Buckingham-Palace, January 22, 1846.

THIS day Her Majesty, accompanied by His Royal Highness Prince Albert, proceeded in state from Buckingham-Palace to the House of Peers, where she arrived soon after two o'clock; and was received, on alighting from her state coach, by the Lord Chancellor, the Lord President of the Council, the Lord Privy Seal, Sir Augustus Clifford, Bart. C. B. Deputy Great Chamberlain (in the absence of the Lord Willoughby d'Eresby), the Earl Marshal, the Lord Steward of the Household, the Duke of Wellington, Garter King of Arms, and the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, and proceeded to the robing-room in the customary manner.

Her Majesty was there robed, and the procession moved into the House in the usual order;-the sword of state was borne by the Duke of Wellington, and the cap of maintenance by the Marquess of Winchester.

Her Majesty being seated on the Throne, and His Royal Highness Prince Albert on a Chair on the left side of the Cloth of Estate, the Great Officers of State and others standing on the right and left, James Pulman, Esq. Yeoman Usher | interrupted, and acts of barbarity have been com-

of the Black Rod, was sent with a message from Her Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, Her Majesty was pleased to deliver the following most gracious Speech to both Houses of Parliament:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

IT gives me great satisfaction again to meet you in Parliament, and to have the opportunity of recurring to your assistance and advice.

I continue to receive from my Allies, and from other Foreign Powers, the strongest assurances of their desire to cultivate the most friendly relations with this country.

I rejoice that, in concert with the Emperor of Russia, and through the success of our joint mediation, I have been enabled to adjust the differences which had long prevailed between the Ottoman Porte and the King of Persia, and had seriously endangered the tranquillity of the East.

For several years a desolating and sanguinary warfare has afflicted the States of the Rio de la Plata. The commerce of all nations has been mitted unknown to the practice of a civilized people. In conjunction with the King of the French, I am endeavouring to effect the pacification of these States.

The convention concluded with France in the course of the last year, for the more effectual suppression of the slave trade, is about to be carried into immediate execution by the active co-operation of the two Powers on the Coast of Africa.

It is my desire that our present union, and the good understanding which so happily exists between us, may always be employed to promote the interests of humanity, and to secure the peace of the world.

I regret that the conflicting claims of Great Britain and the United States, in respect of the territory on the north western Coast of America, although they have been made the subject of repeated negotiation, still remain unsetted. You may be assured that no effort, consistent with national honour, shall be wanting on my part to bring this question to an early and peaceful termination.

## Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

The estimates for the year will be laid before you at an early period.

Although I am deeply sensible of the importance of enforcing economy in all branches of the expenditure, yet I have been compelled, by a due regard to the exigencies of the public service, and to the state of our naval and military establishments, to propose some increase in the estimates which provide for their efficiency.

## My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I have observed, with deep regret, the very frequent instances in which the crime of deliberate assassination has been of late committed in Ireland.

It will be your duty to consider whether any measures can be devised calculated to give increased protection to life, and to bring to justice the perpetrators of so dreadful a crime.

I have to lament that, in consequence of the failure of the potato crop in several parts of the United Kingdom, there will be a deficient supply of an article of food which forms the chief subsistence of great numbers of my people.

The disease by which the plant has been affected has prevailed to the greatest extent in Ireland.

I have adopted all such precautions as it was in my power to adopt for the purpose of alleviating the sufferings which may be caused by this calamity; and I shall confidently rely on your co-operation in devising such other means for effecting the same benevolent purpose as may require the sanction of the Legislature.

I have had great satisfaction in giving my assent to the measures which you have presented to me from time to time, calculated to extend commerce, and to stimulate domestic skill and industry, by the repeal of prohibitory and the relaxation of protective duties.

The prosperous state of the revenue, the increased demand for labour, and the general improvement which has taken place in the internal condition of the country, are strong testimonies in favour of the course you have pursued.

I recommend you to take into your early consideration whether the principles on which you have acted may not with advantage be yet more extensively applied; and whether it may not be in your power, after a careful review of the existing duties upon many articles, the produce or manufacture of other countries, to make such further reductions and remissions as may tend to ensure the continuance of the great benefits to which I have adverted, and by enlarging our commercial intercourse to strengthen the bonds of amity with Foreign Powers.

