PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain " modifications, the fourth report of " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to explain and amend two several Acts relating " to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act

"to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of "Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend "two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical "Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the prebendary of the prebend of Sidlesham, in the cathedral church of Chichester, for certain property belonging to him as such prebendary.

"Whereas, under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the property now belonging to any prebend not residentiary in any cathedral or collegiate church in England (excepting any right of patronage) will, upon the first avoidance of such prebend, become absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts; and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required:

" And whereas it is by the same Acts enacted, that, by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement may from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any prebendary of any cathedral or collegiate church, for the sale, transfer, or exchange of any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments belonging to such prebendary, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes, or hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments for any money payment,—or any money payment for any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments:

"And whereas the property now belonging to the prebend of Sidlesham aforesaid consists, amongst other things, of the corn tithes of a district of the parish of Bishopstone, in the county of Sussex, which have been from time to time and now are demised by lease for lives:

"And whereas the following arrangement, for substituting a money payment for such property as aforesaid, appears to us and to the Reverend William Peckham Woodward, the present Prebendary of the said prebend of Sidlesham, to be expedient, with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purpose hereinbefore particularly mentioned; and, after a careful calculation, we and the said William Peckham Woodward are satisfied that such money payment should be the annual sum hereinafter mentioned to be paid by us to him during his incumbency of the said prebend:

" We, therefore, with the consent of the said William Peckham Woodward, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose, that, upon and after the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council for ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, all the tithes, or the rent charge in lieu thereof, of the said district of the parish of Bishopstone, in the county of Sussex, which shall have been at any time annexed to or held with and shall now belong to, or form part of, the endowment of the said prebend of Sidlesham, or to or in which he, the said William Peckham Woodward, as such Prebendary, has, or ought to have, any right, title, or interest, together with all right, title, and interest therein, shall, without any assurance in the law other than this scheme, and such Order of your Majesty in Council so published as aforesaid, be, and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred

and conveyed from and by the said William; Peckham Woodward to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof or of any part or parts thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance as aforesaid, there shall be paid by us to the said William Peckham Woodward, so long as he shall continue prebendary of the said prebend of Sidlesham, and no longer, the annual sum of seventy pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year; and that there shall be forthwith paid by us to the said William Peckham Woodward the sum of sixty-four pounds three shillings and four pence, being the proportion of the like annual sum calculated from the thirtieth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five (when the agreement for the arrangement herein recited and proposed was entered into between us and the said prebendary), to the first day of May now last past.

"And we further recommend and propose, that, if the next vacancy of the said prebend shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, then a proportionate sum only shall be paid to the said William Peckham Woodward, or his legal representatives.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law image-diately from and after the time when this Ordershall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Chichester.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better pro"vision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to "make better provision for the spiritual care of po" pulous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting five separate districts for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Sheffield, in the county and diocese of York.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal; to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any

delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons; may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or . transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas the said parish of Sheffield is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of such parish hereinafter mentioned, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be respectively constituted separate districts in manner hereinafter set forth:

scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and scal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be

plans hereunto also annexed, and respectively numbered in like manner,—shall be respectively constituted separate districts for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be respectively named as follows, that is to say; the district, numbered 1. in the said schedule, shall be named, "The District of Moorfields;" the district, numbered 2. therein, shall be named, "The District of Holliscroft"; the district, numbered 3. therein, shall be named "The District of Eldon;" the district, numbered 4. therein, shall be named, "The District of Dyers Hill;" and the district, numbered 5. therein, shall be named "The District of Heeley."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of each of the districts so recommended to be constituted. when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within either of such districts, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to the minister of such district for the time being the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within either of such districts shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said respective sums of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal halfyearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or

perpetual curacy of either of such districts or new parishes shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" No. 1.—The district of Moorfields, being-

