AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 8th day of *August* 1845,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales;" duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parlia-

ment held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales;" have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for augmenting the income of a canonry in the cathedral church of Saint David's.

"Whereas it was by the said first-recited Act enacted, that there should be two canons residentiary only in the said cathedral church, and that so soon as conveniently might be, and by the authority therein provided, such annual sums should be determined on to be paid by us, and should be accordingly paid by us as, after due inquiry and calculation, should give to such respective canons an average annual income of three hundred and fifty pounds; and it was by the said secondly recited Act declared and enacted, that it should be lawful, by the authority in the last mentioned Act provided, to carry such purpose into effect by any mode of payment, contribution, augmentation, or endowment which might be deemed fit, as well as by the modes in the said Act specified:

"And whereas by the said thirdly-recited Act it was enacted, that the number of canons residentiary in the said cathedral church should be four, and that the average annual incomes of such canons should be of the same amounts

as were fixed by the said first-recited Act, and that the provisions of the same Act, and of the said herein secondly-recited Act, respecting the augmentation of the incomes of such canons, should be construed to authorize the augmentation of such incomes out of the common fund in the said first-recited Act mentioned:

“And whereas we have made the inquiry and calculation required by the said first-recited Act, so far as they are necessary for the purposes of this scheme:

“And whereas the number of canons residentiary in the said cathedral church, having been reduced below the number of four by the vacancy of a canonry on the twenty-second day of March last, the Reverend Edmund Melvill was soon afterwards collated thereto, and has accordingly become subject to the provisions of the said recited Acts relating to the residence of canons and otherwise; and whereas the lands, tenements, and hereditaments heretofore belonging to or held with the canonry to which he was so collated, have, by such vacancy thereof as aforesaid, become vested in us, and the only income accruing to him as a canon of the said cathedral church will be a share of the corporate revenues of the chapter thereof, amounting to the average annual sum of two hundred and five pounds:

“And whereas, besides the lands, tenements, and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, we are in receipt of the annual proceeds of one suspended canonry in the said cathedral church:

“We, therefore humbly recommend and propose, that in order to raise the income of the canonry so held by the said Edmund Melvill to the average annual sum of three hundred and fifty pounds as aforesaid, there shall be paid by us, out of the said common fund to the said Edmund Melvill and his successors in the said canonry for the time being the sum of one hundred and forty-five pounds, by equal half yearly payments, on the twenty-second day of March and the twenty-second day of September in each and every year, and that the first such payment shall be made on the twenty-second day of September next, and that whenever a vacancy in such canonry shall happen on any other day than either of such half yearly days of payment, the then next half yearly payment shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the canon causing the vacancy, or his representatives, and the canon succeeding to the canonry so becoming vacant:

“And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or to the augmentation of the incomes of any future canons of the said cathedral church, or to the annexation of any two canonries in the said cathedral church to two archdeaconries in the said diocese of Saint David's, in accordance with the provisions of the said recited Acts or Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Saint David's.
