AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 6th day of *July* 1846,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, on the fourth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, an Order was made by Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, in the terms following :

“ Whereas by an Order of Her Majesty, made, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, on the seventh day of September one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, for regulating, within the colonies of British Guiana, Trinidad, Saint Lucia, and Mauritius, respectively, the relative rights and duties of masters and servants, it is, amongst other things, ordered, that no contract of service shall be of any force or effect within any of the colonies aforesaid, unless the same shall be made within the limits and upon the land of the colony in which the same is to be performed; and it is thereby further ordered, that no written contract of service shall be in force within any of the said colonies, unless it shall be signed with the

name, or, in case of illiterate persons, with the mark of each of the contracting parties, in the presence of a stipendiary magistrate, nor unless such stipendiary magistrate shall subscribe the written contract, in attestation of the fact that it was entered into by the parties voluntarily, and with a clear understanding of its meaning and effect :

“ And whereas it is desirable that the said recited provisions of the said Order in Council should be modified in manner hereinafter mentioned, in reference to the case of labourers, of African birth or descent, emigrating to the colonies aforesaid, from places, the inhabitants of which may reasonably be presumed to be so far cognizant of the state and prospects of labourers in agriculture and manufactures within the said colonies, as to be competent to protect their own interests in any contracts entered into beyond the precincts of such colonies for services to be performed therein :

“ And whereas persons emigrating from the Continent of North America may reasonably be presumed to be so competent; it is, therefore, ordered, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty,

by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that, in respect of persons, of African birth or descent, emigrating from the Continent of North America to the colonies aforesaid, or any of them, the above-recited provisions of the said Order in Council, of the seventh September one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, shall be, and the same are hereby, revoked; provided nevertheless, and it is hereby further ordered, that no contract of service within the said colonies, or either of them, if entered into with any emigrant of African birth or descent from the Continent of North America, beyond the limits and off the land of the colony within which such labour is to be performed, shall be of any force or effect therein, unless the same shall be in writing, and shall be signed with the name, or, in case of illiterate persons, with the mark of each of the contracting parties, in the presence of some officer or person in Her Majesty's service, previously designated for that purpose by one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, nor unless such officer or person as aforesaid shall subscribe such written contract, in attestation of the fact that it was entered into by the parties voluntarily, and with a clear understanding of its meaning and effect; and it is hereby ordered, that any contract entered into in the manner hereinbefore described shall be received in evidence in any colony without further proof, provided that such contracts shall be certified in such manner as Her Majesty shall, from time to time, direct; provided always, that, save as hereinbefore excepted, nothing herein contained shall be construed to revoke the said recited Order, or any part thereof, so far as respects the case of persons emigrating from the Continent of North America to the colonies aforesaid, or to any of them; and that the provisions of the same shall be applicable to any contracts of service, so to be made as aforesaid, with such persons beyond the limits and off the land of such colonies, in the same manner as if the same had been made within the limits and on the land thereof:

"And the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly."

And whereas it is expedient that the above-recited Order should be revoked; it is, therefore, ordered by Her Majesty, by and with the advice o

Her Privy Council, that the said above-recited Order shall be, and the same is hereby, revoked accordingly; and the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly. *Wm. L. Bathurst.*

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Eccles and Manchester, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such

scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided :

“And whereas the said parishes of Eccles and Manchester are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such parishes hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Eccles, and also all that part of the said parish of Manchester, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “The District of Paddington.”

“And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day

of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of **PADDINGTON**, being—

“ All that part of the district of **Pendleton**, in the parish of **Eccles**, in the county of **Lancaster**, and in the diocese of **Chester**, and also all that part of the district of **Christ Church, Salford**, in the parish of **Manchester**, in the same county and diocese, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of **Cross-lane**, in the town of **Salford**, opposite to the middle of **High-street**, and thence extending westward along the middle of such street, to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain lane leading to **Tanners-lane** and **Broad-street**, in **Pendleton** aforesaid, and thence towards the north west, along the middle of such lane, to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain footpath leading to the southern end (marked *d* as aforesaid) of another lane leading into **Broad-street** aforesaid, and thence eastward along the middle of such footpath, and northward, along the middle of such last-mentioned lane, as far as the middle of **Broad-street** aforesaid (marked *e* as aforesaid), and thence towards the south east, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, to a point (marked *f* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of **Frederick-street**, and thence northward, along the middle of such street, as far as the middle of a certain lane leading to the **Manchester, Bolton, and Bury Railway**, and thence towards the north east, along the middle of such last-mentioned lane, as far as the south western side of such railway, and thence towards the south east, along such south western side of the same railway, as far as the boundary of the said district of **Pendleton**,

and thence westward, along such boundary, to a point (marked *g* as aforesaid) at the northern end of **Cross-lane** aforesaid, and thence southward along the middle of such last-mentioned lane to the point where the said imaginary line commenced.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes, and of churches or chapels of the districts, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to explain and amend an Act for making better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes;” and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the **London Gazette**, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of **Chester**.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council

a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to make better provision for the spiritual care " of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorizing the sale of certain property now belonging to the prebend of Finsbury, in the cathedral church of Saint Paul, in London.

