WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual

"care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Bradford, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it

is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as hereinafter provided :

“ And whereas the said parish of Bradford is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this schedule, that all that part of the said parish of Bradford, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan

hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of Denholme Gate.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of DENHOLME GATE, being—  
 “ All that part of the township of Thornton, in the parish of Bradford, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, situate on the eastern side of an imaginary line, commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the southern boundary of the said township, and in the middle of the turnpike road from Halifax to Keighley, and thence extending northward, along the middle of such road, to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the new turnpike road leading out of the first-mentioned turnpike road, to the town of Bradford, and thence, towards the north east, along the middle of such new turnpike road, to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of another turnpike road leading from Denholme Gate to Bradford aforesaid, and thence, towards the north west, along the middle of such last-mentioned turnpike road, to a point (marked *d* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of another turnpike road leading to Bradford, commonly called Well Head-lane, and thence towards the north east, along the middle of such last-mentioned turnpike road, to a point (marked *e* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain lane called Back-of-the-Height-lane, and thence, in the same direction, along the middle of such last-mentioned lane, to a point (marked *f* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain other lane called Ten Yards-lane, and thence, towards the north west, along the middle of such last-mentioned lane, as far as the eastern fence of a certain piece of woody ground called Hollin-park, and thence northward, along such fence, as far as the boundary of the said township of Thornton.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patrons of the church of the parish, and to the incumbent and patron of the church or chapel of the chapelry, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the

said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and certain objections to the said scheme, offered by the incumbent of the said parish of Bradford, have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has, notwithstanding such objections, been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following following scheme, for constituting two separate districts for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Chester.

“Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until, after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as hereinafter provided:

“And whereas the said parish of Ashton-under-Lyne is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be respectively constituted separate districts in manner hereinafter set forth:

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all those parts of the said parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and therein numbered respectively 1. and 2.,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof respectively, are delineated and set forth in the maps or plans hereunto also annexed, and respectively numbered in like manner,—shall be constituted separate districts for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be respectively named as follows, that is to say; the district, numbered 1. in the said schedule, shall be named, “The District of Christ Church, Ashton-under-Lyne;” and the district, numbered 2. therein, shall be named, “The District of Hurst.”

“And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of each of the districts so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within either of such districts, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to the minister for the time being of such district, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within either of such districts shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such

district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said respective sums of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November, as the case may be, next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of either of such districts or new parishes shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ **SCHEDULE.**

No. 1.—“ The district of **CHRIST CHURCH, ASHTON-UNDER-LYNE**, being—

“ All that part of the parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Chester, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and numbered 1) on the western boundary of the said parish, and on the southern bank of the river Medlock, and thence extending towards the north east along such southern bank as far as the brook which flows into the said river at or near ‘Water-houses’ (marked *b* as aforesaid), and thence along the southern bank of such brook to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) at or near ‘the Hollows,’

where the said brook is crossed by a certain road or footpath leading thence to Smallshaw-green, and thence southward along the middle of such road or footpath, and along the middle of the road from Smallshaw-green aforesaid to Ashton, to a point (marked *d* as aforesaid) opposite to the south western corner of a certain field called Ousson-field, belonging to the Earl of Stamford and Warrington, and now in the occupation of William Miller, and thence eastward, along the southern fence of such field as far as the middle of Smallshaw-lane, and thence southward along the middle of such lane to a point (marked *e* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain road or footpath leading from ‘The Firs’ to ‘Hurst,’ and thence along the middle of such last-mentioned road or footpath as far as Yoke-brook, and thence along the middle of such brook as far as the middle of Warrington-street, and thence along the middle of such street as far as Katharine-street, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as Bentinck-street, and thence towards the north west along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as the middle of a certain new or intended street or road, forming a continuation of Wellington-road, and thence westward along the middle of such new or intended road as far as the boundary of ‘Ashton Moss,’ and thence first towards the south west along such boundary to its junction with the boundary of the said parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, and thence towards the north west along such last-mentioned boundary to the point where the said imaginary line commenced.