Any measures which you may adopt for effecting these great objects will, I am convinced, be accompanied by such precautions as shall prevent permanent loss to the revenue, or injurious results to any of the great interests of the country.

I have full reliance on your just and dispassionate consideration of matters so deeply affecting the public welfare.

It is my earnest prayer that, with the blessing of Divine Providence on your counsels, you may be enabled to promote friendly feelings between different classes of my subjects, to provide additional security for the continuance of peace, and to maintain contentment and happiness at home, by increasing the comforts and bettering the condition of the great body of my people.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the " British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that no goods shall be imported into, nor shall any goods (except as therein expected) be exported from, any of the British possessions in America, by sea, from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of such possessions, except into or from the several ports in such possessions enumerated and described in a certain table in the said Act contained; and that if any goods shall be imported into any port or place contrary thereto, such goods shall be forfeited:

And whereas by the said Act it is provided, that, if Her Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the said table, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports:

And whereas it is expedient that the port of Alligator Pond, in the island of Jamaica, should be constituted a free port, and that the said provigions of the said Act should be extended thereto: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and by the authority aforesaid, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said port of Alligator Pond, in the said island of Jamaica, shall, from and after the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, be and be deemed to be a free port; and that the provisions of the said Act shall, from and after the said first day of March, be extended to the said port of Alligator Pond, as if the same had been enumerated in the said table of free ports in the said Act contained:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable William Ewart Gladstone, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary orders herein, as to them respectively may appertain.

And whereas it is expedient to appoint the port of Newcastle, in the colony of New South Wales, to be a free warehousing port; and that all privileges which are by law attached to free warehousing ports, in any of Her Majesty's possessions abroad, should attach to the said port:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by the authority of the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said port of Newcastle, in the said colony of New South Wales, shall be a free warehousing port;

And the Right Honourable the Lord's Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable William Gladstone, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly as to them respectively appertain.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for carrying into "effect the reports of the Commissioners ap-"pointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners or England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An "Act for carrying into effect the reports of the "Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and "Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for settling the ecclesiastical jurisdiction in and over certain parishes locally situate in the diocese of Rochester, but now subject to peculiar jurisdiction.

"Whereas, in and by a scheme prepared by us, and laid before your Majesty in Council, bearing date the eighth day of August, and an Order of your Majesty in Council, ratifying the said scheme, and bearing date the same eighth day of August, in this present year, and since duly gazetted, certain provisions are made for abolishing, upon and after the first day of January next, all peculiar jurisdiction in and over certain parishes and places in the present diocese of Rochester, and subjecting such of them as are therein described to be locally situate within the city and deanry of Rochester to the jurisdiction of the Bishop of Rochester, and of the Archdeacon of Rochester until the archdeaconry of Rochester shall have been suppressed, and then of the Dean of Rochester:

"And whereas some of the several parishes and places hereinafter named (all which parishes and places are now subject to peculiar jurisdiction) are locally situate on the borders of the said city and

deanry of Rochester, but are not surrounded on all sides by portions of such city and deanry, and doubts have therefore been suggested respecting the intent and meaning of the said scheme and Order, so far as it applies to the future ecclesiastical jurisdiction within and over such parishes and

places respectively:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that, in order to remove all such doubts, it be declared and provided by this present scheme, according to the true intent and meaning of ourselves and of the several parties consenting to the said former scheme, that, to all intents and for all the purposes, and subject to all the provisions in that behalf of the said recited Act and of he said scheme and Order of the eighth day of August last, the several parishes and places first hereinafter named, that is to say, Cliffe, Darenth, Gillingham, the Grange otherwise the Grench, Graine, Ifield, Lidsing, Meopham, and Northfleet, shall be held to be now and henceforth locally situate within the limits of the said city and deanry of Rochester; and the five several parishes and places next hereinafter named, that is to say, Eynsford, Farningham, Otford, Shoreham, and Stansted, shall be held not to be either now or henceforth locally situate within the same limits, but to be, after the said first day of January next, locally situate within the diocese of Canterbury and the archdeaconry of Maidstone.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas due notice of the said scheme has been given in accordance with the provisions of the Statute in that behalf, and no objection has been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several dioceses of Canterbury and Rochester.

Chapter of the Most Noble Order of the Garter.

