## From Monday July 13. to Thursday July 16. 1685.

Barbadoes, April 29.

O soon as Sir Richard Dutton, His Majesties Governor of this Island, had received notice from the Privy-Council in England of the Death of the late King of ever Bieifed Memory, he immediately fummoned the Members of the Council to meet the day following; And upon the 23. which was St. Georges Day, His piefent Majesty was Proclaimed with great Solemnity and

Order, in the manner following.

First, the Officers of two Regiments of Foot, marching from Fontabell to the Town of St. Michael; Next the Officers of two Regiments of Horse; Next the Justices of the Peace; The Reverend Clergy; The Lawyers in their Gowns; the Master and Reguters of Chancery in their Gowns; the Kings Council at Law in their Gowns; the Judges in their Gowns; next his Majesties Council of this Island; After which march'd several Trumpets sounding; the Marshals of the several Courts and their Deputies, and the Provost Marshal General with his Men; Next his Excellency the Governor attended by the Kings Life-Guard of Horse; His Majesties Regiment Roy I of Foot Guards was drawn up in St. Michaels 1 own to receive his Excellency, and to perform their Dury in the more solemn Proclaiming His Majesty; Which being done in the place called Cheapside, his Excellency marcht from thence to Fames-Fort, where the Guns in that and all other Forts, Platforms, Lines and Bitteries in Carlifle-Bay were fired three times over with great Shouts and Acclamations, the Lke being done by His Majesties Ship the Diamond, and all the Merchants Ships in that Bay, the Ceremony ending with the Drinking of all the Royal Healths, there being plenty of Wine provided for that purpose both in the Town and Fort, where for want of Conduits, the Heads of all the Casks were opened.

Nevis, April 9. Sir William Stapleton, chief Governor of the Leeward Islands, being certainly informed of the Death of the late King of ever bleffed Memory, on the 28th of the last month cauled His Ma-jesty to be Proclaimed here in the most solemn manner, by the Marshal officiating here as Sheriff, with the Noise of Drums and Trumpets, Vollies of all the Ordnance in the five Forts, and of the Horse and Foot, and of all the Ships in the Road. lemnity was performed with all the Acclamations of Joy, and Demonstrations of Loyalty imaginable. Order was also given for the like Performances in the Iffand of St. Christophers, Antego, Moniferras, and all other the Inhabited Islands of this Government,

Virginia, May 13. The Lord Howard of Essingham, His Majesties Lieutenant and Governor General of this Colony, having on the seventh Instant received a Letter from the Lords of the Privy-Council in England, with notice of the Death of His late Majelly of bleffed Memory, our prefent Soveraign King FAMES the Second has been Proclaimed here with the greatoff Solemnity this place is capable of; where the great Acclamations and Prayers of the People for His Majesties long Life and happy Reign, having gi-we are told, is at present composed of 40000 men, and wen an Universal Testimony of their Obedience and will in a short time be reinforced with the Troops of Loyalty, was feconded by the following Address.

To the Kings most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of your Maj sties Lieut nant and Governor General of your Colony and Dominion of Virginia, together with the Council of the fame.

TE your Majesties most Loyal and Dutiful Subjetts and Servants, out of a due sense of our Happiness under the Gractous Reign and Merciful Government of our late Soveraign the High and Mighty King CHARLES the Second of most Bessed Memory wobose Piety, Mercy and Justice early removed him from the Cares of an Earthly Monarch to be Crowned with the Immortal Foys of Heaven; And as we cannot fully express our Sorrows for the Death of so good, so gracious, and so merciful a King, so neither can we sufficiently Magnific the Goodness of Almighty God for Hu infinite Merc, to His People in your Majelties most Miraculous Preservation, by which Heavens writ your Majesty Its truly Anointed to Rule and Reign over us: And as we bumbly beg leave to offer unto your Majesty our Congratulation for your Ma-jesties peaceable and safe Into onement in your Rightful and Lawful Imperial Seat, so we beartily pray that God's Providence may always watch over and secure your Majesty from all Plots, Conspiracies and Heussh Machina-tions v And as nothing in this World can be so valuable umo us as your Majesties Peace and Safety, so we bumbly beseecb your Majesty as a Testimony of our Loyal and humble Duty, to accept the Tender of our Lives and Fortunes, which we shall at all times with great Alacrity lay down in defence of your Majesties most Sacred Person, your Heirs and Successors; And in the mean time we beseech God so to preserve your Royal Person, that your Majesties Reigh over us may be long, bappy and latting.
