WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to authorize the division of the parish and vicarage of Leeds, in the county of York, into several parishes and vicarages," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the tenth day of

July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to authorize the division of the parish and vicarage of Leeds, in the county of York, into several parishes and vicarages," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for setting out, constituting, and annexing a district, for spiritual purposes, to the church or chapel of Saint Saviour, in the parish of Leeds, in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that it should be lawful, by the authority in certain Acts therein recited provided, that is to say, by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, by a scheme or schemes prepared by us, according to the provisions of the same Acts, and by your Majesty in Council, by an Order or Orders ratifying the same according to the like provisions, at such time or times, and from time to time as by such authority should be deemed expedient, to set out and constitute and to annex to any and every church or chapel already duly consecrated within the limits of the existing parish of Leeds,

but in each and every such case with the consent of the bishop of the diocese and of the trustees of the advowson of the vicarage of Leeds, a district for spiritual purposes, within such boundaries as by the like authority might be considered to be most suitable and convenient; and, for that purpose, to vary the boundaries of any district then subsisting; and the same Act contained a proviso for postponing the operation of any such scheme and Order in the case of a church or chapel then consecrated, till the next vacancy thereof, unless with the consent of the incumbent thereof then in possession :

“ And it was by the same Act provided and enacted, that a district should not be annexed under the foregoing provisions to any such church or chapel, unless or until the nave or body thereof should be or should have been made free for the use of the inhabitants of such district (subject to the order and disposal of the ordinary), nor unless or until a house of residence for the incumbent of such church or chapel should have been provided, or the means of providing the same should have been secured to the satisfaction of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and the bishop of the diocese :

“ And whereas it has been made to appear to us, that the entire floor or body of the said church or chapel of Saint Saviour, in the said parish of Leeds, is entirely free, and the means of providing a house of residence for the incumbent of the said church have been secured to the satisfaction of ourselves and the Bishop of Ripon :

“ And whereas no ecclesiastical district has yet been legally assigned to the said church or chapel; and it has been represented to us, that it would be and it appears to us to be expedient, that a district, comprised within the boundaries hereinafter specified, should be forthwith set out and constituted and annexed to the said church or chapel :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, and of the Reverend Richard Ward, Clerk, the present Incumbent of the said church or chapel of Saint Saviour, in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme, and also with the consent of the patrons of the church of Saint Peter, Leeds, in testimony whereof they

have hereunto affixed their common seal, that all that part of the parish of Leeds, particularly specified and described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be forthwith constituted and annexed to the said church or chapel of Saint Saviour, in the said parish of Leeds, so as fully to entitle the said church or chapel, and such district so annexed thereto, and the present and every future incumbent thereof, to all the benefits, rights, privileges, advantages, and attributes accruing and attaching thereto under the provisions of the same Act, and that the nave or body of the said church or chapel shall for ever hereafter be free for the use of the inhabitants of the said district (subject to the order and disposal of the ordinary); and the house of residence to be provided for the incumbent as aforesaid with its appurtenances, shall be and for ever remain the house of residence and vicarage of the incumbent and vicar of the same church or chapel, and of the parish and vicarage of Saint Saviour, in Leeds.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ All that part of the parish of Leeds, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line, commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) in the middle of Richmond-road, opposite to the middle of Lower Richmond-street, and thence extending towards the north east, along the middle of such street, to the western boundary of a certain estate belonging to Richard Hutchinson, and thence along such boundary and along the boundary of an adjoining estate of the Trustees of Pious Uses, to the middle of a certain public footpath at the northern side of such last-mentioned estate, and thence towards the south east along such footpath to the middle of Upper Accommodation-road, and thence northward along the middle of such road, as far as the tunnel of the Leeds and Selby Railway, and thence eastward along the line of such tunnel and

