The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS an Act was passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "for the general regulation of the Customs," whereby it is, amongst other things, enacted, that the several sorts of goods enumerated in the table therein following, denominated "a table of prohibitions and restrictions inwards," shall either be absolutely prohibited to be imported, or shall be imported only under the restrictions mentioned in such table:

And whereas, among other sorts of goods, the following are enumerated in the said table, viz.

"Goods of places within the limits of the East India Company's charter, unless into ports approved of by the Lords of the Treasury, and declared, by Order in Council, to be fit and proper for such importation:"

And whereas the port of Preston has been approved of by the Lords of Her Majesty's Treasury for that purpose:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the port of Preston is fit and proper for the importation of goods of places within the limits of the East India Company's charter:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

### PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better "provision for the spiritual care of populous "parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual "care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Bingley and Bradford, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to eay, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same;

every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parishes of Bingley and Bradford are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such parishes hereinafter mentioned, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Bingley, and also all that part of the said parish of Bradford, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, "The District of Cullingworth."

thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in

pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

### " SCHEDULE.

" The district of Cullingworth, being-

"All that part of the hamlet of Harden, in the parish of Bingley, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, situate on the eastern and southern sides of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the boundary between the said hamlet and the township of Wilsden, in the parish of Bradford, in the same county and

diocese, and in the middle of the Halifax and Keighley road, and thence extending northward along the middle of such road to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Stablesbrow-road, and thence extending toward the north east, along the middle of such road, to a certain brook on the southern border of Leesmoor, and thence eastward, along the middle of such brook, to a point (marked c as aforesaid) near Eller Carr, where another brook flows into such first-mentioned brook, and thence northward, along the middle of such last-mentioned brook, as far as the border of Harden-moor, and thence towards the north east, along the boundary walls or fences between Harden-moor aforesaid and certain enclosures (numbered respectively 1, 5, 21, 17, 18, 19, 20, 53, 54, 55, 59, 60, 61, 62, on the map or survey of the hamlet of Harden, in the township of Bingley, for making the assessments for the relief of the poor of the said township, and deposited in the vestry of the parish church of Bingley aforesaid), and eastward, from the northern angle of the enclosure numbered 62 as aforesaid along the northern fence thereof, across the Harden and Cullingworth road; and along the middle of part of the road leading thence to Goitstock, and continuing eastward in a straight direction as far as the eastern boundary of the said hamlet of Harden; and also all that part of the upper division of the township of Wilsden, in the parish of Bradford, in the said county of York and diocese of Ripon, situate on. the western side of Hewnden-brook."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and certain objections to the said scheme, offered by the incumbent of the parish of Bradford, have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has, notwitstanding such objections, been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said. Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

Covesea Skerries Lighthouse and Beacon.

Edinburgh, April 10, 1846.

THE Commissioners of the Northern Lighthouses hereby give notice, that a lighthouse, to be called the Covesea Skerries Lighthouse, has been built upon the point of Craighead, in the county of

Elgin, the light of which will be exhibited on the night of the 15th of May 1846, and every night thereafter, from sun-set till sun-rise; and they farther give notice, that a beacon has been placed on that part of the Covesea Skerries, called Haliman's Scares, which lies off Craighead.

The following is a Specification of the Lighthouse, and the appearance of the Light, by Mr. Allan Stevenson, Engineer to the Commissioners.

The lighthouse is situated in N. latitude 57° 43′ 21″ and W. longitude 3° 20′ 14″. By compass it bears from Tarbetness Lighthouse S. E. by S. ½ S., distant 16½ miles; from Brough Head E. by S. ½ S., distant 5½ miles; from Stotfield Point W. N. W., distant 2 miles; from the Beacon on Haliman's Scares W. S. W. ¼ W., distant 1 mile; and from Scarnose N. W. by W. ¼ W., distant 16 miles.

The Covesea Skerries Light will be known to Mariners as a revolving light, which gradually attains its brightest state once every minute, and then as gradually declines, until, to a distant observer, it totally disappears. From W. by N. ½ N. to S. E. by E. ½ E. the light will be of the natural appearance; but from S. E. by E. ½ E. to S. E. ½ S. it will be coloured red. The lantern, which is open from W. by N. ½ N. round to S. E. ¼ S. in a northerly direction, is elevated 160 feet above the level of the Sea; and the light will be seen at the distance of six leagues, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere; and, to a near observer, in favourable circumstances, the light will not wholly disappear between the intervals of greatest brightness.

The beacon on Haliman's Scares bears from the lighthouse E. N. E. \( \frac{1}{4} \) E. It consists of frame work of iron, surmounted by a cylindric cage and a cross, and rises to the height of about 48 feet above high water. There are steps leading from the rock to the cage, in which a temporary shelter may be found in the event of shipwreck on the rock.

The Commissioners hereby further give notice, that, by virtue of a warrant from the Queen in Council, dated 13th September 1845, the following tolls will be levied in respect of this light, viz.

"For every British vessel (the same not belonging to Her Majesty, her heirs, and successors, or being navigated wholly in ballast), and for every foreign vessel which, by any Act of Parliament, Order in Council, Convention, or Treaty, shall be privileged to enter the ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, upon paying the same duties of tonnage as are paid by British vessels (the same not being vessels navigated wholly in ballast), which shall pass the said lighthouse upon the point of Covesea, or derive benefit thereby, the toll of one halfpenny per ton of the burden of every such vessel, for each time of passing the said lighthouse, or deriving benefit thereby; and double the said toll for every foreign vessel not so privileged."
