Foreign-Office, July 10, 1846.

IT is hereby notified, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Minister in Mexico, a dispatch containing the copy of a notice sent on the 20th of May last to Captain Pelly, the Commander of Her Majesty's ship *Rose*, by Captain Fitzhugh, the Senior Officer of the United States' Naval Forces off the port of Vera Cruz, declaring that port to be blockaded by the said naval forces.

It is also hereby notified, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a dispatch, dated the 21st of May last, from Her Majesty's Consul at Tampico, enclosing the copy of a letter which he had received from Commander Saunders, of the following tenor :

" *U. S. Ship St. Mary's, off Tampico*
" SIR, *Bar, May 20, 1846.*

" In consequence of Mexico having commenced hostilities against the United States, I have been ordered by the Commander in Chief of the

American squadron on this station to blockade the Port of Tampico. Please consider this the official announcement of that fact; and do me the favour to communicate it to all whom it may concern. Vessels now in port will be allowed to sail with or without cargo at any time before the 15th of June; *neutral non-commercial mail packets* are free to enter and depart, and *Mexican boats, engaged exclusively in fishing, will be allowed to pursue their labours unmolested.* Do me the favour to give publicity to this last immediately, for the benefit of the humble class to whom it refers.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS by our Order in Council of the nineteenth of May, in the present year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the ninth year of our reign, we were graciously pleased, for the reasons therein contained, to annul the Royal Proclamation of His late Majesty King William the Fourth of the third day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, directing that distribution should be made of the net proceeds of prizes captured from the enemy, of captures and seizures, under the several Acts passed relating to the revenues of Customs, and to trade and navigation, for the abolition of the slave trade, and for the capture and destruction of piratical vessels, and of the rewards conferred for the same, as well as of awards and allowances of salvage granted to the officers and men of ships and vessels of war, when not otherwise specially apportioned by the terms of the respective awards and allowances: and whereas in the recital of the said Order in Council in our Royal Proclamation, dated the said nineteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, the following words, that is to say, "as well as of awards and allowances of salvage granted to the officers and men of ships and vessels of war, when not otherwise specially apportioned by the terms of the respective awards and allowances," were by mistake omitted, and it is expedient that such mistake should be corrected: now, therefore, we do make known to all our loving subjects, and all

others whom it may concern, by this our Royal Proclamation, by and with the advice and consent of our Privy Council, that our said Proclamation of the said nineteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-six shall have the same force and effect, to all intents and purposes, as if the said words so omitted by mistake had been inserted therein.

Given at our Court at Buckingham-palace, this sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the tenth year of our reign.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws respecting the office of county coroner," it is enacted, "that whenever it shall appear to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that any county has been customarily divided into districts, for the purpose of holding inquests, during the space of seven years before the passing of the said Act, and it shall seem expedient to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, that the same division of the county be made under the said Act, each of such districts shall be assigned to the coroner usually acting in and for the same district before the passing of the said Act."

And whereas the justices of the peace for the county of Camarthen, in quarter sessions assembled, have presented a petition to Her Majesty, representing that by an Act, passed in the session held in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the law respecting the office of county coroner," reciting "that the regulations for the elections of coroners for counties are insufficient, and that it is expedient that an alteration should be made in the manner of making such elections," it is

enacted, "that whenever it shall appear to Her Majesty, on the petition of the justices in quarter sessions assembled, and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that any county has been customarily divided into districts, for the purpose of holding inquests, during the space of seven years before the passing of the said Act, and it shall seem expedient to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, that the same division of the county be made under the said Act, each of such districts shall be assigned to the coroner usually acting in and for the same district before the passing of the said Act :

"That Her Majesty's petitioners respectfully represent, that the county of Carmarthen has been customarily divided into two districts, for the purpose of holding inquests, during more than the space of seven years before the passing of the said Act (independently of a certain district called the liberty of Kidwelly, which comprises the commott of Kidwelly, the commott of Carnawllon, and the commott of Iskennen), the appointment of coroner whereof takes place otherwise than under the writ de coronatore eligendo :

"That the eastern or Llandilo district of the said county comprises the following parishes and parts of parishes, viz. the whole of the parish of Llandilofaur not in the said liberty, the whole of the parish of Lanegwad lying on the east side of the river Cothy down to the river Towy, and the several parishes of Llangadock, Llandausant, Mothvey, Llanfairylryn, Cilycwm, Conwillyaye, Llanyerwys, Pencarreg, Llanybyther, Llanllwny, Llanfihangel-rhose-y-Corn, Brechva, Llanfynydd, Llangathen, Llanfihangel-Cilfargen, Llandyveyson, Talley, Llansawel, Llansadwrn, Llanwrda, and Llandingat :

"That the western or St. Clears district comprises the following parishes and parts of parishes, namely; Eglwys cymmin, Eglwysfair a cherrig, Egremont, Henllanangoed, Riffig, Cilymacnllwyd, Llandawke, Llandilo, Abercowin, Llandewror, Llandissilio, Llangan, Llanginning, Llanglydwen, Llanfihangel abercowin, Llansadwrnen, Llanfalteg, Llanivinio, Llangharne parish and township, Marros, Mydrim, Pendine, Saint Clears, Abergwilly, Abernant, Conwil Elvet, Llangain,