the southern side of the said railway to the public footpath leading from Leeds across the said railway to Halton, and thence along the middle of such last-mentioned footpath to the boundary of the said parish of Leeds, and thence southward along such last-mentioned boundary as far as the middle of the river Aire, and thence westward and towards the north west along the middle of such river to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the south eastern corner of Nether Mills, and thence northward to and along the eastern side of the said mills to the middle of East-street, and thence eastward along the middle of such last-mentioned street to a point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Richmond-street, and thence northward along the middle of such last-mentioned street and Richmond-road aforesaid to the point where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme was duly transmitted to the incumbent of the said parish and vicarage of Leeds, and he has consented thereto :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorising the sale of certain property lately belonging to the prebend of Sacrista, in the collegiate church of Southwell.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that all the same and the like rights and powers of ownership, as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tenements, or other hereditaments whatsoever by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements, and other hereditaments vested in us under certain Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property herein particularly mentioned is so vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts, and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us by proper instruments, in writing, duly executed according to law; with a proviso, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments be sold, transferred, or conveyed except by the authority of a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying the same :

"And whereas the lands and premises, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, lately formed a portion of the property and estates of the said prebend of Sacrista, but are now vested in us, by reason of the vacancy of the said prebend :

"And whereas we have contracted and agreed for the sale of the said lands and premises, subject to the determination of a certain lease thereof for lives, to the person and for the price herein-after mentioned :

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized to sell and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said recited Act, to Robert Warrand, of Westhorpe, in the county of Nottingham, Esquire, his heirs or

assigns, or as he or they shall direct and appoint, at and for the price or sum of one hundred and thirteen pounds, all our estate and interest in the lands and premises so described in the said schedule hereunto annexed :

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to make better provision for “ the spiritual care of populous parishes,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say :

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act “ to make better provision for the spiritual care “ of populous parishes,” have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Aston nigh Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and diocese of Worcester.

“ Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any

scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as hereinafter provided:

“ And whereas the said parish of Aston nigh Birmingham is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of the said parish hereinafter mentioned, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Worcester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Aston nigh Birmingham, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall

be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of Saint Andrew, Bordesley.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority

aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation aggregate or sole, or to either of the universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion, and in such manner, as shall be approved by the like authority :

“ And whereas a church or chapel has been erected within the limits of the district herein recommended to be constituted, and it has been agreed that such church or chapel shall be offered for approval by us, and for consecration as the church or chapel of the said district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof :

“ And whereas also a sum of three hundred pounds has been deposited with us, upon trust, to be applied in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient, as a permanent fund, towards the repairs and maintenance of the fabric of such church or chapel :

“ And whereas the principal contributors to the said church or chapel have, by an instrument in writing under their hands, nominated to us the five several persons, hereinafter named and described, as trustees of the patronage of the said district and contemplated new parish, and of the right of nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof, alternately with the bishop of the diocese ; and have, in and by the same instrument, proposed that vacancies in the trusteeship of such alternate patronage shall be filled up, from time to time, in manner hereinafter mentioned :

“ We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that the patronage of the said district and new parish of Saint Andrew, Bordesley, and the right of nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof, shall be assigned in per-

petuity, in equal moieties, between and to the said Henry Bishop of Worcester, and his successors bishops of Worcester, and the under-mentioned trustees, as hereinafter named and to be appointed ; that is to say, the said Henry Bishop of Worcester, and his successors bishops of Worcester for the time being ; the Reverend George Ouseley Fenwicke, Vicar of the parish and parish church of Aston nigh Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and his successors vicars for the time being of the said parish and parish church ; the Reverend James Prince Lee, Head Master of King Edward's School, in Birmingham aforesaid ; Ebenezer Robins, of Birmingham aforesaid, Esquire ; and William Newton, of Castle Bromwich, in the said county of Warwick, Esquire ; and in such future trustee or trustees, being a member or members of the United Church of England and Ireland, as shall from time to time be nominated by writing under the hand or hands of the trustee or trustees for the time being of such patronage and right of nomination, or the major part of them, in the place and stead of any one or more of the three trustees last herein-before mentioned, and their successors, who shall from time to time die, resign, or become incapable of acting ; and that such patronage and right of nomination shall for ever thereafter be exercised alternately by the said Henry Bishop of Worcester, and his successors bishops of Worcester, and by such trustees as aforesaid, and for the first turn by the said trustees ; provided always, that the number of such trustees shall not at any time exceed five, and that no appointment of any minister to the said district and new parish shall be made by the trustees or trustee for the time being during a vacancy occasioned by the death, resignation, or other incapacity of any of the said three last-named trustees or their successors, but that every such vacancy in the number of such last-named trustees shall before any such appointment of any minister be filled up by the trustees or trustee for the time being of the said patronage and right of nomination, or the major part of them, as aforesaid ; provided also, that the aforesaid patronage and right of nomination to be exercised by such trustees may be exercised by the majority of them for the time being.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that

nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of SAINT ANDREW, BORDESLEY, being—

“ All that part of the hamlet of Bordesley, in the parish of Aston nigh Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Worcester, situate on the north western side of an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the eastern bank of the Birmingham and Warwick Canal, where such canal crosses the boundary between the said hamlet of Bordesley and the hamlet of Deritend, in the same parish, and thence extending southward along such eastern bank, as far the middle of Adderley-street, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such street, across Watery-lane, and along the middle of Dark-lane and of another lane or road leading thence to the Birmingham and Coventry turnpike road, as far as the middle of such turnpike road, and thence along the middle of the same turnpike road as far as the south eastern boundary of the said hamlet of Bordesley.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted, and no objections have been made thereto :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Worcester.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to prevent the use of stills by unlicensed persons.

An Act for regulating the deduction at the Bank of England of income tax duty in respect of certain offices.

An Act to remove doubts as to the legality of certain assignments of ecclesiastical patronage.

An Act further to amend the Acts for the commutation of tithes in England and Wales.

An Act to provide for the preparation, audit, and presentation to Parliament of annual accounts of the receipt and expenditure of the Naval and Military Departments.

An Act to continue certain patent commissions until the exhibition of the commissions revoking them.

An Act to amend the laws relating to the removal of the poor.

An Act to encourage the establishment of public baths and washhouses.

An Act for better enabling the burial service to be performed in one chapel, where contiguous burial grounds shall have been provided for two or more parishes.

An Act for compensating the families of persons killed by accidents.

An Act to authorize the inclosure of certain lands, pursuant to a special report of the Inclosure Commissioners for England and Wales.

An Act to amend the Act to facilitate the inclosure and improvement of commons.

An Act to empower the Commissioners for the issue of loans for public works and fisheries to make loans in money to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Woods, in lieu of loans heretofore authorized to be made in Exchequer Bills.

An Act to authorize the advance of money, out of the Consolidated Fund, for carrying on public works and fisheries, and employment of the poor.

An Act to amend the law concerning lunatic asylums and the care of pauper lunatics in England.

An Act to amend the Acts relating to the offices of the House of Commons.

An Act to authorize, until the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, the regulation of the annuities and premiums of the Naval Medical Supplemental Fund Society.

An Act to amend the Act for marriages in Ireland, and for registering such marriages.

An Act to continue, until the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, an Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her present Majesty, for amending the law relative to private lunatic asylums in Ireland.

An Act for the abolition of the exclusive privilege of trading, or of regulating trades, in cities, towns, or boroughs in Ireland.

An Act to authorize a further advance of money, out of the Consolidated Fund, towards defraying the expence of county works presented in Ireland.

An Act to amend an Act, of the present session, intituled "An Act to authorize grand juries in Ireland, at the Spring assizes of the present year, to appoint extraordinary presentment sessions, to empower such sessions to make presentment for county works, and to provide funds for the execution of such works, and also to provide for the more prompt payment of contractors for works under grand jury presentments in Ireland."

An Act to continue certain Acts for regulating turnpike roads in Ireland until the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and to the end of the then session of Parliament.
