their names thereon written, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them (not the Lord in Waiting), should be sent to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, before twelve o'clock, on the Monday previous to the Levee, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shal hereafter be made at the Levee, but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that Gentlemen, who are to be presented at the Levee, will have their names distinctly written upon the card to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, in order that there may be no mistake in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half past one o'clock:

NOTICE is hereby given, that all persons, having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levee, are to write on two cards, with their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come; one card to be be delivered to the Page in the Ante-room, and the other to the Lord in Waiting, who will read its contents, at the time of presentation, to Her Majesty; and, on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of "populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for assigning the right of patronage of the new parish of Darnall, in the county and diocese of York.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority therein provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), at any time to assign the right of patronage of any district or new parish constituted under the provisions of the said Act, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the like authority:

" And whereas by a scheme, duly prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council by us, and an

Order ratifying the same, made by your Majesty in Council on the thirteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and duly gazetted, the district of Darnall was duly constituted out of the chapelry of Attercliffe cum Darnall, in the parish of Sheffield, in the said county and diocese of York; and, a church having been duly approved by us and consecrated as the church of the said district for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, such district has since become, under the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, by the name of "The New Parish of Darnall:"

"And whereas the said scheme and Order contained no provision respecting the right of patronage of the said district or new parish:

"And whereas a sum of one hundred and twenty-nine pounds has been deposited with us, upon trust, to be applied in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient, as a permanent fund towards the repairs and maintenance of the fabric of the said church:

"And whereas the principal contributors towards the erection of the said church have, by an instrument in writing under their hands, nominated to us the five several persons hereinafter named and described, as trustees of the right of patronage in perpetuity of the said new parish, and of the nomination of the perpetual curate thereof, and have, in and by the same instrument, proposed that vacancies in the trusteeship of such patronage shall be filled up, from time to time, in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of the said new parish of Darnall, and the nomination of the perpetual curate thereof, shall be assigned to, and may be exercised in perpetuity by, the following persons, as trustees duly nominated to us for that purpose; that is to say, the Right Honourable Charles William Wentworth Earl Fitzwilliam, the Reverend Thomas Sutton, Doctor in Divinity, Vicar of Sheffield, the Reverend John Blackburn, Master of Arts, Incumbent of Attercliffe, in the said parish of Sheffield, the Reverend Alfred Ollivant, Doctor in Divinity, Regius Professor of Divinity in the University of Cambridge, and William Jeffcock, of High Hazles, in the county of York, Esquire, or the survivors or survivor of

them, continuing to be such trustees, and such future trustee or trustees, being a member or members of the United Church of England and Ireland, as the trustees or trustee for the time being, or the major part of them, shall, from time to time, nominate, by writing under his or their hands or hand, which he and they is and are hereby authorized and empowered to do, in the place and stead of any one or more trustee or trustees who shall, from time to time, die, resign, or become incapable of acting; provided always, that the number of such trustees shall not at any time exceed five.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

"Whereas it is by the herein-recited Act enacted, that the Acts therein recited, so far as they apply to making better provision for the cure of souls, shall extend to authorize the assigning, at any time and from time to time, to the incumbent of any church or chapel, whose fees, dues, or other emoluments shall be diminished by or in consequence of any proceeding under the provisions of the Act now in recital, and, if it be deemed fit by the authority therein provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), to his successors also, of such an annual sum as shall, upon due inquiry, appear to be a just and reasonable compensation for such diminution:

"And whereas by a scheme, duly prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council by us, and an Order ratifying the same, made by your Majesty in Council on the third day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and duly gazetted, the district of Codnor and Loscoe was duly constituted out of the parish of Heanor aforesaid; and, a church having been duly approved by us and consecrated as the church of the said district for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, such district has since become, under the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, by the name of "The New Parish of Codnor and Loscoe:"

"And whereas, by reason of the constituting of the said new parish, certain fees and emoluments arising therein, heretofore receivable or which would have been receivable by the vicar for the time being of the said parish of Heanor, if the said new parish had not been constituted as aforesaid, are and will be, under the authority of the said herein-recited Act, now receivable by the perpetual curate for the time being of the said

new parish, and the fees and emoluments of the living of Heanor aforesaid are and will be proportionately diminished; and whereas the average annual income of the said living of Heanor is of small amount, and it appears to us, upon due inquiry, to be just and reasonable that the annual sum hereinafter mentioned should be assigned to the vicar of Heanor, and his successors, as compensation for such diminution as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us to the vicar of Heanor for the time being, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, the fixed annual sum of eight pounds; and that on the first day of May next there shall be paid by us to such vicar three such half-yearly payments; and that in case of a vacancy in the said vicarage having occurred, or hereafter occurring, on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the vicar making the vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the succeeding vicar.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield.
