THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to carry into effect, with " certain modifications, the fourth report of the " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and " Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " for enabling ecclesiastical corporations, aggre-" gate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of " years," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-first day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An " Act to carry into effect, with certain modifi-" tions, the fourth report of the Commissioner's " of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for enabling eccle-" siastical corporations, aggregate and sole, to " grant leases for long terms of years," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for determining the portion of the improved value to be made payable to us in a certain lease of quarries or beds of stone about to be granted by the Reverend Arthur Leapingwell, Clerk, Vicar of the parish of Haydor, in the county and diorsve of Lincoln.

"Whereas by the said last sected Act it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole (excepting as therein is excepted, which exception does not include the case of a vicar), from time to time, with the consents in that behalf thereby required, and subject to the provisions in the same Acts contained, to grant or demise by lease, for any term not exceeding sixty years, any mines,

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minerals, quarries, or beds belonging to such corporation :

"And whereas, in pursuance of the powers contained in the said recited enactment, it is proposed by the said Arthur Leapingwell, as such Vicar as aforesaid, with the consents required by the same Acts, to grant and demise, by lease, certain quarries or beds of stone, with the produce thereof, in and under certain lands, being part and parcel of the glebe lands of the said parish, and situate, lying, and being therein :

"And whereas by the same Act it is further enacted, that, in case of any lease of mines, minerals, quarries, or beds granted thereunder, such portion of the improved value accruing under such lease, as by the authority provided in the first recited Act shall be determined, not being more than three fourth parts nor less than one moiety of such improved value, shall forthwith, and from time to time as the same shall accrue, be paid to us, and shall be subject to the provisions relating to monies payable to us:

"And whereas the improved value to accrue under the lease so proposed to be granted as aforesaid will, according to the meaning of the same Act, be the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made in such lease, after deducting one pound ten shillings per annum, the present value of the same premises, receivable by the said Arthur Leapingwell, as such Vicar as aforesaid :

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that one half of the whole net amount (subject to such deduction as aforesaid) of the reservation or reservations to be made in the said lease so to be granted, whether consisting of rent, royalty, or otherwise, shall, by such lease, be made directly payable to us; and that we shall have all the like remedies, in respect of such one half of any such reservation as aforesaid, as if the same were a separate rent reserved to us as lessors or grantors and reversioners of the premises comprised in such lease, independently of the rights and remedies of the said Arthur Leapingwell, Vicar of Haydor, and his successors, vicars of Haydor, in respect of the remaining one half thereof, without any priority or preference between us and the said vicar of Haydor for the time being ; and, further, that we shall have full benefit and advantage, either jointly with or separately from the said Arthur Leapingwell, and his successors, vicars of Haydor, for the time being, of all or any of the covenants, conditions, and agreements in the said lease contained on the lessee's part, in like manner as if we had been grantors, lessors, and reversioners as aforesaid, and as in such lease shall be expressed; and that, for effectuating such objects, the said lease shall and may be framed in such manner, and contain all such clauses and provisions as we shall approve, and shall have full force accordingly, any rule of law, statute, or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said re= cited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been given to the said Arthur Leapingwell, as such Vicar as aforesaid, in accordance with the provisions of the first recited Act, and he has made no objection thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lincoln.

WW HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act" " to amend and render more effectual an Act, " passed in the last session of Parliament, for " building, and promoting the building, of ad-" ditional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-second day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Halifax, in the west riding of the county of York, and within the diocese of Ripon, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Matthew, situate at Lightcliffe, in the said parish of Halifax, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render " more effectual an Act, passed in the last session " of Parliament, for building, and promoting the " building, of additional churches in populous " parishes;" and that such district should be named, " The Chapelry District of Lightcliffe," and be bounded as follows, that is to say :

" The boundary commences in the new road leading from Halifax where the said road crosses a brook north of Mytholm, and proceeds along the middle of that road south easterly till it comes to the road leading to Common-wood; it then proceds northerly up the middle of that road to the said wood; it then proceeds easterly along a footpath from the aforesaid wood, said to be a right of way, to the village of Hipperholme; thence by a stile through the street of the said village; thence northerly up the middle of the road, which passes through the said village, as far as the toll-bar; it then turns north easterly and proceeds along the middle of the road to Priestleygreen; and from thence along the footpath, said to be a right of way, running by the premises of Mr. James Sunderland, to Coley-mill, leaving Coley-mill on the north, in Coley, and the buildings near it on the east, in Lightcliffe; thence by a brook into Bob Den-wood, situate in the townships of Hipperholme and Shelf; thence by the boundary of these townships to another brook which separates the hamlet of Hipperholme from North Bierley; it then proceeds southerly down the said brook as far as the hamlet of Brighouse; and continues along the boundary of the said hamlet of Brighouse, in a south westerly direction, till it meets a watercourse; up which watercourse it then proceeds north westerly as far as the road at the point where the boundary commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured blue:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church at Lightcliffe; that one half of the fees to arise from marriages should belong and be paid to the Vicar for the time being of the said parish of Halifax; and that the other half of such fees, as also all the fees to arise from baptisms, churchings, and burials should belong and be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said church of Saint Matthew, at Lightcliffe:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fiftyninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore' humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
