PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign,

intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, " the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making additional provision for the cure of souls in certain parishes where such assistance is most required:

“ Whereas, under the authority of the said recited Acts, we have from time to time prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council certain schemes, in which we have recommended and proposed, that certain grants should be made, in augmentation of the incomes of certain benefices and churches, in certain classes, and subject to certain limitations, therein mentioned, which schemes have been ratified by Orders of your Majesty in Council, and such Orders have been duly gazetted :

“ And whereas, on the sixth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, we found it necessary to suspend, until further notice, our recommendations of further grants, with certain specified exceptions; and the several benefices and churches described in the schedules hereunto annexed either fall within such exceptions, or the incumbents thereof had, before the said sixth day of August, received specific promises from us that we would recommend the grants in the said schedules respectively proposed, in consequence of their coming within some or one of such classes, as aforesaid :

“ And whereas we have satisfied ourselves, after due inquiry, that the churches, described in the schedules hereunto annexed marked A. 1. and A. 2., fall within the first of such classes, subject to the respective limitations in the said Orders mentioned; and that the said churches are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the said schedules respectively :

“ And whereas from the source set opposite to the name of each of the benefices or churches, described in the schedule hereunto annexed marked B. in the sixth column of such schedule, the benefaction stated in the seventh column of the same schedule has been permanently secured to the incumbent of such benefice, as therein respectively specified; and we have satisfied ourselves that the said last-mentioned benefices and churches fall within the second of such classes, as limited by the said Orders; and are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented, by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the same schedule :

“ And whereas the benefices and churches, described in the schedule hereunto annexed marked C., fall within the third class in the said Orders

mentioned, and are situate within the places set opposite to the names thereof respectively in the fifth column of the same schedule; and certain tithes or lands now vested in us arise or are situate in such places respectively; and, after due inquiry and consideration, we have satisfied ourselves, that the same benefices and churches are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented, by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the same schedule :

“ And whereas, by reason of the appropriation of certain fees arising within a district recently assigned to a new church, the existing incumbent of the benefice of Stainton, mentioned in the schedule hereunto annexed marked D., will sustain an annual average loss to the amount set opposite the name of such benefice in the last column of the same schedule, and it is in our opinion expedient that compensation to the same amount should be made to such incumbent :

“ We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the incumbent for the time being of each of the benefices and churches so described in the said schedules marked respectively A. 1., A. 2., B., C., and D., the fixed annual sum set opposite to the name of such benefice or church, in the last column of the said schedules respectively; by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year; and that the first such half-yearly payment shall, in each case, be made on the first day of May next, except in the cases of Cwm, Nevyn, North Wootton, and West Tarring, the incumbents whereof shall, on such last-mentioned day, receive two such half-yearly payments, and except also in the cases of Appledore and Stainton, the incumbents whereof shall, on such last-mentioned day, receive four such half-yearly payments, and except also in the case of St. Thomas, Stepney, the incumbent whereof shall, on such last-mentioned day, receive seven such half-yearly payments, provided that, in the case of West Tarring, the annual sum recommended to be paid to the incumbent thereof shall be, and be taken to be, in lieu and full satisfaction of any pension, stipend, or other payment charged upon the sinecure rectory of West Tarring, and payable to him, or which may have been heretofore usually or accustomedly paid by the holder of such sinecure

rectory to him as such incumbent, and in the case of Empingham in lieu of the annual sum of five pounds heretofore charged on the prebend or rectory and parsonage of Empingham, and payable to the Vicar of Empingham; and that, in case of a vacancy in any of the benefices or churches contained in the said five schedules having already happened during the period over which the payment so recommended and proposed extends, or hereafter happening on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the incumbent making the vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the incumbent succeeding to the benefice or church so becoming or having become vacant.

“ And whereas we have satisfied ourselves that the several benefices and churches, contained in the schedule hereunto annexed marked E., fall within the third class aforesaid, we, therefore, recommend and propose, that, in order to provide fit houses of residence for the incumbents of all the benefices and churches contained in the last-mentioned schedule, we shall be at liberty to pay, to such persons and at such times as shall appear to us from time to time to be expedient, such a sum or sums of money, in the case of each such

benefice or church, as shall be required for providing a fit house of residence for the incumbent thereof.

