WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Stoneleigh, in the county of Warwick, and within the diocese of Worcester, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated chapel of Saint John the Baptist, situate at Westwood, in the said parish of Stoneleigh, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," and that such district should be named, "the Chapelry District of Westwood," and be bounded on the south and south west by the parish of Kenilworth, on the west by the parish of Berkswell, on the north by the parish of Allesley, on the north east by the parishes of Saint Michael, Coventry, and Stivichall, and on the east and south east by the remaining part of the parish of Stoneleigh, from which it is separated by the turnpike road leading from

Coventry to Kenilworth, but including within the district the several houses at Burnt Post, on the south eastern side of the said road where it enters the parish of Stivichall, as the said district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan thereof hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green :

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapel, and that all the fees arising therefrom should be paid and belong to the minster thereof :

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Worcester has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Henry Bishop of Worcester has signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
