A T the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 1st day of August 1846,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for "the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to make better provision for the spiritual care "of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the chapelry of Horsforth, in the parish of Guiseley, the parish of Adel, otherwise Addle, the chapelry of Headingley, in the parish of Leeds, and the district of Kirkstall, in the same parish, all in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any. scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the consti-tuting of such district; and that such scheme shall

not be laid before your Majesty in Council until I for after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

" And whereas the said chapelries, parish, and district of Horsforth, Adel, otherwise Addle, Headingley and Kirkstall, are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such chapelries, and of such parish and district, hereinafter mentioned and described, such parts not at present containing within their limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district

in manner hereinafter set forth:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said chapelry of Horsforth, and also all that part of the said parish of Adel, otherwise Addle, and also all that part of the said chapelry of Headingley, and also all that part of the said district of Kirkstall, respectively described in the schedule hereunto annexed, all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed, shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, " The District of Woodside."

" And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and conse-

the use and service of the minister inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the per-petual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The district of Woodstde, being-

" All that part of the chapelry of Horsforth, in the parish of Guiseley, in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, situate on the eastern side of an imaginary line extending northward in a straight direction from a point (marked a on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the boundary between the said chapelry and the district of Kirkstall, in the parish of Leeds, in the same county and diocese, and at a distance of ninetyfive yards or thereabouts from the western end of of Watson's Paper Mill, the property of the Right Honourable James Thomas Earl of Cardigan, through Little Hawksworth Wood, and across Outwood-lane, to the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the field called Front Field (marked b as aforesaid), and thence, also northward, along such wall or fence, and the walls or fences forming the western boundaries of the fields called Fallowfield and Farclose (marked respectively c and d as aforesaid) and the wood belonging to Thomas Walton (marked e as aforesaid), and in a straight direction, across the wood belonging to John Spencer Stanhope (marked f as aforesaid), to a point (marked g as aforesaid) in the middle of a certain footpath along the northern side of such last-mentioned wood, and at a distance crated as the church or chapel of such district, of fifty-three yards or thereabouts from a certain

stile on such footpath, to the west of such lastmentioned point, and thence eastward, along the middle of such last-mentioned footpath, to the south-western corner of a certain field called Marshall Old Pasture (marked h as aforesaid), and thence northward, along the fences forming the western boundary of such last-mentioned field and certain other fields called Middle Close, Top Close, and Brusgate Field (marked respectively i, j, and k as aforesaid), to the south-eastern corner of a certain field called Low Field (marked l as aforesaid), and thence westward, along the fence forming the southern boundary of such lastmentioned field and of another field called Garden Field (marked m as aforesaid), and thence towards the north-west, along the eastern boundary of a certain field called Great Vollans, and of a certain wood called Coney Warren, and of a certain field called Coney Warren Close (marked respectively n, o, and p as aforesaid), as far as a certain small close (marked q as aforesaid) belonging to the Primitive Methodists, and thence first westward, and then northward, along the southern and western boundaries of such close, as far as the middle of the street or road called Horsforth Townstreet, and thence westward, along the middle of such street or road, to a point (marked r as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a certain occupation road belonging to the said John Spencer Stanhope, and thence northward, along the middle of such road, to the southern boundary of a certain field called Top of the Lane Field (marked s as aforesaid), and thence eastward, along such boundary and along the southern boundary of another field called Pasture Field (marked t as aforesaid), to a point (marked u as aforesaid) in the middle of a certain footpath adjoining thereto leading across certain fields, Hill Top-lane, and the road from Horsforth to Yeadon, to Rawden, and thence towards the north-west, along the middle of such footpath, as far as the boundary of the said chapelry of Horsforth; and also all that part of the parish of Adel, otherwise Addle, in the same county and diocese, situate on the western side of an imaginary line extending northward from a point (marked v as aforesaid) on the boundary between the last-mentioned parish and the chapelry of Headingley, in the parish of Leeds, in the same county and diocese, and at the south-western angle of Ireland Wood, and thence extending northward along the western boundary of such wood, as far the north-western corner thereof (marked w as aforesaid), and thence towards the north-west in a straight direction to the south-western corner of a certain field (marked x as aforesaid) in the occupation of Samuel Raw. ling, such last-mentioned point being distant three hundred and seventy-nine yards and a quarter or thereabouts from the centre of Cookridge-bridge, and thence northward, along the western boundary of such last-mentioned field, across the entrance to a certain quarry adjoining thereto and along the western boundary of such quarry and of Tinshill Wood, to the middle of the road to Cookridge, and thence towards the north-east, along the middle of such road, to a point (marked y as afore-

said) opposite to the middle of a certain lane leading to the farm-house now in the occupation of James Ingham, and thence northward, along the middle of such lane, to the eastern corner of a certain field (marked z as aforesaid) adjoining thereto and also in the occupation of the said James Ingham, and thence along the eastern and northern fences of such last-mentioned field as far as Horsforth Beck; and also all that part of the said chapelry of Headingley situate on the northwestern side of an imaginary line extending towards the north-east from a point (marked a u as aforesaid) on the boundary between such lastmentioned chapelry and the said district of Kirkstall, near the Old Oak, along the middle of the road from Kirkstall to Addle, and of Spen-lane as far as the middle of the Old Leeds and Otleyroad aforesaid, and thence towards the north-west, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, as far as the boundary of the said parish of Adel, otherwise Addle; and also all that part of the said district of Kirkstall situate on the north-east of Great Hawksworth Wood."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches or chapels of the parishes, chapelries and districts out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.
