'The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for "the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the first day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for assigning the future patronage (after the next nomination) of the new parish of Saint Andrew, Leeds, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

" Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority therein provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared. by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), at any time to assign the right of patronage of any district or new parish constituted under the provisions of the said Act, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the like authority:

" And whereas by a scheme, duly prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council by us, and an

Order ratifying the same, made by your Majesty in Council on the twenty-eighth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and duly gazetted, the district of Saint Andrew, Leeds, was duly constituted out of the district of Saint George, Leeds, in the parish of Leeds, in the said county and diocese; and, a church having been duly approved by us and consecrated as the church of the said district for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, such district has since become, under the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, by the name of "The New Parish of Saint Andrew, Leeds:"

- "And whereas the said scheme and Order contained no provision respecting the right of patronage of the said district or new parish, after the two first nominations of the minister or perpetual curate thereto:
- "And whereas certain persons have contributed a sum of twelve hundred pounds, to be applied towards the erection of a house of residence for the perpetual curate of such new parish:
- "And whereas the principal contributors towards such house of residence have, by an instrument in writing under their hands, nominated to us John Gott, of Leeds aforesaid, Esquire, as the future patron in perpetuity of such new parish, after the next nomination of a perpetual curate thereto:
- "Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Leeds, and the nomination of the perpetual curate thereof, shall, after the next such nomination, be assigned to, and absolutely vested in, the said John Gott, his heirs and assigns for ever.
- "And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law

immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for "the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the 1st day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

- "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An "Act to make better provision for the spiritual "care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Perranzabuloe, Saint Agnes, Kenwyn, and Kea, and the district of Chacewater, all in the county of Cornwall, and in the diocese of Exeter.
- "Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by

the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the-patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parishes of Perranzabuloe, Saint Agnes, Kenwyn, and Kea, and district of Chacewater, are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such parishes and district hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present con-

tains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Exeter, in testimony whereof he has signed and scaled this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Perranzabuloe, and also all that part of the said parish of Saint Agnes, and also all that part of the saidparish of Kenwyn, and also all that part of the said parish of Kea, and also all that part of the said district of Chazewater, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,-all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan-hereunto also annexed,-shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, " The District of Mithian."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on . the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of MITHIAN, being-

" All those parts of the parishes of Perranzabuloe, Saint Agnes, Kenwyn, and Kea, and the district of Chacewater, all in the county of Cornwall, and in the diocese of Exeter, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) where a road from Truro to Saint Agnes crosses a certain stream at or near a certain place called Gollah Water; and thence extending westward along the middle of such road to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of another road leading from Truro aforesaid to Perran-porth; and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned road to a point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of another road leading from suck lastmentioned road to 'Blowing House Bridge,' situate on a stream which divides Perranzabuloe from Saint Agnes; and thence westward along the middle of such road and across the said bridge to the boundary hedge between Trewartha Estateand Trevelles Downs; and thence also westward along such boundary hedge as far as the northwestern corner (marked d as aforesaid) of the said estate, and of a field numbered 1873 in the parish map of Saint Agnes; and thence first northward and then westward along the boundary between Mithian Estate and Trevelles Downs aforesaid as

far as the north western corner (marked e as aforesaid) of such last-mentioned estate; and thence southward along a certain stream dividing Mithian from Goonlaze, as far as Wheal Butsen Bridge (marked f as aforesaid); and thence westward along the middle of a certain lane leading from such last-mentioned bridge to a road from Saint Agnes to Mingoose Barrow, as far as the south western corner (marked g as aforesaid) of Presingol Estate, and also of a field in that estate numbered 1311 on the said parish map; and thence towards the south west along the middle of such last-mentioned road as far as Mingoose Barrow aforesaid; and thence along the eastern boundary hedge of Trenithic Estate to the south eastern corner thereof; and thence also towardsthe south west and in a straight direction to the eastern corner of Gooswarra Estate; and thence in a like direction to the north west corner (marked h as aforesaid) of a certain field numbered: 3056 on the said parish map, and now in the occupation of Richard Traeran; and thence southward: along the middle of a lane leading from such lastmentioned field to Edwards's Brewery, at Blackwater, to the county road leading to Redruth and the Land's End; and thence towards the south west along the middle of such last-mentioned road. to a point (marked i as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain lane leading to Hallum Beagle Mine, and thence first southward along the middle of such last-mentioned lane through Jolly Bottomand by Killawarres Consols Mine, and across the boundary between the said district of Chacewater and the parish of Kea, to the middle of a certain. road from Blackwater through Rose Valley; and thence first eastward along the middle of such lastmentioned road, across the boundary between the said parishes of Kenwyn and Kea, and across the high road between Saint Agnes and Truro, at 41/2 miles from Truro, to a point (marked j as aforesaid) near a certain place called 'Sun Rising,' and opposite to the middle of a certain lane leading thence to a stream which forms the boundary between the manor of Tregavethan and the parishof Kenwyn; and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned lane as far as the said stream; and thence first westward along the middle of such last-mentioned stream to the south western corner (marked k as aforesaid) of the said manor of Tregavethan; and thence towards the north east along the boundary stones of such

manor and the said parish of Perranzabuloe to a point (marked l as aforesaid) at a certain place called the 'Four Barrows,' and between the second and third barrow; and thence northward along the middle of a lane leading from the said barrows to the road from Blackwater to Perranzabuloe Church, as far as the middle of such road; and thence towards the north east along the middle of the same road to a point (marked m as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a road leading to Mithian aforesaid; and thence towards the north west along the middle of such last-mentioned road as far as the stream herein first-mentioned; and thence northward along the middle of such stream through 'Miry Bottom,' to the point near Gollah Water where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches of the parishes, and to the incumbent and patron of the church or chapel of the district, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Exeter.
