THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to carry into effect, with " certain modifications, the fourth report of the " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and " Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " for enabling ecclesiastical corporations, aggre-" gate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of "years," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An " Act to carry into effect, with certain modifi-" tions, the fourth report of the Commissioners " of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for enabling eccle-" siastical corporations, aggregate and sole, to " grant leases for long terms of years," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for determining the portion of the improved value to be made payable to us in a certain mining lease about to be granted by the Reverend Francis Cole, Clerk, Vicar of the parish of Saint Issey, in the county of Cornwall, and diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas by the said last recited Act it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole (excepting as therein is excepted, which exception does not include the case of a vicar), from time to time, with the consents in that behalf thereby required, and subject to the provisions in the same Acts contained, to grant or demise by lease, for any

term not exceeding sixty years, any mines, minerals, quarries, or beds belonging to such corporation:

"And whereas, in pursuance of the powers contained in the said recited enactment, it is proposed by the said Francis Cole, as such Vicar as aforesaid, with the consents required by the same Acts, to grant and demise, by lease, certain mines, with the produce thereof, in and under certain lands, being part and parcel of the glebe lands of the said parish, and situate, lying, and being therein:

"And whereas by the same Act it is further enacted, that, in case of any lease of mines, minerals, quarries, or bed's granted thereunder, such portion of the improved value accruing under such lease; as by the authority provided in the first recited Act shall be determined, not being more than three fourth parts nor less than one moiety of such improved value, shall forthwith, and from time to time as the same shall accrue, be paid to us, and shall be subject to the provisions relating to monies payable to us.

"And whereas the improved value to secrue under the lease so proposed to be granted as aforesaid will, according to the meaning of the same Act, be the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made in such lease:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that one half of the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made in the said lease so to be granted, whether consisting of rent, loyalty, or otherwise, shall, by such lease, be made directly payable to us; and that we shall have all the like remedies, in respect of such one half of any such reservation as aforesaid, as if the same were a separate rent reserved to us as lessors or grantors and reversioners of the premises comprised in such lease, independently of the rights and remedies of the said Francis Cole and his successors, Vicars of Saint Issey, in respect of the remaining one half thereof, without any priority or preference between us and the said Vicar for the time being; and, further, that we shall have full benefit and advantage, either jointly with or separately from the said Francis Cole and his successors, Vicars of Saint Issey for the time being, of all or any of the covenants, conditions, and agreements in the said lease contained on the lessee's part, in like manner as if we had been grantors, lessors, and reversioners asaforesaid, and as in such lease shall be expressed;
and that, for effectuating such objects, the said
lease shall and may be framed in such manner,
and contain all such clauses and provisions, as we
shall approve, and shall have full force accordingly, any rule of law, statute, or custom to the
contrary notwithstanding.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of thems. in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been given to the said Francis Cole, as such Vicarras aforesaid, in accordance with the provisions of the first recited Act, and no objection has been offered thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her-Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London-Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice; is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the directs of Exeter.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to alter and amend the law "relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act" to alter and amend the law relating to eccle-" siastical houses of residence," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for relieving the bishops of Worcester from one of the houses of residence belonging to the see, and for converting the same into a deanery.

"Whereas there are two houses of residence belonging to the see of Worcester; the one situate at Hartlebury, in the county of Worcester, and the other adjoining the precinets of the cathedral church of Worcester; and it appears to us to be expedient, on account of the reduced income of the see, that the bishops of Worcester should be relieved from one of such houses of residence, and that the said house at Hartlebury, which has for many years past been the usual residence of the bishops of Worcester, should become the sole permanent house of residence of the said see:

"And whereas the house heretofore occupied as the deanery of the said cathedral church of Worcester being a very ancient building partly surrounding the chapter house and adjoining the said cathedral church so as to be injurious thereto and in other respects objectionable as a residence, steps have been taken by the dean and chapter of the said church for taking down the same, and towards providing another deanery house:

"And whereas the said dean and chapter have agreed to purchase the said episcopal house at Worcester, for the consideration and upon the terms and conditions hereinafter mentioned; in order that the same may be made the deanery of the said cathedral church:

"And whereas it having been made to appear to us that the said episcopal house at Hartlebury was in need of certain alterations and repairs, and that no money had been received by the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Worcester for dilapidations in respect of either of the said episcopal houses, and difficulties having occurred in making final arrangements respecting the same, we advanced to the said bishop the sum of seven thousand pounds out of the monies applicable to the purposes of the recited Act, at the same time

entering into an agreement with the said bishop; in which he agreed to consent to any arrangement, being such as would relieve him from the charge of the said house at Worcester, which we should deem it right to recommend and propose respecting the same, and also to consent to the transfer to us of certain sums of cash and stock hereinafter specified, in part liquidation of the sum of money so advanced by us; and such repairs and alterations have since been completed to our satisfaction:

"And whereas we have expended, out of the same monies, a sum of nine hundred and twenty-eight pounds eight shillings and six pence inputting the said episcopal house at Worcester in a state fit for occupation::

