

And whereas application has been made on the part of the Government of the said Republic of New Granada, claiming under the said Treaty the admission of sugars, the growth of the dominions of the said Republic, at the said respective duties of one pound eight shillings and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that, from and after the first day of May next ensuing the date hereof, brown, Muscovado, or clayed sugars (not being refined), the growth of the dominions of the said Republic of New Granada, shall, if imported from the dominions of the said Republic, or from any British possession abroad, having been imported into such British possession from the said dominions, be admitted to entry for consumption into the United Kingdom at the aforesaid respective rates of duty of one pound eight shillings and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight, respectively; subject, nevertheless, to the production of the like certificates, and the making of the like declaration, as are in the said Act required, with respect to sugars the growth of China, Java, or Manilla:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions accordingly.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for raising the sum of eighteen millions three hundred and eighty thousand two hundred pounds, by Exchequer Bills, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six.

An Act to indemnify such persons in the United Kingdom as have omitted to qualify themselves for offices and employments, and to extend the time limited for those purposes, respectively, until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.

An Act to continue, until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and from thence to the end of the then next session of Parliament, the several Acts relating to insolvent debtors in India.

An Act to authorize the Inclosure of certain lands, in pursuance of the recommendation of the Inclosure Commissioners for England and Wales.

An Act for the abolition of the exclusive privilege of trading in burghs in Scotland.

An Act to amend and enlarge some of the provisions of the Acts relating to the Great Western Railway Company, and to confirm the purchase of certain railways by the said company.

An Act for altering, amending, and enlarging the powers and provisions of the several Acts passed in relation to the Monkland Navigation.

An Act to enable the United Company of Proprietors of the Ellesmere and Chester Canal to raise a further sum of money.

An Act for improving and maintaining the port and harbour of Helensburgh, in the county of Dumbarton.

An Act for constructing a wet dock and other works on the south side of the river Wear, at Sunderland near the Sea, in the county palatine of Durham.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Manchester and Salford Water Works to raise a further sum of money.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Glasgow Water Works to introduce an additional supply of water to the city and suburbs of Glasgow.

An Act for better supplying with water the city and neighbourhood of York.

An Act for better supplying with water the town and environs of Boston, in the county of Lincoln.

An Act for establishing a cemetery at Birmingham, in the county of Warwick.

An Act for granting more effectual powers for fighting with gas the town of Bury, and the neighbourhood thereof, in the parish of Bury, in the county palatine of Lancaster.

An Act for lighting with gas the town of Middleton and its vicinity, in the county of Lancaster.

An Act for enabling the Taunton Gas Light and Coke Company, incorporated by the Taunton Gas Act, 1845, to borrow additional money for the purposes of the company, and for confirming a purchase made by them for other purposes.

An Act for building a bridge across the river Medway, at Rochester, in the county of Kent, with approaches thereto, for taking down the present bridge, and for amending the Acts relating to the same.

An Act for inclosing lands in the parish of Willingham, in the county of Cambridge, and for draining and embanking certain fen lands and low grounds in the said parish.

An Act to incorporate the members of the Most Honourable and Loyal Society of Ancient Britons, commonly called the Welch Charity School, and to enable them the better to carry on their charitable designs.

An Act for enabling the trustees of the Enfield Chase road to make a deviation or alteration of the said road, from a point near the sixteenth mile stone, in the parish of North Mims, to the town of Hatfield, in the county of Hertford.