" All that part of the parish of Sheffield, in the county and diocese of York, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 1.) in the middle of Scotland-street opposite to the middle of the street or road called Furnace-hill, and thence extending towards the north-east along the middle of such street or road, and of another street or road called Bower Spring, to the south easternangle of the Sheffield union poor-house premises, and thence northward along the eastern boundary of such poor-house premises to the middle of the street or road called Cotton-mill-walk, and thence eastward along the middle of such lastmentioned street or road to a point (marked b as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the street or road before Union-buildings and leading to the iron bridge over the river Dun, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned street or road to the middle of the said iron bridge, and thence towards the north-west along the middle of the said river Dun to a point (marked c as aforesaid) opposite to the point of junction of the streets or roads called respectively Green-lane, Dun-fields, and Ebenezer-street, and thence southward to such last-mentioned point, and thence towards the south west along the middle of Green-lane aforesaid to a point (marked d as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Dunstreet, and thence along the middle of such street as far as the middle of the street called Moorfields:

and thence towards, the south east along the middle of such last-mentioned street to a point (marked e as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Matthew-street, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such last-mentioned street to a point (marked f as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Doncaster-street, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such last-mentioned street to the middle of Lower Allen-street, and thence towards the north east along the middle of such last-mentioned street to a point (marked g as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of the street called Smithfield, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such last-mentioned street to the middle of Scotlandstreet aforesaid, and thence eastward along the middle of such last-mentioned street to the point where the said imaginary line commenced.

" No. 2 .- The district of Holliscroft, being-

" All that part of the said parish of Sheffield comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 2.) in the middle of Upper Allen-street opposite to the middle of the street called Cornhill, and thence extending towards the north east along the middle of Upper Allen-street aforesaid as far as the middle of Meadow-street, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such last-mentioned street and eastward along the middle of Scotland-street aforesaid as far as the middle of the street or road called West Bar-green, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such street or road, and of Tenter-street and Broadlane, to a point (marked b on the last-mentioned map or plan) opposite to the middle of the street called Red-hill, and thence towards the north west along the middle of such last-mentioned street and of the said street called Cornhill to the point where the last-mentioned imaginary line commenced.

" No. 3.—The district of Eldon, being-

"All that part of the said parish of Sheffield bounded as follows, that is to say, on the north by an imaginary line along the middle of Weststreet; on the east by an imaginary line extending northward from the middle of South-street along the middle of Rockingham-street as far as the middle of Button-lane, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such lane as far as Trafalgar-street, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned street, and of the street or roadway before Westfield-terrace, to the middle of West-street aforesaid; on the south east by an imaginary line along the middle of South-street aforesaid; and on the west by an imaginary line extending northward from such last-mentioned street along the middle of Tudor-street, Thomas-street, Broomhall-street, and Fitz-william-street.

" No. 4.—The district of DYERS HILL, being-

" All that part of the said parish of Sheffield comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 4.) in the middle of the street or road called Bakershill opposite to the middle of Flat-street, and thence extending eastward along the middle of such street or road to the southern end of another street or road called Shude-hill, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned street or road to a point (marked b on the lastmentioned map or plan) opposite to the middle of Dixon-lane, and thence eastward across Sheafbridge, and along the middle of Broad-street, to a point (marked c on such last-mentioned map or plan) opposite to the middle of Duke-street, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such last-mentioned street to a point (marked d on the same map or plan) opposite to the middle of Talbot-street, and thence towards the south west along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as Bungay-street, and thence towards the north west along the middle of such last-mentioned street as far as Granville-street, and thence westward across such last-mentioned street, and over the river Sheaf, in a straight direction to the middle of Harmer-lane, and thence along the middle of such lane as far as the middle of Pondstreet, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned street, part of Pond-hill and of Flat-street aforesaid, to the point where the last-mentioned imaginary line commenced.

" No. 5 .- The district of HEELEY, being-

"All that part of the said parish of Sheffield bounded as follows; that is to say, on the north by the said district of Dyers-hill, on the north-east by an imaginary line along the middle of the turnpike road from Sheffield to Mansfield, on the south by the southern boundary of the said parish of: Sheffield, and on the west by the river Sheaf aforesaid?"

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and patrons of the church of the parish, and to the incumbent and patron of the church or chapel of the chapelry. out of which it is intended that the districts therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her. Majesty, in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law. immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.
