THIS day the Right Honourable Granville George Earl Granville was, by Her Majesty's command, sworn of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

Her Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Thomas William Earl of Leicester to be Lord Lieutenant and Custos Rotulorum of the county of Norfolk, his Lordship this day took the oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the oaths of allegiance and supremacy. The Majesty in Council was this day pleased to appoint the Right Honourable the Lord President of the Council, for the time being; the Right Honourable the Earl of Clarendon, President of the Committee of Council for Trade and Foreign Plantations; the Right Honourable the Earl of Auckland, First Lord Commissioner of the Admiralty; the Right Honourable John Russell (commonly called Lord John Russell), First Lord Commissioner of Her Majesty's Treasury; the Right Honourable George William Frederick Howard (commonly called Viscount Morpeth), Chief Commissioner of Woods and Forests; the