A CHAPTER of this Most Noble Order having been summoned for this day the Knights Companions hereafter named, in their mantles and collars, assembled in St. George's-hall, vizt.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, His Royal Highness the Prince George, the Duke of Rutland, the Duke of Wellington, the Marquess of Exeter, the Duke of Richmond, the Duke of Buccleuch, the Marquess of Lansdowne, the Duke of Beaufort, the Duke of Cleveland, the Marquess of Abercorn, Earl Talbot, and the Earl of Powis, attended by the following Officers, vizt.

attended by the following Officers, vizt.

The Lord Bishop of Winchester, Prelate; the Lord Bishop of Oxford, Chancellor; the Honourable and Reverend the Dean of Windsor, Register; Sir Charles George Young, Knt. Garter Principal King of Arms; and Sir Augustus William James Clifford, Bart. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod.

At three o'clock the Knights Companions were called over by Garter, when (Her Majesty and His Royal Highness the Prince Albert having passed into the Throne-room) they proceeded with the Officers of the Order from St. George's-hall through the Grand Reception-room into the presence of the Sovereign, the Chancellor remaining at the door, not having been sworn.

The Sovereign being seated in the chair of state, and His Royal Highness Prince Albert at the table on the right hand of Her Majesty, the other Knights Companions took their respective places at the table, the Prelate standing on the right hand of the Sovereign, the Register, Garter, and Black Rod at the bottom of the table.

The Register then signified to the Sovereign that the Right Reverend Dr. Samuel Wilberforce, Lord Bishop of Oxford, attended at the door, and humbly prayed to be admitted to take the oath of office as Chancellor of this Most Noble Order, whereupon, by Her Majesty's command, the Chancellor, wearing his mantle over his episcopal habit, was introduced between Garter and Black Rod, the former, carrying on a velvet cushion, the purse, containing the great seal of the Order, and the gold chain and badge; the Chancellor, kneeling on the left hand of the Sovereign, and holding in his hand the Holy Gospels, the oath was administered to him by the Register. Her Majesty then invested him with the gold chain and badge, and, having delivered to him the purse, he had the honour to kiss Her Majesty's hand, and then retired to his place on the Sovereign's left hand.

The Chancellor then signified to the Chapter Her Majesty's royal will and pleasure, that the two vacant stalls in the Royal Chapel of Saint George, at Windsor, should be filled; and, as by the statutes none but a Knight can be elected, the Most Honourable George Charles Marquess Camden was introduced by Garter and Black Rod, and knighted by Her Majesty with the sword of state, and his Lordship, having kissed the Sovereign's hand, retired; after which the Most Honourable Richard Marquess of Hertford was introduced and knighted, with the same

ceremony.

The Knights Companions then proceeded to the election; and the suffrages, having been collected by the Chancellor, were by him presented to the Sovereign, who commanded him to declare, that the Most Honourable George Charles Marquess Camden had been duly elected a Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter. Then, by the Sovereign's command, his Lordship was received at the door of the Chapter-room by Earl Talbot and the Earl of Powis, the two Junior Knights Companions present, and conducted between them to Her Majesty, preceded by Garter (bearing the ensigns of the Order upon a crimson velvet cushion), and by Black Rod. The Marquess Camden, kneeling near the Sovereign, Garter, on his knee, presented the garter, and Her Majesty, assisted by His Royal Highness Prince Albert and His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, the two Senior Knights. Companions present, buckled it on his Lordship's left leg, the Chancellor pronouncing the usual admonition.

Garter next presented, in like manner, the ribband and George; and Her Majesty, assisted as before, put the same over his Lordship's left shoulder, the Chancellor pronouncing the admonition. The Marquess then again kissed Her Majesty's hand, and, having received the congratulations of each of the Knights Companions, retired.

The Chapter then proceeded to, a second election; and the suffrages, having been collected by the Chancellor, were presented to the Sovereign, when the Most Honourable Richard Marquess of Hertford was, by Her Majesty's command, declared duly elected; and his Lordship was introduced and invested with the garter and the ribband and George, with the like ceremonies.

George, with the like ceremonies.

The Chapter being ended, Garter, by Her Majesty's command, again called over the Knights. Companions, who, with the Officers of the Order, retired from the presence of the Sovereign, with

the usual reverences.
