

relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE:

“ The district of SAINT LUKE, JERSEY, being—

“ All that part of the parish of Saint Helier, and also all that part of the parish of Saint Saviour, and also all that part of the parish of Saint Clement, all in the island of Jersey, and in the diocese of Winchester, together bounded as follows, that is to say; on the southern side thereof by the sea coast, and on all other sides thereof by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the sea shore, near the Engineer Barracks, and opposite to the middle of the road leading from Harvre des Pas, and thence extending, first towards the north-west, along the middle of such road, as far as the middle of East-road, and thence first toward the north-east, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, and of Regent-road, and the road called La Chasse, as far as the middle of Colomberic-road, and thence eastward, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, and of Bagatelle-road or Rouge-rue, and Ellison's-road as far as the middle of Belvedere-road at the upper end of Elizabeth-place, and thence southward, along the middle of such road as far as the middle of the road called Ruettepaveé, and thence eastward, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, and across the Grouville-road, as far as the middle of Aubin's-lane, and thence towards the south east, along the middle of such last-mentioned lane and Flatbrook-lane, as far as the middle of the road called La Grand Charière, and thence towards the south west, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, as far as the sea shore aforesaid.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the patron of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, and to the incumbents of the churches of two of such parishes, that is to say, the parishes of Saint Clement and Saint Helier, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such draft has also been transmitted to the curate duly appointed to the church of the other of such

parishes, that is to say, the parish of Saint Saviour, in conformity with the provisions of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to explain and amend “ an Act for making better provision for the “ spiritual care of populous parishes;” and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Winchester.