No. 2.—“ The district of **HURST**, being—

“ All that part of the said parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and numbered 2) on the boundary of the said district of Christ Church, Ashton-under-Lyne, at or near ‘The Hollows,’ and thence extending towards the north east, along the middle of the road leading to Lockingates, Lower-fold, Alt-hill, and Twarl-hill, to a point (marked *b* on the last-mentioned map) at or near Twarl-hill aforesaid, opposite to the middle of another road leading into Lily-lanes, and thence southward along the middle of such last-mentioned road, as far as the middle of another

road leading from Lily-lanes aforesaid to Hartshead-green, and thence eastward for a distance of ten chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of such last-mentioned road to a point (marked *c* on the said last-mentioned map) opposite to the middle of a certain road leading towards the reservoir belonging to the Ashton Waterworks Company, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such last-mentioned road to a point (marked *d* on the said last-mentioned map) where the said road terminates, and thence also towards the south east along the eastern fence of a certain field situate at the southern end of the said road, and belonging to the Earl of Stamford and Warrington, and now in the occupation of John Crowther, and along the eastern fence of a certain other field at the southern end of such last-mentioned field, and belonging to the said Earl of Stamford and Warrington, and in the occupation of the said John Crowther, to and across the said reservoir, and along the middle of the road leading thence to Hazlehurst, as far as the middle of the Ashton and Mossley turnpike road, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such last-mentioned road to its junction with Katharine-street aforesaid, and thence towards the north west, along the eastern fence of a certain field situate on the northern side of the said street, and at the eastern end thereof, and belonging to the said Earl of Stamford and Warrington, and now in the occupation of Ann Andrew, and along part of the eastern fence of a certain other field situate at the northern end of such last-mentioned field, and belonging to the said Earl of Stamford and Warrington, and now in the occupation of James Barlow, as far as the southern boundary of the division of Hartshead, and thence also towards the north west along such boundary as far as the boundary of the said district of Christ Church, Ashton-under-Lyne, and thence northward along such boundary to the point where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish, and of the church or chapel of the district, out of which it is intended that the districts therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the

provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the twenty-first section of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," as enlarged and extended by the twelfth section of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual the church building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twelfth day of February one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Saint Mary Abbots, Kensington, in the county of Middlesex, and within the diocese of London, it appears to them to be expedient, that an ecclesiastical district should, under the provisions of the twenty-first section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for build-

"ing, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," as enlarged and extended by the twelfth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual the church building Acts," be divided off from the said parish of Saint Mary Abbots, Kensington, and formed into a district parish, to be assigned to the church called Saint James's Church, recently erected and consecrated, and situate at Norlands, in the said parish of Saint Mary Abbots, Kensington; and that such district parish should be named, "The District Parish of Saint James, Norlands," and be bounded as follows, that is to say:

"On the west by the parish of Hammersmith; on the south by the chapelry district of Saint Barnabas, in the said parish of Saint Mary Abbots, Kensington, from which it is separated by proceeding from the said parish of Hammersmith, in an easterly direction, along the middle of the Uxbridge-road to a point opposite to Norlands or Greener-lane; and on the east and north by the district parish of Saint John, Notting-hill, from which latter parish it is divided by proceeding from the said Uxbridge-road, up the middle of the said Norlands or Greener-lane, as far as the house now occupied by William Sherman, the property of Benjamin Edward Hall, Esq. whence it proceeds in an easterly direction, along the south side of the said house, until it reaches the old open sewer and a wooden fence forming the western boundary of the estate of James Weller Ladbrooke, Esq. called the Kensington-park Estate, and the south western boundary of the estate of St. Quinton, Esq. and then proceeds in a north westerly direction, along the south western side of the said fence, till it reaches the said parish of Hammersmith, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon tinted blue:

"That the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Lord Bishop of London has been obtained thereto, as required by the said Act and section firstly hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles James Lord Bishop of London has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
