delivered to the Lord in Waiting, in order that there may be no mistake in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half past one o'clock.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act for making better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act for making better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the new parish of Saint Andrew, Montpelier, in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licensed to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said first-

recited Act; and that any portion of any such separate district, which by any such alteration as aforesaid shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, again belong to, and form part of, the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such separate district being originally constituted, or to, and of any new district, as shall be determined by the like authority:

“ And whereas the district of Saint Andrew, Montpelier, was duly constituted out of the parishes of Saint Paul, Bristol, and Horfield, in the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, under the provisions of the said, first-recited Act, by a scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and duly gazetted; and, by reason of a church having been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, such district has since become, under the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, and is now known as such by the name of “ The New Parish of Saint Andrew, Montpelier:”

“ And whereas the Reverend Charles Evanson, Clerk, was duly licensed as the first minister of the said district on the twenty-third day of January now last past:

“ And whereas it is contemplated and intended, that a district shall be assigned to the church of Saint Matthew, Kingsdown, in the parish of Saint James, Bristol, in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, and it has been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that, upon such intended district being assigned to the said church, a portion of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Montpelier, adjoining the said church, should be annexed and added to such district, and that the bounds of the said new parish should be accordingly altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Henry Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the bounds of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Montpelier,

shall be altered as follows; that is to say, instead of the line now forming the south western boundary thereof, such new parish shall be bounded, on the south western side thereof, by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked A on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of the street or road called ‘ Stokes-croft,’ and on the north western boundary of the district of Saint Barnabas, in the said parish of Saint Paul, and opposite to the middle of Thomas-street, and thence extending towards the north west, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, and continuing in the same direction as far as the south eastern boundary of the parish of Westbury, in the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol; and that such alteration shall take effect so soon as the said intended district shall have been legally assigned to the said church of Saint Matthew, Kingsdown; and that, thereupon, all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Montpelier, which, by reason of the alteration of the boundary thereof, so herein recommended and proposed as aforesaid, shall become and be detached and excluded therefrom, shall, to all intents and purposes, belong to, and form part of, the said intended district.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the said new parish, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts; and one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct,

that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the two several registries of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, at Bristol and Gloucester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for "the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Saint Blazey and Tywardreath, and a certain extra parochial place adjoining thereto, all in the county of Cornwall, and in the diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the

diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided :

"And whereas the said parishes of Saint Blazey and Tywardreath are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of the said parishes and the said extra parochial place hereinafter mentioned, such parts and extra place not at present containing within their limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner herein after set forth :

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Exeter, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Saint Blazey, and also all that part of the said parish of Tywardreath, together with the said extra parochial place, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all of which, with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “The District of Par.”

“And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new

parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“The district of PAR, being—

“All those parts of the parishes of Saint Blazey and Tywardreath, in the county of Cornwall, and in the diocese of Exeter, and also all that extra-parochial place in the same county and diocese, situate as follows; that is to say, firstly, all that part of the said parish of Saint Blazey situate on the southern side of an imaginary irregular line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the south-western boundary of the said parish, where such boundary is crossed by a certain private road leading to Tregrehan-house, and thence extending, first, northward along the middle of such road to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) where such road crosses a certain rivulet, and thence northward along the middle of such rivulet as far as the middle of a certain lane called White Water-lane, and thence eastward along the middle of such lane to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the western fence or boundary of a certain field (numbered 698 on the tithe commutation map or plan of the said parish of Saint Blazey and on the said map or plan hereunto annexed), and thence extending northward along such western fence or boundary to the north-western corner of the said field, and thence eastward, along the northern fence or boundary thereof and along the northern fences or boundaries of certain other fields (numbered 699, 702, 703, as aforesaid), as far as the

middle of a certain road leading from the Saint Austell turnpike road to Bodelva, and thence southward along the middle of such road to a point (marked *d* as aforesaid) opposite to the north-western corner of another field (numbered 708 as aforesaid) and thence extending eastward along the northern fence or boundary thereof and southward along the eastern fence or boundary thereof to the north-western corner of another field (numbered 397 as aforesaid), and thence eastward, along the northern and eastern fences or boundaries of such last-mentioned field, as far as the middle of the turnpike road from Saint Austell to Saint Blazey, and thence towards the north-east, along the middle of such turnpike road, to a point (marked *e* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain lane leading into Par-lane, and thence towards the south-east, along the middle of such lane and eastward along the middle of Par-lane aforesaid, to a point (marked *f* as aforesaid) at the south-western corner of a certain field (numbered 249 as aforesaid), and thence, first, northward along the western and northern fences or boundaries thereof as far as the middle of Roselyon-lane, and thence northward along the middle of such lane to a point (marked *g* as aforesaid) opposite to the north-western corner of a certain field (numbered 251 as aforesaid), and thence eastward along the northern fence or boundary thereof to the north-eastern corner thereof, and thence in a straight direction with the wooden aqueduct over the river to the eastern boundary of the said parish of Saint Blazey; secondly, all that part of the parish of Tywardreath, in the same county and diocese, situate on the south-western side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *h* as aforesaid) on that part of the western boundary of such parish where the cliff forming such boundary adjoins the south-western boundary thereof at or near Polmear, and thence extending northward along the base of the cliff as far as the middle of the road leading from Fowey to Saint Austell aforesaid, and thence westward along the middle of such road to a point (marked *i* as aforesaid) where such road crosses the Old-cliff, and thence along the base of such cliff to a certain pool of water (marked *j* as aforesaid) in the corner of the wastrell at Little Par, and thence along the eastern hedge or fence of the said wastrell, across the new road to Tywardreath, and along the middle of

Little Par-lane to the point where it adjoins the Old-cliff aforesaid, and thence along the base of such cliff to the point where it adjoins the road leading from Tywardreath aforesaid to Saint Andrews-bridge, and thence along the middle of such last-mentioned road as far as Saint Andrews-bridge aforesaid, and thence westward along the road leading from such bridge to a point (marked *k* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Kilhallan-lane, and thence northward along the middle of such lane to the gate at the head of such lane leading into Kilhallan Great-field, and by the southern and western hedges of such field to the gate at the northern end thereof, and thence across the new road, and along the eastern hedges of the three opposite fields recently inclosed, to the middle of the turnpike road leading from Lostwithiel to Saint Blazey, and thence westward along the middle of such last-mentioned road as far as the western boundary of the said parish of Tywardreath; and, thirdly, all that extra-parochial place called Par-harbour and Sands, situate between the said parish of Tywardreath on the east and the said parish of Saint Blazey and the parish of Saint Austell, in the same county and diocese, on the west."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it

is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided :

"And whereas the said parish of Banbury is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter-mentioned, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Samuel Bishop of Oxford, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Banbury, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan

hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of South Banbury.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of SOUTH BANBURY, being—