Llangunnoch, Llanllawddog, Llanpimpisaint, Llanstephan, Merthyr, Newchurch, Treleacharbettws, Cenarth, Cilnhedin, Llanfihangel ar arth, Llangeler, Pemboyr, and so much of the parish of Lanegwad as lies on the west side of the river Cothy :

"That Daniel Price, Esquire, of Talley, in the said county of Carmarthen, is the coroner acting in and for the said eastern or Llandilo district ; and that George Thomas, junior, Esquire, of the county of the borough of Carmarthen, is the coroner acting in and for the said western or St. Clears district :

"And, therefore, praying, that the eastern district of the said county be assigned to the said Daniel Price ; and the said western or Saint Clears district of the said county to the said George Thomas :

"And they further humbly recommend, that the court for the election of coroner of the eastern district of the said county be held at Llandilo, in the said county ; and the court for the election of coroner of the western district of the said county be held at Saint Clears, in the said county."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said petition into consideration, doth, pursuant to the said Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her reign, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, declare, order, and direct, that the eastern district of such county be assigned to the said Daniel Price, and the western or St. Clears district of the said county to the said George Thomas :

And it is hereby further declared, ordered, directed, and determined, that the courts to be holden for the purpose of the election of any coroner of any one or more of the said districts respectively, when and as often as the same shall become necessary under the provisions of the said recited Act, shall be as follows, that is to say, for the eastern district of the said county to be holden at Llandilo aforesaid, and the poll to be taken there, and for the western district of the said county to be holden at St. Clears aforesaid, and the poll to be taken there :

And it is hereby also further declared, ordered, and directed, that this Order shall be published in the London Gazette. *Wm. L. Bathurst.*

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend an Act for the regulation of municipal corporations in England and Wales," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that if the inhabitant householders of any town or borough in England or Wales shall petition His Majesty to grant to them a charter of incorporation, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any such charter, if he shall think fit, by the advice of His Privy Council, to grant the same, to extend to the inhabitants of any such town or borough, within the district to be set forth in such charter, all the powers and provisions of the Act of the fifth and sixth William the Fourth, cap. 76, for regulating corporations, whether such town or borough be or be not a corporate town or borough, or be or be not named in either of the schedules to the said Act; provided, nevertheless, that notice of every such petition, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by His Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, one month at least before such petition shall be so considered :

And whereas the inhabitant householders of the borough of Warrington, in the county of Lancaster, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, praying, that a charter of incorporation may be granted to the said borough; Her Majesty was this day pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said petition be taken into consideration, by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on Tuesday the eleventh day of August next.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the

session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the church building Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the tenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the several parishes of Saint John the Baptist and Saint Oswald, both in the city and diocese of Chester, it appears to them to be expedient to unite certain contiguous parts of the said parishes, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for the consecrated church, called Saint Paul's Church, situate in the said parish of Saint John the Baptist, for all ecclesiastical purposes, under the provisions of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of your Majesty, intituled "An Act for the further amendment of the church building Acts;" and that such consolidated chapelry should be named, "The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Chester," with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned :

"The consolidated chapelry of Saint Paul, Chester, is to consist of the township of Great Boughton (being an out-township and part of the said parish of Saint Oswald) and a portion of the said parish of Saint John the Baptist, including Spital Boughton; the part taken from the said parish being bounded on the north by the Ellesmere and Chester Canal; on the east by the said township of Great Boughton; on the south by the river Dee; and on the west by Stephen-street, the east side of which is included in the said consolidated chapelry, and then by a line passing from the end of Stephen-street, across Foregate-street, to the west of a public-house known by the sign of the Coach and Horses; and thence by an imaginary line drawn in a southerly direction through Mr. Baxter's grounds to the river Dee. The part taken from the said parish of Saint Oswald, and called the township of Great Boughton, as aforesaid, being bounded on or towards the north by the parish of Plemstall; on the west by the respective parishes of Plemstall,

Saint John the Baptist, and Saint Bridget; and on the south and east by the respective parishes of Guilden, Sutton, Christleton, and a part of the said parish of Saint Oswald, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green and yellow :

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it has been mutually agreed between the patrons of the parish churches of the said parishes of Saint John the Baptist and Saint Oswald, with the approbation of your Majesty’s Commissioners, and the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in whose diocese the said parishes are situate, that the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to the said church and consolidated chapelry of Saint Paul, Chester, should belong to, be in, and exercised, when occasion may require, by the Vicar for the time of the said parish of Saint John the Baptist, Chester :

“ That the consents of the said John Bird Bishop of Chester, and of the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin, at Chester, the patrons of the parish church of the said parish of Saint Oswald, and also of the Most Honourable Richard Marquess of Westminster, the patron of the parish church of the said parish of Saint John the Baptist, have been severally obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty’s reign; in testimony whereof, the said John Bird Bishop of Chester, the said Dean and Chapter of the said cathedral church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin, at Chester, and the said Richard Marquess of Westminster, have signed and sealed this representation :

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with

the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed consolidation and assignment be accordingly made, and the agreement, in respect of the right of presentation, nomination, and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate of the said church and consolidated chapelry, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