"And whereas the said recited Act and certain Acts therein mentioned contain provisionsfor authorizing and carrying into full effect the several arrangements aforesaid and the further-measures hereinafter recommended and proposed;

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said. Henry Bishop of: Worcester and of the Very Reverend John Peel, the present dean of the said: cathedral church, testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this scheme, and also, with the consent of the dean and chapter of the: said cathedral church, testified by their having: affixed their chapter seal hereto, recommend and, propose, that, upon payment to us, for the purposes of the said Acts, of the sum of three thousand. pounds; and upon and from the day on which notice of such payment shall be published in the: London Gazette, which notice shall be a valid discharge to the said dean and chapter for suchpayment to us, the piece or parcel of land, withthe buildings and premises, as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, and also the several. fixtures, fittings, and other articles as specified in a list to be forthwith made in duplicate and scaled: by us, one part whereof shall be registered in the registry of the said diocese of Worcester, and the other part thereof deposited with us, shall beabsolutely transferred from the said see of Worcester and the bishops thereof, and shall, for the consideration aforesaid, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly published Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, be sold and become absolutely conveyed to and be vested in the deanand chapter of the said cathedral church of Worcester and their successors; and the said land, buildings, and premises shall thereupon be made and be the deanery and place of residence of the dean, for the time being, of the said cathedral church, and be included in and form part of the precincts of the said church.

" And we further recommend and propose, that, towards raising the sum of three thousand pounds so to be paid to us, the said dean and chapter may borrow and take up, at interest, from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and the said Governors may lend, the sum of two thousand pounds; and, as a security for the same, the said dean and chapter may mortgage to the said Governors all or any of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, profits and emoluments, belonging to them as such dean and chapter, for the term of thirty years, or until the money so borrowed, with interest for the same, at the rate of three pounds ten shillings by the year for every hundred pounds, and any costs and charges attending the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied; and the said mortgage shall be effected in the same manner, as nearly as may be mutatis mutandis, as any mortgage effected under the authority of an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to " amend the law for providing fit houses for the " beneficed clergy;" and the treasurer or other proper officer of the said church shall, out of all sums of money from time to time payable to the dean of the said church for the time being as such dean, as the same respectively become due and payable, deduct and withhold such sum or sums of money as shall have been paid or shall have accrued due in respect of the said mortgage; and shall either apply such sum or sums to the use of the said dean and chapter or pay the same to the treasurer of the said Governors for the time being, as the case may be; and the receipt of such lastmentioned treasurer shall be as valid a discharge to the treasurer or other officer of the said church, for the sum therein expressed to be received, as if the same had been a receipt from such dean himself.

"And we further recommend and propose, that, upon such episcopal house at Worcester being so made the deanery of the said cathedral church, the said doan and chapter shall have full.

authority for the taking down and sale of the materials of the said old deanery house, saving: such parts thereof, if any, as may in the judgment of the said dean and chapter be advantageously left for their own use and accommodation, and for applying the site thereof, and the land attached thereto, to the improvement of the said church and the precincts thereof, and of any canonical house belonging to the said dean and chapter.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the remaninder of such consideration money shall be raised and made up by applying towardsthe payment thereof the following sums; that is to say, the sum of two hundred and fifty-five pounds, being the amount agreed to be paid by the last dean of Worcester for dilapidations inrespect of the said old deanery house; the whole net proceeds of the sale of the materialsof the same house estimated at the sum of three: hundred and twenty-five pounds; the whole netproceeds of the sale of the materials of twoprebendal houses lately belonging to canonies. suspended in the said church, estimated at the sum of three hundred and twenty pounds, suchlast-mentioned sale and application being. authorized by act or acts of the said dean and: chapter duly passed; and the sum of one hundred. pounds, more or less, to be paid by the said dean. and chapter, in consideration of the improvement. of the said church and the precincts-thereof.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the several sums of each and stock, now standing in the name of the Accountant-General of the: Court of Chancery, to the credit of the see of Worcester, that is to say, the sum of two hundred and sixty-three pounds one shilling and three pence in cash, and the sum of two thousand and twenty-two pounds two shillings and three pence in Three Rounds per Centum. Consolidated Bank Annuities, shall be forthwith paid and transferred to our account and into our names, in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, for the purposes of the said Acts.

"And we further recommend and propose, that we shall have full authority for advancing the sum of money herein-before mentioned for the said repairs and alterations of the said espiscopal house of residence at Hartlebury; and for expending the other sum of money herein-before

mentioned upon the said episcopal house at Worcester; and that the several sums of money and of stock, so as aforesaid to be paid and transferred to us, shall be deemed to be in part discharge of the said sum of money so advanced by us, and to have been applied, according to the provisions of the Act in that behalf, in the manner most conducive to the permanent benefit of the bishops of Worcester; and that the balance of such sum, and also the sum so expended, shall be charged by us to the account of the moneys applicable to the purposes of the said Acts.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the said Henry Bishop of Worcester shall have full authority for the removal, from the said house at Worcester to the said house at Hartlebury, of certain pictures, books, goods, and chattels belonging to the bishops of Worcester in right of their see; and that the same, according to a list thereof which shall be forthwith made in duplicates and sealed, registered, and deposited in like manner with the lists of fixtures and fittings aforesaid, shall be deemed to be duly transferred to and deposited in the said episcopal house at Hartlebury; and shall be the property of the said bishop and his successors bishops of Worcester for ever, and that he and they shall retain and take care of the same in such house, in conformity, as nearly as may be, with the uses to which they were previously applicable respectively.

