WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners
for England have, in pursuance of an Act,
passed in the session of Parliament held in the
sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign,
intituled "An Act to make better provision for
"the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly
prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council

a scheme, bearing date the nineteenth day of
November, in the year one thousand eight hundred
and forty-five, in the words following, that is to
say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for Eng-
land, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session
of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh
years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act
"to make better provision for the spiritual care
"of populous parishes," have prepared, and now
humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the
following scheme, for constituting two separate
districts for spiritual purposes out of the parish of
Halifax, in the county of York, and in the diocese
of Ripon.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if
at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that
it would promote the interests of religion, that any
part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or
chapelries, district or districts, of great extent,
and containing a large population, and wherein, or
in parts whereof, the provision for public worship
and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for
the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or
any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or

parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided:

“ And whereas the said parish of Halifax is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of such parish hereinafter mentioned, such parts not at present containing

within their limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted separate districts in manner hereinafter set forth:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all those parts of the said parish of Halifax, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and numbered respectively 1 and 2,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the maps or plans hereunto also annexed, and numbered in like manner,—shall be constituted separate districts for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named as follows; that is to say, the district, numbered 1 in the said schedule, shall be named, “ The District of King Cross;” and the district, numbered 2 therein, shall be named, “ The District of Salterhebble.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of each of the districts so herein recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within either of such districts, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to the minister for the time being of such district, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within either of such districts shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sums of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in

each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of either of such districts or new parishes shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ No. 1. The district of KING CROSS, being—

“ All that part of the township of Skircoat, in the parish of Halifax, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, bounded as follows; that is to say, on the eastern side thereof by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 1.) on the boundary between the said township and of the township of Halifax, in the same parish, where such boundary is crossed by Bull-lane, and thence extending southward, along the middle of such lane and Bell Hall-lane and the road leading across Skircoat Moor to Moor Side, by Bird Cage and Upper Woodhouse, to the Sowerby-bridge and Stainland turnpike road, and thence towards the north west, along the middle of such turnpike road, to the road leading to the bridge over the river Calder at Stern-mill, and thence along the middle of such last-mentioned road to the south western boundary of the said township; on the western side thereof by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) on the south western boundary of the said township, at or near to Mearclough-bridge, and thence extending, first, towards the north east along the middle of Clap-lane as far as

the middle of Crow Wood-lane, and thence towards the north west, along the middle of such last-mentioned lane, to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Pye Nest-walk, and thence towards the north east, along the middle of such walk, across the Rochdale and Halifax turnpike road, and thence in a straight direction as far as the said boundary between the said townships of Skircoat and Halifax at a point (marked *d* as aforesaid) at the western end of Hopwood-lane; and on all other sides thereof by the boundary of the said township of Skircoat; and such part of the said township of Halifax as is situate on the southern side of an imaginary line commencing at the last-mentioned point, and thence extending eastward, along the middle of Hopwood-lane aforesaid, to a point (marked *e* as aforesaid) at the southern end of Lister-lane, and thence southward in a straight direction to the point of junction (marked *f* as aforesaid) of King Cross-lane, Parkinson-lane, and Swires-road, and thence towards the south east, along the middle of such road, as far as the middle of Bull Close-lane, and thence southward and towards the south west, along the middle of such last-mentioned lane and Bull-lane aforesaid, as far as the boundary between the said townships of Skircoat and Halifax.

“ No. 2. The district of SALTERHEBBLE, being—

“ All that part of the said township of Skircoat situate on the eastern and southern sides of the said district of King Cross; and such part of the township of Southowram, in the said parish of Halifax, as is situate on the western side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereto annexed and numbered 2.) on the boundary between the said townships of Skircoat and Southowram, where such boundary is crossed by Siddal-lane, and at or near to Paris-gates, and thence extending southward, along the middle of such lane, Pit-lane, and Park-lane, to a point (marked *b* on the last-mentioned map or plan) opposite to the north eastern corner of a certain farm-house and premises called ‘Park Gate,’ and thence along the eastern wall of such house and premises to the boundary between the said township of Southowram and the township of Elland, in the said parish of Halifax.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish out of which it is intended that the districts therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas such incumbent and patron have respectively consented to the said scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the nineteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Saint Martin and Saint Philip, in the town of Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Worcester:

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion; that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendance is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided :

“ And whereas the said parishes of Saint Martin and Saint Philip are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such parishes hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Worcester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all those parts of the said parishes of Saint Martin and Saint Philip, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of Saint Jude, Birmingham.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said

sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of SAINT JUDE, BIRMINGHAM, being—

“ All those parts of the parishes of Saint Martin and Saint Philip, in the town of Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Worcester, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of Queen-street, opposite to the middle of Lower Temple-street, and thence extending towards the south east, along the middle of such first-mentioned street and Colmore-street, as far as the middle of Worcester-street, and thence, southward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, and towards the south west along the middle of Smallbrook-street, to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Suffolk-street, and thence towards the north west, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Navigation-street, and thence towards

the north east, along the middle of such last-mentioned street and of Lower Temple-street aforesaid, to the point where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas such incumbents and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Worcester.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twentieth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An

"Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches," beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Martock, in the county of Somerset, and within the diocese of Bath and Wells, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church or chapel called Trinity Chapel, situate at Ash, in the said parish of Martock, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His said Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Ash," with boundaries as follow, that is to say :

"The district is to consist of the hamlets of Ash, Witcombe, and Milton, and that part of Stapleton highway which commences opposite to and forms an angle with the lane or road leading to Milton, and is bounded on the north by the parish of Long Sutton; on the east by the parish of Tintinhull; on the south and west by the remaining part of the parish of Martock, from which it is separated by proceeding (from the road leading to Ilchester) in a westerly direction along the southern fence of enclosures marked, on the tithe commutation map, Nos. 68, 2153, 63, and 61, as far as No. 57; it then turns southerly down the eastern fence of No. 57; and then north westerly along the southern fences of Nos. 57, 56, and 52, to the western fence of enclosure No. 52, up which fence it proceeds northerly to the southern fence of No. 36, along which fence it proceeds westerly as far as No. 49; it then proceeds northward up the eastern fences of Nos. 49 and 37, then turns westerly along the northern fence of No. 37, then southerly

along the western fences of Nos. 37 and 49, to the southern fence of No. 48; it then proceeds westerly along the southern fences of Nos. 48 and 45; then northerly up the western fences of Nos. 45 and 44 to No. 44; it then turns westerly and proceeds along the southern fences of Nos. 44, 42, 324, 325, and 327, to the western fence of No. 327; up which fence it turns northerly into the road leading from Ash to Stapleton, and proceeding along the middle of that road westerly as far as the road leading to Milton; it then proceeds northerly up the middle of that road as far as the south eastern corner of the fence of No. 1021; along the eastern fence of which enclosure it then proceeds northerly to the north eastern fence of the enclosure No. 1020; along which fence, and the eastern fence of No. 1018, it proceeds and enters the lane or road from Long Load to Milton, and proceeding easterly up the said lane or road to the south eastern corner of the enclosure No. 442; it then turns northerly and proceeds along the middle of the said lane or road as far as the southern fence of No. 445; along which fence it then proceeds westerly to the western fence of No. 445; it then proceeds northerly up the western fences of Nos. 445, 446, 447, 448, and 449, and crossing the river Yeo reaches the boundary which separates the said parishes of Martock and Long Sutton, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink:

“ That banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, churchings, baptisms, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the Minister thereof:

“ That the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Richard Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Richard Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells has signed and sealed this representation:

“ Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal con-

sideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, churchings, baptisms, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
