**I**T is hereby notified, that the Right Honourable the Earl of Aberdeen, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received dispatches from Mr. Turner, Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Monte Video, dated the 24th of September last, and from Mr. Ouseley, Her Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary accredited to the Argentine Republic, dated the 31st of October last, announcing that a blockade of the ports and coast of the province of Buenos Ayres was established, on the 24th of the said month of September, by the vessels of the British and French squadrons; that the term of fifteen days had been granted for the departure of neutral vessels from the port of Buenos Ayres; and that the Commanders of the blockading forces had been authorized farther to extend that term to the 31st of the said month of October.

**W**HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the thirtieth day of December instant; We, with the advice of Our Privy

Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said Tuesday the thirtieth day of December instant; to Thursday the twenty-second day of January next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Thursday the twenty-second day of January next, assemble and be holden for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Thursday the twenty-second day of January next.

And whereas it is expedient that such omission should now be supplied:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, doth hereby declare, that a treaty is now subsisting between Her Majesty and the said republic of Peru:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for uniting the sinecure rectory of Milton, in the county of Cambridge and diocese of Ely, with the vicarage of Milton, in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas by the said Act it is enacted, that, with respect to any benefice with cure of souls which is held together with or in the patronage of the holder of any prebend or other sinecure preferment, belonging to any college in either of the universities, arrangements may be made, by the authority therein provided, and with the consents of the respective patrons, for permanently uniting such preferment with such benefice:

"And whereas the aforesaid vicarage of Milton is a benefice with cure of souls within the meaning of the said recited Act, and the aforesaid sinecure rectory of Milton is a sinecure preferment also within the meaning of the said recited Act, and the said vicarage is now vacant:

"And whereas the said sinecure rectory of Milton is in the patronage of the provost and scholars of the King's College of the Blessed Mary and Saint Nicholas of Cambridge, and the said vicarage is in the patronage of the sinecure rector of Milton aforesaid for the time being:

“ And whereas the Reverend John Chapman, as such rector and patron as aforesaid, has applied to us to make arrangements for the union of the said sinecure rectory with the said vicarage; and it appears to us to be expedient, that such union should be forthwith effected, and that such other arrangements relating thereto should be made as are hereinafter mentioned :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Reverend John Chapman, testified by his having hereunto set his hand and seal, and of the said Provost and scholars of the said college, testified by their corporate seal being hereunto affixed, that the said sinecure rectory and vicarage of Milton shall be forthwith permanently united and consolidated, and that the same shall become and be one benefice with cure of souls, by the name of the rectory of Milton; and that the said John Chapman shall thereupon become and be rector of such rectory; and he and his successors, rectors thereof, shall be entitled to all the emoluments, both of the said sinecure rectory and of the said vicarage; and that the rectory of Milton shall after such union and consolidation as aforesaid be in the patronage of the said Provost and scholars of the said College for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ely.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the ninth day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, viz.

“ Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “ An Act to amend the Acts, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches,” beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Enfield, in the county of Middlesex, and within the diocese of London, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church or chapel, called Jesus Chapel, in the said parish, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches

“ in populous parishes;” and that such district should be named, “ The Chapelry District of Jesus Chapel, Enfield,” with boundaries as follow :

“ The district is bounded on the east by the chapelry district of Saint James; on the north by the parishes of Cheshunt and Northaw; on the west and south by the remaining part of the parish of Enfield, from which it is separated by an imaginary line proceeding from a point in the common boundary of Enfield and Northaw parishes, one hundred yards westwards of the road from Cattle-gate to White Webb’s-lane; the boundary then proceeds, in a south easterly direction, at the said distance of one hundred yards from the south western side of the road from Cattle-gate, until it meets the course of a brook running from Potter’s-bar, along which brook it proceeds till it crosses the said road from Cattle-gate, and then, leaving the brook, takes the middle of the said road till it meets White Webb’s-lane, then turns up the middle of that lane, until it meets a brook, and then follows the course of the said brook, as far as the Flash, and, entering the New River, proceeds still south easterly along the same, as far as the bridge opposite Mr. Child’s house, then leaving the river, proceeds along the middle of Castle Hatch-lane, as far as the boundary of Saint James’s District, as shewn on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow :

“ That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, churchings, and baptisms, and also burials (when the present ground for burials has been consecrated) should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel; and that all the fees arising therefrom should belong and be paid to the Minister of the said chapel for the time being :

“ That the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Lord Bishop of London has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Charles James Lord Bishop of London has signed and sealed this present instrument :

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, churchings, baptisms, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
