On sugar the growth and produce of China, Java, or Manilla, or of any foreign country the sugars of which Her Majesty in Council should have declared, or might thereafter declare, to be admissible as not being the produce of slave labour, and which should be imported into the United Kingdom, either from the country of its growth or from some British possession, having first been imported into such British possession from the country of its growth, the duties following (that is to say):

Brown sugar, being Muscovado or clayed, or any other sugar, not being equal in quality to white-

clayed, for every hundred weight 1 3 4 and so in proportion for any greater or less quantity than a hundred weight:

And by the said Act it was also enacted, that with regard to sugar the growth of any foreign country between which country and Her Majesty there was then subsisting any Treasy or Convention binding Her Majesty to grant to such country, either conditionally or unconditionally, the privileges of the most favoured nation, or to permit, either conditionally or unconditionally, the produce of such country to be imported into the United Kingdom at the same duties as are imposed upon the like produce of any country, it should be lawful for Her Majesty, from time to time, by any Order or Orders in Council, to declare that, from and after a day to be named in such Order, brown, Muscovado, or clayed sugars (not being refined), the growth of such country, in case such Treaty should continue to subsist, should, if imported from such country, or from any British possession abroad, having been imported into such British possession from such country, be admitted to entry for consumption in the United Kingdom, at the aforesaid respective rates of duty of one pound eight shillings, and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight, respectively, in like manner as sugars the growth and produce of China, Java, or Manilla:

And whereas a Treaty was, on the eighteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, concluded between His late Majesty King George the Fourth and the State of Colombia, containing, among other things, an agreement, that no higher or other duties should be imposed on the importation into the territories of His Britannic Majesty of any articles of the growth, produce, or manufacture of Colombia

than were or should be payable on the like articles, being the growth, produce, or manufacture of any other foreign country:

And whereas the Republic of New Granada was, at the time of the conclusion of the said Treaty, a part of the said State of Colombia:

And whereas the said Treaty was, at the time of the passing of the said Act, and still is subsisting between Her Majesty and the said Republic of New Granada, as having so been a part of the said State of Columbia as aforesaid:

And whereas application has been made on the part of the Government of the said Republic of New Granada, claiming under the said Treaty the admission of sugars, the growth of the dominions of the said Republic, at the said respective duties of one pound eight shillings and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that, from and after the first day of May next ensuing the date hereof, brown, Muscovado, or clayed sugars (not being refined), the growth of the dominions of the said Republic of New Granada, shall, if imported from the dominions of the said Republic, or from any British possession abroad, having been imported into such British possession from the said dominions, be admitted to entry for consumption into the United Kingdom at the aforesaid respective rates of duty of one pound eight shillings and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight, respectively; subject, nevertheless, to the production of the like certificates, and the making of the like declaration, as are in the said Act required, with respect to sugars the growth of China, Java, or Manilla:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions accordingly.

observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided :

" And whereas the said parish of Newcastleupon-Tyne is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of Durham, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,-all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,-shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, " The District of Saint Paul, High Elswick."

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be con-

Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen, on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of SAINT PAUL, HIGH ELSWICK, being-

" All that part of the township of Elswick, in the parochial chapelry of Saint John, in the

parish of Saint Nicholas, Newcastle-upon-Tyne; in the county of Northumberland, and in the diocese of Durham, situate on the northern side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the boundary of such township, in the middle of Elswick Dean-bridge, and thence extending eastward along the middle of the Scotswood-bridge turnpike road, and of Hinde-street, as far as the eastern boundary of such township, and also all that part of the township of West-gate, in the same chapelry, situate on the western side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked bas aforesaid) in the street or road called Gallowgate, on the boundary of the said chapelry, opposite to the middle of the Back-lane, otherwise called Oyster Shell-hall-lane, and thence extending towards the south west along the middle of such lane to a point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Abinger-street, and thence towards the north west along the middle of such street as far as the middle of Tindal-street, and thence southward along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as the middle of the Newcastle and Carlisle turnpike rood, and thence eastward along the middle of such turnpike road to a point (marked d as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Elswick-lane, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such last-mentioned lane as far as the township of Elswick aforesaid."

W HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for the further amendment of the " church building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parishes of Droxford and Bishops Waltham, in the county of Southampton, and within the diocese of Winchester, it appears to them to be expedient to unite certain contiguous parts of the said parishes, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry, for all ecclesiastical purposes, for the consecrated church of Saint Barnabas, situate at Swanmore, in the said parish of Droxford, under the provisions of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for the further amendment of the " church building Acts;" and that such consolidated chapelry should be named, " The Consolidated Chapelry of Swanmore;" the same being bounded on the south west by the chapelry district of Shidfield; on the north west by a line drawn, in a north easterly direction, from the most northerly point (marked by a boundary stone) of the said chapelry district of Shidfield, across the said parish of Bishops Waltham, to the most westerly point of the said-parish of Droxford,

so as to include, within the said consolidated chapelry of Swanmore, that portion of the said parish of Bishops Waltham which lies on the south eastern side of the said line; and, from that point, the said consolidated chapelry of Swanmore is bounded by the said parish of Bishops Waltham to a little beyond the northern corner of Little Phrymph-copse, where the boundary of such parish diverges from the Dundridge road; on the north and north east the said consolidated chapelry is bounded by the remaining part of the said parish of Droxford, from which it is separated by proceeding in an easterly direction, in a straight line from the point last mentioned, to the house called Swanmore-farm, and, passing down a valley south easterly, crosses the lane at the foot of Mayhill, and passes on towards the lane leading to Goodwin's-farm; it then proceeds south westerly, down the middle of that lane, towards the church at Swanmore, till it meets a footpath leading in a south easterly direction to the road which passes in front of Hill-place, along which footpath it then proceeds as far as the said road, and, crossing the same, continues in a straight line south easterly till it falls into the Droxford and Wickham road, at the intersection of that road with another road leading to Hambledon, southwards of St. Clair's-farm, along which latter road it proceeds as far as the river Drox; and on the south east the said consolidated chapelry is bounded by the said river Drox, which separates the said parish of Droxford from the parish of Somerton, as far as the said chapelry district of Shidfield, as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green and red :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it has been mutually agreed between them and the Right Reverend Charles Richard Bishop of Winchester, who is, in right of his see, patron of the rectories or parish churches of the said parishes of Droxford and Bishops Waltham, that the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to the said church and consolidated chapelry of Swanmore should belong to, be in, and be exercised (when occasion may require) by the rector for the time being of the said parish of Droxford : ^{**} That the consent of the said Charles Richard Bishop of Winchester has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign; in testimony whereof, the said Charles Richard Bishop of Winchester has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed consolidation and assignment be accordingly made, and the agreement in respect of the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate of the said church or consolidated chapelry be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
