oay of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to " make better provision for the spiritual care of po- "pulous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorizing the sale of certain property lately belonging to the prebend of Sacrista, in the collegiate church of Southwell.

" Whereas it is by the said recited Act enacted, that all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership as are possessed and enjoyed respecting. and over any lands, tenements, or other hereditaments whatsoever, by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements, and other hereditaments vested in us under certain Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property hereinafter described is so vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us by proper instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, with a certain proviso respecting the application of every sum of money received as the consideration or purchase money for the sale, transfer, or conveyance by us of any such lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments, or of any estate or interest therein, and with a further proviso, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments be sold, 2 transferred, or conveyed except by the authority
