HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual "care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh

years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act" to make better provision for the spiritual care of "populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Almondbury, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent. and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be

permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parish of Almondbury is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Almondbury, described in the schedule hercunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hercunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, "The District of Upperthong."

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE:

" The district of Upperthone, being-

"All that part of the parish of Almondbury, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, comprised within the township of Upperthong."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patrons of the church of the parish out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, and such incumbent and patrons have consented to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An " Act for building, and promoting the building, " of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled " An Act to amend the Acts " for building, and promoting the building, of " additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Com-" mission for building new churches," beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having tiken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Swindon, in the county of Wilts, and within the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol,

it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His said Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to "amend and render more effectual an Act, "passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of ad-"ditional churches in populous parishes," be assigned to the church called Saint Mark's Church, recently erected and consecrated at Swindon New Town, in the said parish of Swindon; and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Swindon New Town," and be bounded as follows, that is to say:

"On or towards the north and north west by the parish of Rolbourn Cheney; on or towards the south by the turnpike road leading from Wootton Bassett to Swindon, and by a road way leading from the said turnpike road to the turnpike road from Cricklade to Swindon; on or towards the east by the said turnpike road from Cricklade to Swindon; and on or towards the west by the parish of Lydiard Tregoz, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church of Saint Mark; and that all the fees arising therefrom should be paid and belong to the Minister of such church for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend James Henry Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of said His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said James Henry Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdem shall seem meet."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and by the authority aforesaid, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said port of Alligator Pond in the said island of Jamaica, shall, from and after the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, be and be deemed to be a free port; and that the provisions of the said Act shall, from and after the said first day of March, be extended to the said port of Alligator Pond, as if the same had been enumerated in the said table of free ports in the said Act contained:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable William Ewart Gladstone, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary orders herein, as to them respectively may appertain.

4. Opposition at the hearing can only be | Sunday, and exclusive both of the day of giving such notice and of the said day of hearing.

- 2. But in the case of a Prisoner, whom his Creditors have removed, by an order of the Court, from a gaol in or near London for hearing in the country, such notice of opposition will be sufficient if given one clear day before the day of hearing.
- 3.