" And we further recommend and propose, that the bishop of Worcester for the time being shall, at his personal charge, insure, and keep insured, the said episcopal house of residence at Hartlebury, from loss or damage by fire, in one of the public offices of assurance in London or Westminster, to be approved by us, in the sum of ten thousand pounds; and that the deam of Worcester for the time being shall also, at his personal charge, insure, and keep insured, the said new deanery house in the sum of three thousand pounds; and that such bishop and dean respectively shall, within fourteen days after any premium for such insurance shall have become due, deliver to us the receipt for the same; and that in case of any loss or damage by fire to either of the said houses, any and every sum of money receivable under such insurance shall become and be payable and be paid to and deposited with us; in trust to be applied, and the same, together with

any interest and accumulations thereof shall be applied by us towards the rebuilding or repairing and the reinstating of the said episcopal or decanal house, as the case may be, or of any part thereof which may have so suffered loss or damage, in such manner as shall be determined on by us, with the concurrence of the bishop or dean of Worcester, for the time being, as the case may be.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"SCHEDULE

" All that piece or parcel of land, together with the mansion, buildings, and premises thereon, called or known as "The Bishop's Palace," and heretofore belonging to the see of Worcester, and the porter's lodge, stables, coach houses, offices, and appurtenances thereunto belonging; which. said piece or parcel of land and premises are situate in the parish of Saint Michael, in Bedwardine, in the borough of Worcester, and are bounded on the north by a road or street called " Palace-yard," and certain buildings and premises, under lease from the corporation of the city of Worcester, to the devisees of the late George Hill, and now in the occupation of William Barnes; on the east by houses and premises, under lease from the dean and chapter of Worcester, and now in the occupation of Charles Augustus Helm, Walter Jones, William Dore, and Benjamin Crane; on. the south by a leasehold house and garden called "Ivy-house," belonging to the said dean and chapter, and now in the occupation of Alfred. Hooper; and on the west by the towing-path ad. joining the river Severn; all which said piece or parcel of land herein described is in length, from north to south, one hundred and eight yards, more or less, and in breadth, from east to west, ninetyseven yards, more or less, and contains two acresand twenty-three perches, more or less."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same,

and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Worcester.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act" to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Wrotham in the county of Kent, and within the diocese of Canterbury, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to " amend and render more effectual an Act, " passed in the last session of Parliament, for " building, and promoting the building, of ad-"ditional churches in populous parishes," be assigned to the church recently erected and consecrated by the name of Saint Mary's Church, at Platt, in the said parish of Wrotham; and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Platt," and be bounded as follows, that is to say:

"The district is wholly contained within the ancient limits of the borough of Neppiker, and

forms the southern portion thereof, and is bounded on the east by the parishes of Addington, Leybourn, Mereworth, and West Peckham; on the south west by the recently constituted parish of Plaxtol, which parish consists of the ancient boroughs of Plaxtol or Hale, Winfield, and Roughway, inclusive of a detached portion of the said borough of Winfield locally situate within the limits of the district of Saint Mary; on part of the north west by the the town borough (comprised in the parish of Wrotham) as far as the north western corner of the enclosure marked, on the tithe commutation map, No. 960, and on the remaining part of the north west by the remainder of the said borough of Neppiker; the description of the line of boundary dividing the said borough of Neppiker being as follows, that is to say, the said line of boundary commencing from the north west cerner of the said enclosure, No. 960, proceeds in an easterly direction along the northern fences of the enclosures marked, on the said tithe commutation map, Nos. 960, 961, 984, 990 to 992; it then proceeds north easterly along the north western fences of enclosures marked, on the said map, Nos. 992 and 1524, continuing along the northern fences of enclosures Nos. 1520 and 1519; it then crosses the road from Wrotham to Maidstone, and continues along a water course in a north easterly direction, passing on the south side of Ford-place and Mill, till it enters the parish of Addington, as the said district is shewn on the plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink; the said plan being copied or adopted from the tithe apportionment map of the parish of Wrotham, and the numbers therein corresponding with the numbers in the said tithe map:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be performed in the said church; and that all the fees arising therefrom should be paid and belong to the Minister of such church for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Lord Archbishop of Canterbury has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned Act and section; in testimony whereof, the said William Lord Archbishop of Canterbury has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Flitton, in the county of Bedford, and within the diocese of Ely, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more "effectual an Act, passed in the last session of

"Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," be assigned to the consecrated church at Silsoe, in the said parish of Flitton; and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Silsoe," and be bounded as follows, that is to say:
