Sheffield, Buxton, Leek Potteries, and Crewe Railway.

Parliament, intituled "A Bill for making a railway from Buxton, in the county of Derby, to Stoke-upon-Trent, in the county of Stafford, with a branch to Congleton, in the county of Chester, to be called "The Sheffield, Buxton, Leek Potteries, and Crewe Railway," the plans and sections for which have been deposited, and the notices for which have been given as required by the Standing Orders of the two Houses of Parliament; now notice is hereby given, that it is desired by the parties promoting the said Bill to make an alteration in the said railway, consisting of a deviation of the proposed line of the said railway, leading from Leek to Meerbrook, in the parish of Leek, in the said county of Stafford, in a field marked number 255, in the said plans so deposited as aforesaid, and terminating at or near the same public highway, in the same parish, in a field, and numbered 184, on the said plans so deposited as aforesaid; and which alteration will be made entirely in the parish of Leek, in the county of Stafford; and that provision for such alteration is
