Chorley Improvement.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for an Act or Acts for paving, lighting, watching, cleansing, and otherwise improving the town and parish of Chorley, in the county palatine of Lancaster, and for removing and preventing nuisances, annoyances, and obstructions therein, and for establishing a police, and also a public market and weighing machines within the said town and parish, and to agree with the lord or lady, for the time being, of the manor of Chorley for the purchase of their rights and interests in the existing market in the said town and parish, and the stallage money receivable by them in respect thereof, and for extinguishing the same.

And it is by the said intended Act proposed to vest in the commissioners, to be appointed under and by virtue thereof, all the materials of and to place under their control and management the present and future streets, lanes, and other public passages and places within the said town and parish, and to empower the said commissioners to repair, alter, widen, and divert the same, and to make and construct proper sewers therein, and where such highways are wholly or partially built upon, to compel the owners of all property adjoining thereto to reimburse the commissioners the cost of the construction of such sewers; and it is also intended to give power to the said commissioners to remove and take down all projecting buildings or other obstructions in the streets and places within the said town and parish.

And it is also proposed by the said Act or Acts, to empower the said commissioners to contract with any company or person for lighting with gas, or otherwise, all or any part of the said town and parish, and to provide lamps, and all other requisites, for the same, or

in case the same shall be deemed expedient by the commissioners, to purchase the existing gas-works in the said town and parish, or to establish and maintain within the said town or parish a manufactory for gas for the use of the said town and parish, with all necessary boilers, gasometers, works, and apparatus requisite for the same, and either to make and supply gas for lighting the said town and parish, and for the use of the inhabitants thereof, or to demise and let such manufactory and works to any person or persons who may be willing to contract with the commissioners for the same, and for lighting the said town and parish, and supplying the inhabitants thereof with gas.

And it is also proposed by the said Act or Acts, to empower the said commissioners to contract with any company or person for the supply of water to the inhabitants of the said town and parish; or, in case the same shall be deemed expedient by the commissioners, to furnish such supply themselves, and for that purpose to purchase and to maintain any present or future reservoirs, filters, wells, cuts, conduits, aqueducts, roads, mains, pipes, and other works and conveniences necessary for effecting such purpose, and to lay and maintain mains and pipes for the conveyance of such water through private lands, and in and along roads, streets, and public passages in the said town and parish.

And it is also intended by the said Act or Acts, to provide for regulating the erection of dwelling-houses in courts, and for the drainage and occupation thereof, and of cellars under dwelling-houses within the said town and parish; and for all or any of the purposes aforesaid, and for any other purposes connected with the improvement and good government of the said town and parish, or the regulation and government of the officers and servants of the said commissioners, to make bye-laws, with penalties recoverable for the breach or non-observance thereof.

And it is also intended by the said Act, to enable the said commissioners to construct a townhall and public offices within the said town and parish, and also to provide slaughterhouses therein, and to regulate the same and any existing slaughterhouses within the said town and parish.

And it is also intended by such Act or Acts, to take power for the purchase, by compulsion or otherwise, of such lands and houses, and other buildings, as may be necessary for all or any of the purposes aforesaid, and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges connected with the lands, houses, and buildings so to be purchased or taken which would in any manner impede or interfere with any of the purposes aforesaid, and to confer other rights and privileges.

And it is also intended by such Act or Acts, to empower the said commissioners, in case they shall supply the inhabitants of the said town and parish with water or gas, to levy and recover rates, rents, and duties for the use of the water or gas so supplied by them, and to grant exemptions from the payment thereof; and also to raise money for all or any of the other purposes of the said intended Act or Acts, by levying rates or assessments on the owners and occupiers of property within the said town and parish, and