“ And we recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent the further augmentation of any of such benefices or churches, if it shall be deemed fit, when there shall be sufficient means for that purpose; and that if it shall appear to us to be expedient, at any future time, that instead of the annual sum then in course of payment by us to the incumbent of any benefice, or instead of any part of such annual sum, any land, tithe, or other hereditament should be conveyed to such benefice in fee, nothing herein or in any other scheme contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing such a substitution; provided that no such change shall take effect before the then next vacancy of the benefice affected thereby, without the written consent of the then existing incumbent.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure for making better provision for the cure of souls, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them.”

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend an Act for the regulation of municipal corporations

"in England and Wales," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that if the inhabitant householders of any town or borough in England or Wales shall petition His Majesty to grant to them a charter of incorporation, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any such charter, if he shall think fit, by the advice of His Privy Council, to grant the same, to extend to the inhabitants of any such town or borough, within the district to be set forth in such charter, all the powers and provisions of the Act of the fifth and sixth William the Fourth, cap. 76, for regulating corporations, whether such town or borough be or be not a corporate town or borough, or be or be not named in either of the schedules to the said Act; provided, nevertheless, that notice of every such petition, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by His Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, one month at least before such petition shall be so considered :

And whereas the inhabitant householders of the boroughs of Honiton, in the county of Devon, and Yeovil, in the county of Somerset, have presented petitions to Her Majesty in Council, praying, that charters of incorporation may be granted to the said boroughs respectively; Her Majesty was this

day pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said petitions be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on Wednesday the twenty-fourth day of June next.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for granting to Her Majesty, for a term to be limited, certain duties on sugar imported into the United Kingdom," it was enacted; that from and after the fourteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, until the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, there should be charged, amongst other duties of Customs, the following (that is to say):

On sugar the growth and produce of China, Java, or Manilla, or of any foreign country the sugars of which Her Majesty in Council should have declared, or might thereafter declare, to be admissible as not being the produce of slave labour, and which should be imported into the United Kingdom, either from the country of its growth or from some British possession, having first been imported into such British possession from the country of its growth, the duties following (that is to say):

White-clayed sugar, or sugar rendered by any process equal in quality to white-clayed, not being refined, for every hundred weight 1 8 0

Brown sugar, being Muscovado or clayed, or any other sugar, not being equal in quality to white-clayed, for every hundred weight 1 3 4

and so in proportion for any greater or less quantity than a hundred weight:

And by the said Act it was also enacted, that with regard to sugar the growth of any foreign country between which country and Her Majesty there was then subsisting any Treaty or Convention binding Her Majesty to grant to such country, either conditionally or unconditionally, the privileges of the most favoured nation, or to permit, either conditionally or unconditionally, the produce of such country to be imported into the United Kingdom at the same duties as are imposed upon the like produce of any country, it

should be lawful for Her Majesty, from time to time, by any Order or Orders in Council, to declare that, from and after a day to be named in such Order, brown, Muscovado, or clayed sugars (not being refined), the growth of such country, in case such Treaty should continue to subsist, should, if imported from such country, or from any British possession abroad, having been imported into such British possession from such country, be admitted to entry for consumption in the United Kingdom, at the aforesaid respective rates of duty of one pound eight shillings, and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight, respectively, in like manner as sugars the growth and produce of China, Java, or Manilla:

And whereas a Treaty was, on the eighteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, concluded between His late Majesty King George the Fourth and the State of Colombia, containing, among other things, an agreement, that no higher or other duties should be imposed on the importation into the territories of His Britannic Majesty of any articles of the growth, produce, or manufacture of Colombia than were or should be payable on the like articles, being the growth, produce, or manufacture of any other foreign country:

And whereas the Republic of New Granada was, at the time of the conclusion of the said Treaty, a part of the said State of Colombia:

And whereas the said Treaty was, at the time of the passing of the said Act, and still is subsisting between Her Majesty and the said Republic of New Granada, as having so been a part of the said State of Colombia as aforesaid:

And whereas application has been made on the part of the Government of the said Republic of New Granada, claiming under the said Treaty the admission of sugars, the growth of the dominions of the said Republic, at the said respective duties of one pound eight shillings and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order; and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that, from and after the first day of May next ensuing the date hereof, brown, Muscovado, or clayed sugars (not being refined), the growth of the dominions of the said Republic of New Granada, shall, if imported from the dominions of the said Republic, or from any British possession abroad, having been imported into such British possession from the said dominions, be admitted to entry for consumption into the United Kingdom at the aforesaid respective rates of duty of one pound eight shillings and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight, respectively; subject, nevertheless, to the production of the like certificates, and the making of the like declaration, as are in the said Act required, with respect to sugars the growth of China, Java, or Manilla:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions accordingly.
