Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them (not the Lord in Waiting), should be sent to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, before twelve o'clock, on the Monday previous to the Levee, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall hereafter be made at the Levee, but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that Gentlemen, who are to be presented at the Levee, will have their names distinctly written upon the card to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, in order that there may be no mistake in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half past one o'clock.

NOTICE is hereby given, that all persons, having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levee, are to write on two cards, with their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come; one card to be be delivered to the Page in the Ante-room, and the other to the Lord in Waiting, who will read its contents, at the time of presentation, to Her Majesty; and, on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.

And those Ladies, who are to be presented, are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, together with the names of the Ladies who are to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, before twelve o'clock on Tuesday the 24th of February next, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being 'Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall take place unless the name of the Lady presenting, together with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card to be delivered, corresponding with the names sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-second day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Stockport, in the county and diocese of Chester.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be

delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be, laid before your. Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parish of Stockport is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Stockport, described in the schedule hercunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hercunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes

accordingly; and that the same shall be named, "The District of Saint Mark, Dukinfield."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by, us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of SAINT MARK, DUKINFIELD, being-

" All that part of the district of Dukinfield, in the parish of Stockport, in the county and diocese of Chester, situate on the western side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan herewith) on the northern boundary of the said district of Dukinfield, and at the south western end of Dukinfieldbridge, in the town of Dukinfield, and thence extending southward, along the middle of the highway to Newton, to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Astley-street, in the said town of Dukinfield, and thence towards the south west, along the middle of such street, to a point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain occupation road leading to Newton-wood, and thence southward, along the middle of such road, and continuing in a straight direction with the eastern end of the branch from the Peak Forest Canal at Newton-wood, as far as the southern boundary of the said district of Dukinfield."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish, and of the church or chapel of the district out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Chester.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to carry into effect, with " certain modifications, the fourth report of the " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and " Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " for enabling ecclesiastical corporations, aggre-" gate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of " years," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An " Act to carry into effect, with certain modifi-"tions, the fourth report of the Commissioners " of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for enabling eccle-" siastical corporations, aggregate and sole, to " grant leases for long terms of years," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for determining the portion of the improved value to be made payable to us in a certain lease of quarries and beds of slate about to be granted by the dean and chapter of the cathedral church of Exeter.

"Whereas by the said last recited Act it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole (excepting as therein is excepted, which exception does not include the case of a dean and chapter), from time to time, with the consents in that behalf thereby required, and subject to the provisions in the same Acts contained, to grant or demise by lease, for

any term not exceeding sixty years, any mines, minerals, quarries, or beds belonging to such corporation:

"And whereas, in pursuance of the powers contained in the said recited enactment, it is proposed by the said dean and chapter, with the consent required by the same Acts, to grant and demise, by lease, certain quarries and beds, with the produce thereof, in and under certain lands, being part and parcel of the corporate estates of the said dean and chapter, and situate within the manor of Staverton, in the county of Devon:

"And whereas by the same Act it is further enacted, that, in case of any lease of mines, minerals, quarries, or beds granted thereunder, such portion of the improved value accruing under such lease, as by the authority provided in the first recited Act shall be determined, not being more than three fourth parts nor less than one moiety of such improved value, shall forthwith, and from time to time as the same shall accrue, be paid to us, and shall be subject to the provisions relating to monies payable to us:

"And whereas the improved value to accrue under the lease so proposed to be granted as aforesaid will, according to the meaning of the same Act, be the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made in such lease, after deducting the sum of ten pounds per annum, the present rent payable to the said dean and chapter in respect of the same premises:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that one half of the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made in the said lease so to be granted (subject to such deduction as aforesaid), whether consisting of rent, royalty, or otherwise, shall, by such lease, be made directly payable to us; and that we shall have all the like remedies, in respect of such one half of any such reservation as aforesaid, as if the same were a separate rent reserved to us a8 jessors or grantors and reversioners of the premises comprised in such lease, independently of the rights and remedies of the said dean and chapter, and their successors, in respect of the remaining one half thereof, without any priority or preference between us and the said dean and chapter for the time being; and, further, that we shall have full benefit and advantage, either Jointly with or separately from the said dean

and chapter, and their successors, for the time being, of all or any of the covenants, conditions, and agreements in the said lease contained on the lessee's part, in like manner as if we had been grantors, lessors, and reversioners as aforesaid, and as in such lease shall be expressed; and that, for effectuating such objects, the said lease shall and may be framed in such manner, and contain all such clauses and provisions as we shall approve; and shall have full force accordingly, any rule of law, statute, or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been given to the said dean and chapter, in accordance with the provisions of the first recited Act, and no objection has been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Exeter.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled " An Act to regulate the trade of the " British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council, to be issued from time to time, to give such directions and make such regulations, touching the trade and commerce to and from any British possessions on or near the Continent of Europe, or within the Mediterranean Sea, or in Africa, or within the limits of the East India Company's charter (excepting the possessions of the said company), as to Her Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary, any thing in the said Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and that if any goods shall be imported or exported in any manner contrary to any such Order of Her Majesty in Council, the same shall be forfeited, together with the ship importing or exporting the same :

And whereas it is expedient to appoint the port of Newcastle, in the colony of New South Wales, to be a free warehousing port; and that all privileges which are by law attached to free warehousing ports, in any of Her Majesty's possessions abroad, should attach to the said port:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by the authority of the said recited Act, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said port of Newcastle, in the said colony of New South Wales, shall be

a free warehousing port:
And the Right Honourable the Lord's Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable William Gladstone, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly as to them respectively appertain.

MY LORDS took into consideration the draft of certain Further Regulations respecting the Forms of Returns directed to be made by the Act 7th and 8th Victoria, cap. 110, and respecting the manner of making them, and have accordingly presented the herein under-mentioned Further Regulations in that behalf, and directed the same to be published in the London Gazette.

Joint Stock Companies Registration Act.
