other day than the first day of May or the first day of November respectively, the then next half-yearly payment shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the vicar making the vacancy, or his personal representatives, and his successor.

" And we further recommend and propose,

that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.
