elected and chosen for the several boroughs of Newcastle-under-Lyme, Buxton-upon-Trent, and Walsall; and the names, places of residence, and occupation of such five county coroners, are as follows, that is to say,

William Harding, of Burslem, attorney at law, John Cattlow, of Cheadle, attorney at law, William Webb Ward, of the borough of Stafford, attorney at law,

George Hinckliffe, of Westbromwich, attorney at law,

Thomas Moss Phillips, of Wolverhampton, attorney at law;

"That Her Majesty's petitioners consider it expedient, with a due regard to the state of the population, and with a view of decreasing the expence of coroners travelling to inquests and freeholders travelling to elections, and to enable parish officers, in case of death, to know the coroner to whom notice is to be given, that the county of Stafford be divided into five districts, under the authority and provisions of an act of Parliament, made and passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the "law respecting the office of county coroner;"

"That, by the provisions of the last-mentioned Act of Parliament, the parish of Dudley, in the county of Worcester, being surrounded by the county of Stafford, will become and form part of the last-mentioned county, for the purposes mentioned in the said Act of Parliament; and that it is expedient that the said parish of Dudley shall be and remain a separate and distinct district, called "No. 6, Dudley District," and be assigned to the coroner who, after the death, deprivation, or resignation of the present coroner, shall be appointed for that district; and that all elections of a coroner for such last-mentioned district, as well as the poll, be taken at the town of Dudley;

"That Her Majesty's said petitioners caused notice of the said petition to be given to the said William Harding, John Cattlow, William Webb Ward, George Hinchliffe, and Thomas Moss Phillips, by delivering a copy thereof to each of them, duly certified under the hand of the clerk of the peace, and had adjourned the further consideration thereof; and had received the assent of the said William Harding, John Cattlow, William Webb Ward, George Hinchliffe, and Thomas Moss Phillips, to the proposed districts; and, therefore, praying Her Majesty to order and direct that the county of Stafford be divided into five districts, and that the parish of Dudley, in the county of Worcester, being stated to be surrounded by the county of Stafford, would become and form part of the last-mentioned county, for the purposes mentioned in the said Act of Parliament, and that the same should form a sixth district, for the purposes before-mentioned; and that Her Majesty would be pleased to make such further and other order in the premises, as to Her Majesty should seem meet;"

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said petition into consideration, doth, pursuant to the said Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her reign, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, declare, order, and direct, that such county and the said parish of Dudley shall be divided into six districts, for the purposes of the said Act, to be called by the several and respective names following, that is to say, No. 1, to be called the "Hanley District;" No. 2, to be called the "Uttoxeter District;" No. 3, to be called the "Stafford District;" No. 4, to be called the "Westbromwich District;" No. 5, to be called the "Wolverhampton District;" and No. 6, to be called the "Dudley District;" and it is hereby further declared, ordered, directed, and determined, that the courts to be holden for the purpose of the election of any coroner of any one or more of the said districts, respectively, when and as the same shall become necessary under the provisions of the said recited Act, shall be as follows, that is to say, for No. 1, the Hanley district, to be holden at Hanley aforesaid, and the poll taken there, and also at the following places, that is to say, Newcastle-under-Lyme, Leek, Longton; for No. 2, Uttoxeter district, to be holden at Uttoxeter, and the poll taken there, and also at

Burton-upon-Trent and Cheadle; for No. 3, Stafford district, to be holden at Stafford, and the poll taken there, and also at Abbott's Bromley, Eccleshall, Lichfield, Penkridge, Rugeley, and Stone; for No. 4, Westbromwich district, to be holden at Westbromwich, and the poll to be taken there, and also at Handsworth, Tamworth, Tipton, Walsall, and Wednesbury; for No. 5, Wolverhampton district, to be holden at Wolverhampton, and the poll taken there, and at Bilston, Breewood, Kingswinford, and Sedgley; for No. 6, Dudley district, to be holden at Dudley, and the poll to be taken there; and it is hereby further declared, ordered, and directed, that this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
