HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for carrying into "effect the reports of the Commissioners ap-"pointed to consider the state of the Established "Church in England and Wales, with reference "to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as "they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of "the Commissioners appointed to consider the "state of the Established Church in England and "Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties "and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal "dioceses, revenues, and patronage," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making certain alterations in the archdeaconries of Bangor and Merioneth, in the diocese of Bangor.

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"Whereas by the said recited Act it is enacted, that the limits of existing archdeaconries may, by the authority therein mentioned, be newly arranged, so that every deanry may be within an archdeaconry, and that no archdeaconry extend beyond the limits of one diocese:

"And whereas it has been proposed to us, by the Right Reverend Christopher Bishop of Bangor, and it appears to us expedient, that the alterations hereinafter mentioned should be made in the said archdeaconries of Bangor and Merioneth:

"And whereas the deanry of Dyffryn Clwydd, in the county of Denbigh, but in the said diocese of Bangor, and the deanry of Arnstley, in the county of Montgomery, and in the same diocese, do not appear to be now included in any archdeaconry:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Christopher Bishop of Bangor, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the deanry of Llyn, now in the said archdeaconry of Bangor, shall be transferred therefrom, and that the same, and also the said two deanries of Dyffryn Clwydd and Arnstley, shall be included in and form part of the said archdeaconry of Merioneth, and that all churches and chapels, and the rural deans and all the clergy and others your Majesty's subjects within the said three deanries respectively, shall be under and subject to the jurisdiction, authority, and control of the archdeacon of Merioneth for the time being.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the said recited Act, or any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given to the said Archdeacon of Bangor and Archdeacon of Merioneth, respectively, and no objection has been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and HerMajesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bangor.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act" to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Bolton-le-Moors, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, | and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by: metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then-containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration; of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parish of Bolton-le-Moors is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship first day of November in each and every year.

and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion; that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Bolton-le-Moors described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, "The District of Tonge."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every. year, to the minister for the time being of the recommended to be constituted, district so when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensedby the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal halfyearly payments on the first day of May and the

and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

#### " SCHEDULE.

" The district of TONGE, being

"All that part of the parish of Bolton-le-Moors, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Chester, comprised within the hamlet of Tonge, such part of the township of Breightmet, in the same parish, as is situate on the southern side of an imaginary line along the middle of the lane called Red-lane, leading from Tonge to Bury, and such part of the township of Harwood, in the same parish, as is situate on the western side of Bradshaw Brook."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbent and patron have consented to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this

Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Chester.

An Act for making a railway from the Great Western Railway, at or near Reading, to the towns of Newbury and Hungerford, and also to join the South Western Railway, at or near Basingstoke.

An Act for the consolidation of the Yarmouth and Norwich and Norwich and Brandon Railway Companies, and for authorizing the construction of certain works, at Norwich, in connexion with

the Yarmouth and Norwich Railways.

An Act for making a railway from Shrewsbury, in the county of Salop, to Ruabon, in the county of Denbigh, to be called, "the Shrewsbury, Oswestry, and Chester Junction Railway.'