" Whereas it is by the said recited Act enacted, that all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tenements, or other hereditaments whatsoever by any absolute owner thereof; shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements, and other hereditaments vested and liable to be vested in us, under the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property hereinafter mentioned is liable to be vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts, and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us, by proper instruments duly executed according to law; provided always, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments as aforesaid shall be sold, transferred, or conveyed except by the authority in the said Acts provided, that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme :

" And whereas the message and premises, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, now form part of the endowment of the said prebend of Finsbury, and will, as such, become vested in us, upon the next avoidance of the said prebend :

" And whereas we have contracted for the sale of our reversionary interest in the said message and premises, for the purpose of the same being permanently appropriated as a parsonage house for the rector for the time being of the united rectories of Saint Margaret, Lothbury, and Saint Christopher le Stocks, in the city of London :

" We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized to sell and duly to convey, for the purpose aforesaid, all our estate and interest in the said message and premises, according to the provisions of the said recited Act.

" And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matter aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" All that message, tenement, or dwelling-house, with the garden, yard, stables, coach-house, and other out-buildings thereto adjoining and belonging, situate and being on the north side of, and numbered 20 in, Finsbury-square, in the parish of Saint Luke, in the county of Middlesex, and part of the manor of Finsbury, being the sixth house westward from the north east corner of the said square, as the site of the said premises contains from east to west, at the south end fronting Finsbury-square aforesaid, twenty-four feet of assize, little more or less; and from south to north, on the west side, one hundred and seventy-nine feet eight inches of assize, little more or less; and from west to east, at the north end fronting a public road or highway, twenty-four feet of assize, little more or less; and from north to south, on the east side, one hundred and eighty-one feet five inches of assize, little more or less; which said premises were formerly in the occupation of Anthony Moreland, and are now of the said John Banks Hollingworth, together with all ways, rights, and appurtenances thereunto belonging, and all such estate, right, title, and interest to and in the same, and every part thereof, as we are and each and every of us is or shall become seized or possessed of."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this

Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-third day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Ashbourne, in the county of Derby, and in the diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," be assigned to the church, called Holy Trinity Church, recently erected and consecrated at Clifton, in the said parish, and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Clifton," and be bounded as follows:

"On the north west and west by the parish of Mayfield, on the south west and south by the parishes of Snelstone and Edlaston, on the south

east by the parish of Osmaston, and on the east and north by the remaining part of the said parish of Ashbourne, from which it is separated by proceeding from the said parish of Osmaston, in a north easterly and northerly direction, at the distance of one hundred feet from the eastern side of Tutbury-lane, so as to include within the district the several cottages abutting on the said lane until it reaches the Old Derby-road; and, crossing that road, proceeds, in a northerly direction, along the eastern side of the road to Spital-hill to a point opposite the fence at the north eastern corner of the Upper Meadow, marked No. 137 on the map of the township of Clifton, belonging to the said parish of Ashbourne; and proceeds along that fence, westerly, and also the northern fence of Nether Meadow, No. 139, and then, in a north westerly direction, along the northern line of fences of Keepers Leas, No. 140, Keepers Leas, No. 141, and Keepers Leas, No. 142, and along the north eastern fence of Lady-grove, No. 143, and then enters the turnpike road from Ashbourne to Sudbury; and, crossing over that road, proceeds, in a south westerly direction, along the north western side of the said road to the south western fence of Corden's pasture, along which fence it proceeds; and then, crossing the brook, proceeds, in a north westerly direction, along the southern fence of Lower-close to the south eastern corner of fence of Lower-close, No. 49; and then proceeds, in a northerly direction, along the eastern fence of Lower-close, No. 49, as far as the north eastern corner thereof, and then continues along the northern fence of the said Lower-close, No. 49, in a westerly direction, as far as the western fence of Lower-close, No. 48, up which fence it then proceeds, northerly, and enters the turnpike road from Ashbourne to Leek; and, crossing over that road, proceeds, westerly and north westerly, along the northern side of the said road and Watery-lane; it then proceeds along the fences separating Watery-lane-meadow and Little Buckholme from Buckholme, No. 6, on the said map; and, crossing Bentley-brook, the boundary which separates the parish of Ashbourne from the parish of Mappleton, continues along the boundary line, north westerly, as far as the parish of Mayfield, where the boundary commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink:

“ That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church; and that all the fees arising therefrom should be reserved for and on account of and paid to the present Vicar of the said parish of Ashbourne during his incumbency thereof; but, upon his avoiding the vicarage or parish church of Ashbourne aforesaid, such fees should belong and be paid to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said church, called Holy Trinity Church, at Clifton aforesaid :

“ That the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lichfield has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Bishop of Lichfield has signed and sealed this representation :

“ Your Majesty’s Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS by our Order in Council of the nineteenth of May, in the present year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the ninth year of our reign, we were graciously pleased, for the reasons therein contained, to annul the Royal Proclamation of His late Majesty King William the Fourth of the third day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, directing that distribution should be made of the net proceeds of prizes captured from the enemy, of captures and seizures, under the several Acts passed relating to the revenues of Customs, and to trade and navigation, for the

abolition of the slave trade, and for the capture and destruction of piratical vessels, and of the rewards conferred for the same, as well as of awards and allowances of salvage granted to the officers and men of ships and vessels of war, when not otherwise specially apportioned by the terms of the respective awards and allowances : and whereas in the recital of the said Order in Council in our Royal Proclamation, dated the said nineteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, the following words, that is to say, “ as well as of awards and allowances of salvage granted to the officers and men of ships and vessels of war, when not otherwise specially apportioned by the terms of the respective awards and allowances,” were by mistake omitted, and it is expedient that such mistake should be corrected : now, therefore, we do make known to all our loving subjects, and all others whom it may concern, by this our Royal Proclamation, by and with the advice and consent of our Privy Council, that our said Proclamation of the said nineteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-six shall have the same force and effect, to all intents and purposes, as if the said words so omitted by mistake had been inserted therein.

Given at our Court at Buckingham-palace, this sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the tenth year of our reign.
